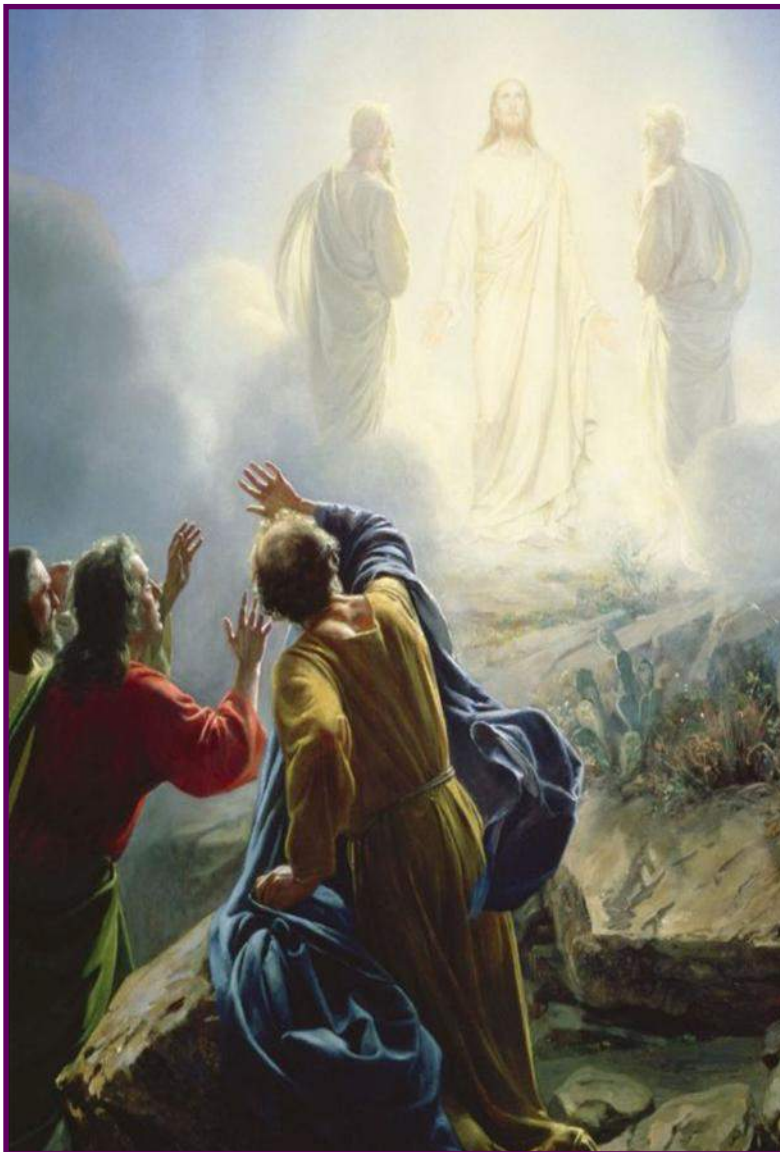

Reflection for the 2nd Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel account of the Transfiguration, Jesus reveals his divine identity to Peter, James, and John. "And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." Throughout their time following Jesus, they might have had glimpses or hints of his true identity, but this experience gave them a privileged insight. It was a gift Jesus gave only these three disciples. Sandwiched between Jesus' first (16:21-23) and second (17:22-23) prediction of his passion, it would help to sustain them through the dark days Jesus knew were coming. However, although the Transfiguration was a moment of great clarity for them, the surety of their perception of Jesus seems to have waned. By the time he's arrested a few chapters later, we see Peter following the soldiers at a distance, eventually denying he even knew Jesus.

Does it surprise you that the disciples who encountered such a powerful revelation of Jesus at the Transfiguration could have grown more muddled and fearful as the experience receded in memory? To me, it feels completely natural and expected.

If we carefully look at our life experiences, I suspect that we can all say we've had a moment or moments of clarity. This could mean a time of great hopefulness, when everything seemed to be falling into place for us. It might have been an occasion of exquisite understanding—some call it an "aha moment." Perhaps it happened viewing a breathtaking sunset, reading a heartrending poem, or listening to Andrea Bocelli sing. It may have occurred through the words of a homily, or the quiet of praying after communion. Many point to the profound experience of childbirth or sitting at a loved one's deathbed. In all these moments of clarity, God feels close, touchable, all embracing.

Celtic spirituality speaks of the "thin places" where the veil between heaven and earth seems almost porous. We sense God's presence in a powerful way. These moments feed us, strengthen us, settle our yearning, and blanket us with peace. But they are fleeting. We "get it" and then we don't.

Like the disciples, we come down from the mountain and have to face our day-to-day realities. And when our days are filled with worries and challenges, those mountaintop moments quickly fade into the background. We sometimes feel like we are operating on fumes, just going through the motions, trying to get through the day, wondering whether we imagined a time when we felt such clarity. We call upon God, but we don't feel any immediate relief. It is then that we have to decide to keep on going and keep on hoping. And as we call upon God to help us, we do so in the spirit of today's psalmist: "Our soul waits for the Lord, who is our help and our shield."

Waiting for God can seem like walking through a dense fog, quite the opposite of the "sight" bestowed on the mountain. But with willpower we step forward and just trust, realizing the truth of St. Paul's words: "we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Cor 5:7). It is important to remember the gift of a mountaintop experience, because that will help us as we travel the valleys of life. But the valleys are where we do most of our walking, and it is in the daily discipline of walking with limited vision that faith matures. And that maturity is worth far more than the view on the clearest day.

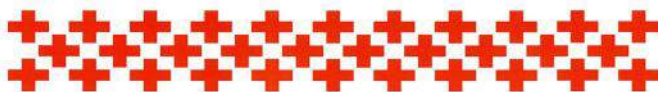

Second Sunday of Lent

FIRST READING:

Genesis 12:1-4a

The LORD said to Abram: “Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father’s house to a land that I will show you. “I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. SECOND READING:

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, “Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.” While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.” When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, “Rise, and do not be afraid.” And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, “Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.”

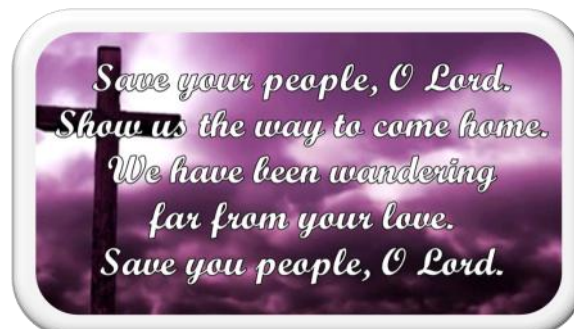
