The Fifth Sunday of Easter

When I was younger, my parents would contact AAA to ask for the best directions for our vacation route. The company would send accordion styled maps they called “trip-tiks” that gave all sorts of information about the proposed journey. We loved unfolding them to explore the ins and outs of the route. Nowadays, we go straight to our smart phones for guidance, although the trip tiks are still available, primarily in digital form. Whether then or now, we are always looking for the best directions to get from point A to point B.

The apostles were no different. In today’s gospel, Jesus tells them he is leaving but that he will come back for them, even though they already know the way to where he is going. “I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way.” But Thomas wants some clarification, some guidance, so they don’t get lost looking for Jesus: “Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?” This seems a reasonable question given the common need for good directions and their desire to be with Jesus. But Jesus once again broadens their understanding of what it means to follow him when he answers that he himself is the way. In other words, reaching the destination was more complex than just moving in a certain direction. It was the *way* they traveled that was also important and that way involved embracing the life habits and disciplines of a disciple of Jesus.

It is interesting that the early Christians were called People of the Way. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul looks for “any men or women who belonged to the Way” (*Acts 9.2*) so he could arrest them. After Paul experiences the risen Jesus, he acknowledges his persecution of the Way (*Acts 22.4*) and then testifies that he now believes as do the People of the Way, the Christians: “But this I do admit to you, that according to the Way, which they call a sect, I worship the God of our ancestors and I believe everything that is in accordance with the law and written in the prophets (*Acts 24.14*).

Why were they called People of the Way? The early Christians heard Jesus’ call to love: “I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another (*John 13:34*) and responded with generosity and fellowship. They shared their resources and cared for each other in noticeable manner. And it was the quality of their living that separated them from their past lives and attracted those they encountered. By the end of the 2nd century, the theologian Tertullian noted that unbelievers were noticing the Christians’ love and care for each other. Clearly, these Christians understood that living in imitation of Jesus was the way to life with him.

So it is good to honestly reflect upon *our* ways. How do our lives point to the presence of Jesus? As we make our way through this world, where do we get our directions? Whose ways are we following? Clearly, we are all a work in progress but we can always open ourselves more to God’s guidance through Sacred Scripture, just as the People of the Way allowed God’s word to transform their lives. Doing thus will set us on the right path far better than any trip-tik or GPS could ever do.

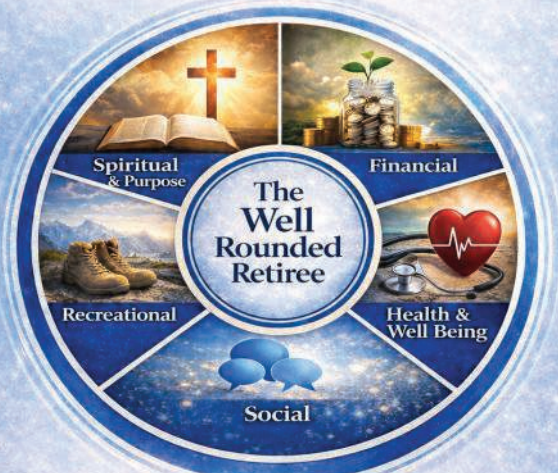

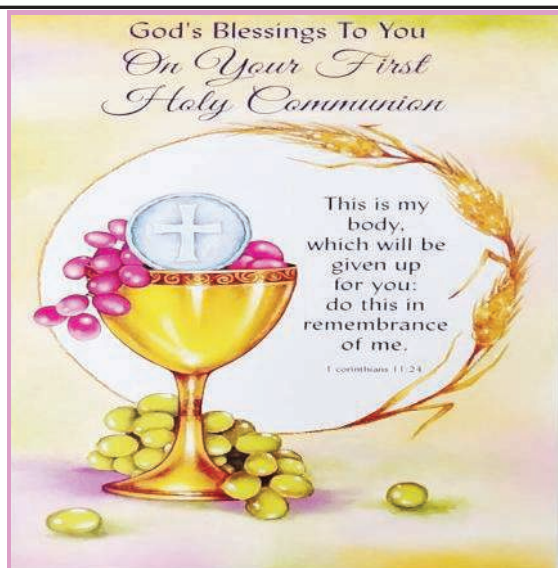

DO YOU PRACTICE LECTIO DIVINA?

1. Read

The first element of this type of prayer is **reading** (*lectio*): you take a short passage from the Bible, preferably a Gospel passage and read it carefully, perhaps three or more times. Let it really soak-in.

2. Meditate

The second element is **meditation** (*meditatio*). By using your imagination enter into the Biblical scene in order to "see" the setting, the people, and the unfolding action. It is through this meditation that you encounter the text and discover its meaning for your life.

3. Pray

The next element is **prayer** (*oratio*) or your personal response to the text: asking for graces, offering praise or thanksgiving, seeking healing or forgiveness. In this prayerful engagement with the text, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.

4. Contemplate

Contemplation (*contemplatio*) is a gaze turned toward Christ and the things of God. By God's action of grace, you may be raised above meditation to a state of seeing or experiencing the text as mystery and reality. In contemplation, you come into an experiential contact with the One behind and beyond the text.

