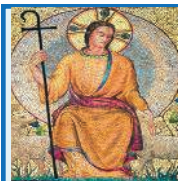

World Day of Prayer for Vocations April 26, 2026

The purpose of **World Day of Prayer for Vocations** is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "**Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest**" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2).

As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity, secular institutes), and to the missionary life.

The year 2026 marks the **63rd Anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations**

The Fourth Sunday of Easter

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I saw a touching gesture Pope Leo made back on the Feast Day of St. Agnes January 21. He was finishing the blessing of the lambs whose wool would be used to make the pallia (band of wool worn over the vestments of metropolitan archbishops to show their connection to the pope). The little animals were nestled in baskets festooned with colorful flowers. The pope reached down and gently patted the heads of the little baby animals as they made their bleating noises.

We urban and suburban types do not think of lambs or sheep very much. But the bible does because it comes to us from a simpler time and place. The little we do know about sheep usually describes them as gentle creatures, not given too much display. Responsive to their shepherd in every way.

That is not a generally welcome description of one of us. We prefer to be known as wildly independent, generally sharp-eyed and keenly aware of our position. So, there is a hesitation to accept the command from the Lord to be like sheep before their Shepherd. Are we not better understood as soldiers, or disciples, or missionaries? Perhaps. But there is a dimension to a sheep's behavior that underscores the beautiful virtue of docility. It cuts through any of our outward bravado before the challenges of life in this world that makes us think we're in charge and not God.

This docility, better understood perhaps as willingness or amenability, is a quality we can all strive to develop as followers of Christ and members of His Church.

The same is true when we consider our individual calling, or vocation in life. Today the Church asks us all to **pray for vocations to be given to our Church, especially those of the priesthood and the consecrated life.** There certainly is a need, and we have a role in fulfilling it. We know that Jesus cares. He will not leave the Church bereft. But we must do our part to pray to Him for the vocations needed. We also need to encourage any young person who expresses an interest in priesthood or religious life. Sheep will always need a shepherd. No AI substitute please.

Sometimes our best efforts fail, and we must accept that and try another. Eight-year-old Billy often said he wanted to be a priest, but he was not very energetic in performing chores about the house. In truth, he was somewhat lazy in his way. One day mom asked him to carry out the garbage. Billy gave his usual protest: "Mom, I'm tired."

Mom gave him a little lecture: "Billy you can't be a priest if you are lazy. Priests must work hard." "I know, I know," replied Billy, "that's why I'm resting now."

God love you and pray for vocations to the priesthood a consecrated life.

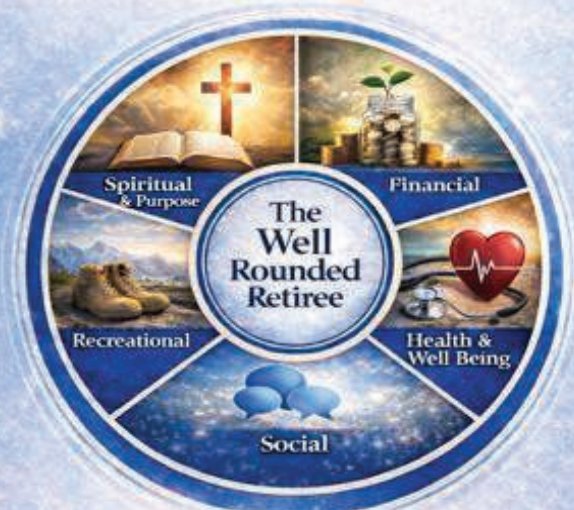

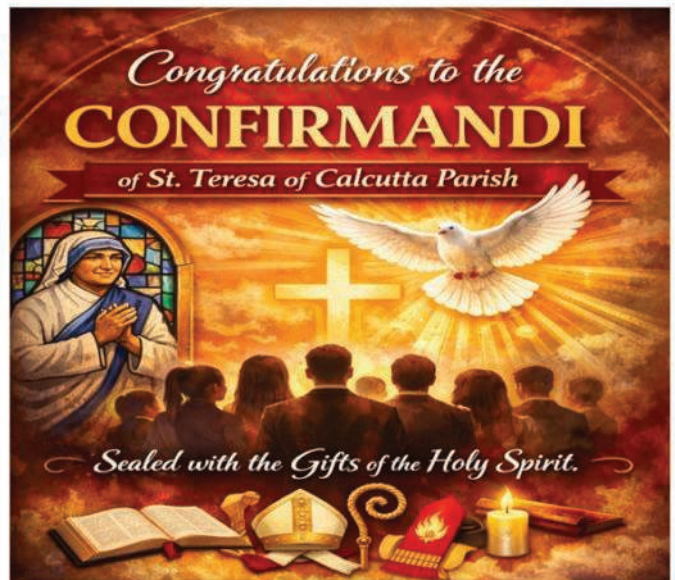

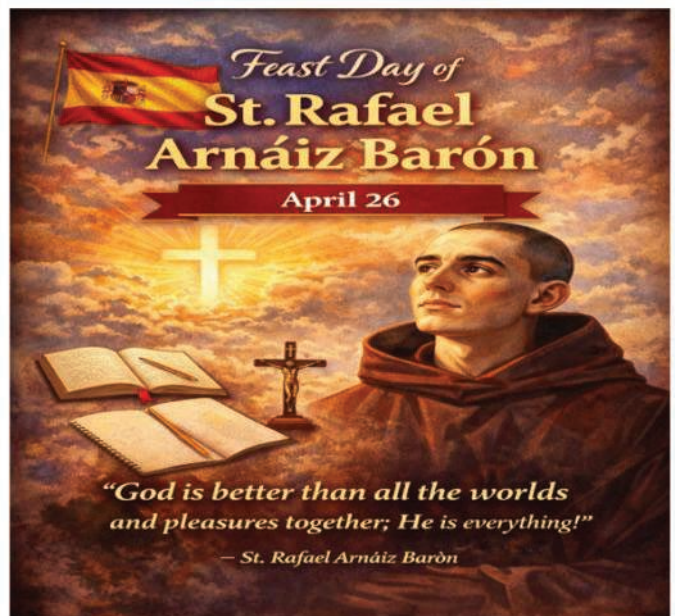

FIRST READING:

[Acts 2:14a, 36-41](#)

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do, my brothers?" Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call." He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

SECOND READING:

[1 Peter 2:20b-25](#)

Beloved:

If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps.. *He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.*

When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

GOSPEL:

[John 10:1-10](#)

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

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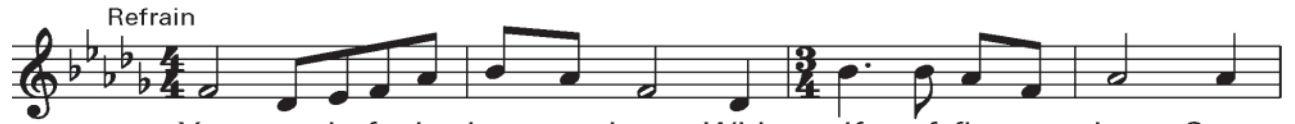