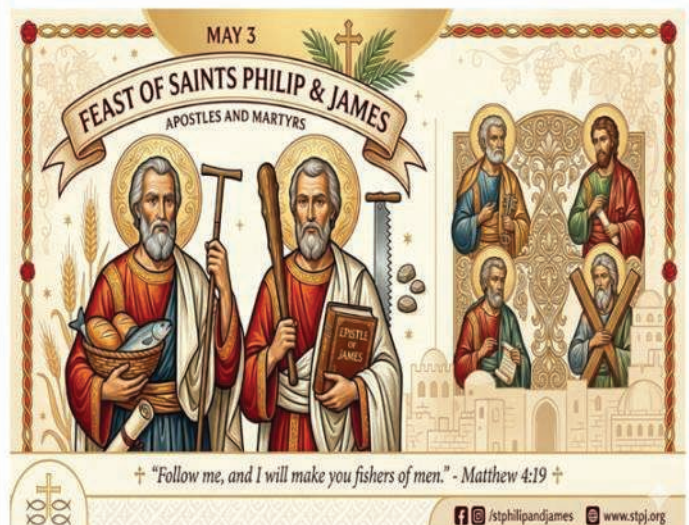

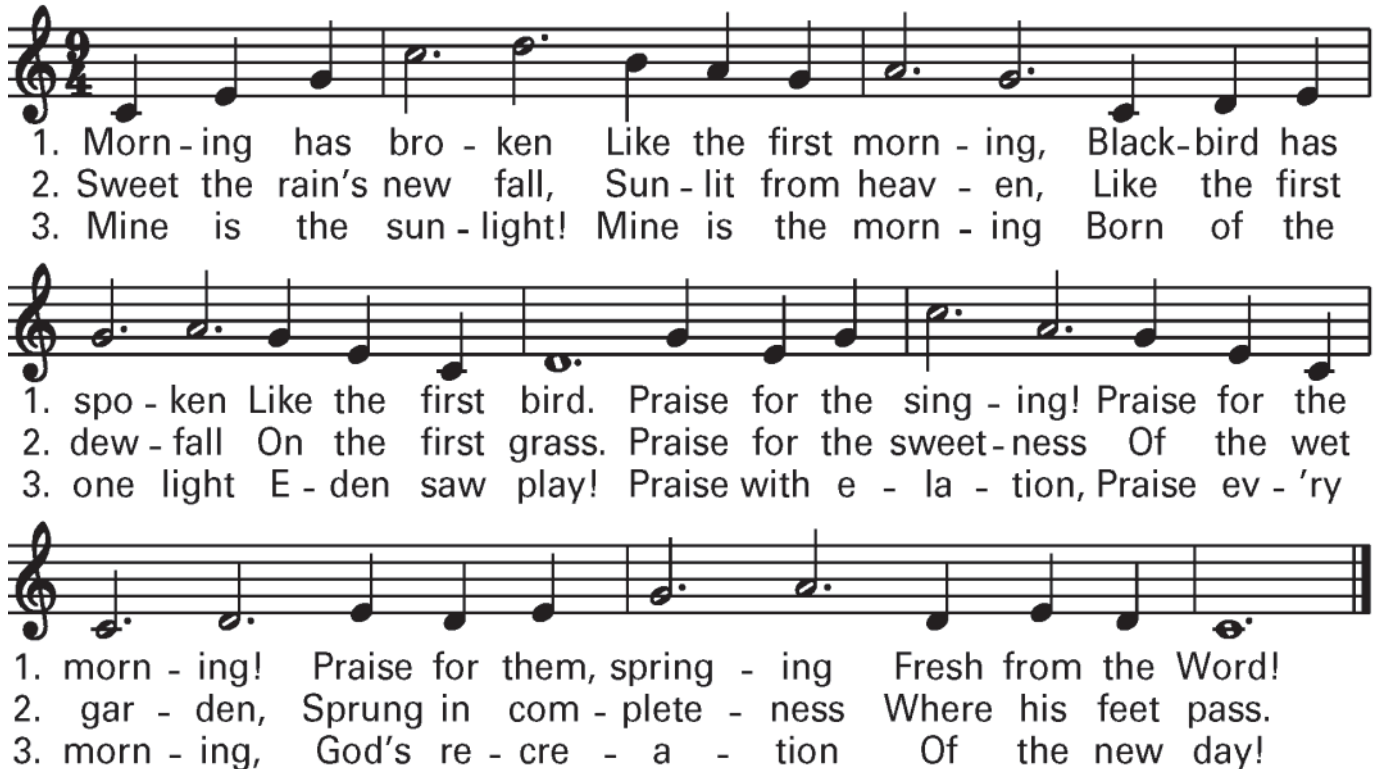

The 5th Sunday of Easter

FIRST READING:

[Acts 6:1-7](#)

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

SECOND READING:

[1 Peter 2:4-9](#)

Beloved: Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and, like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it says in Scripture: *Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a cornerstone, chosen and precious, and whoever believes in it shall not be put to shame.* Therefore, its value is for you who have faith, but for those without faith: *The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, and A stone that will make people stumble, and a rock that will make them fall.* They stumble by disobeying the word, as is their destiny.

You are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises" of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

GOSPEL:

[John 14:1-12](#)

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?". Jesus said to him, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father."

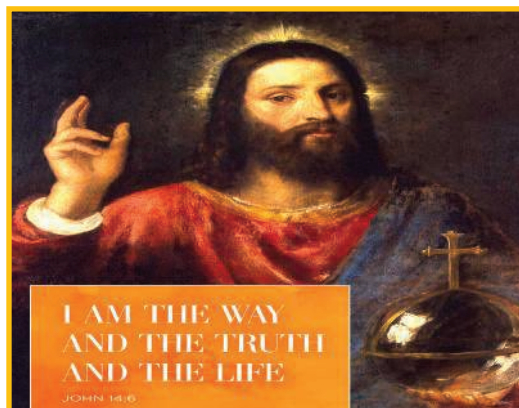

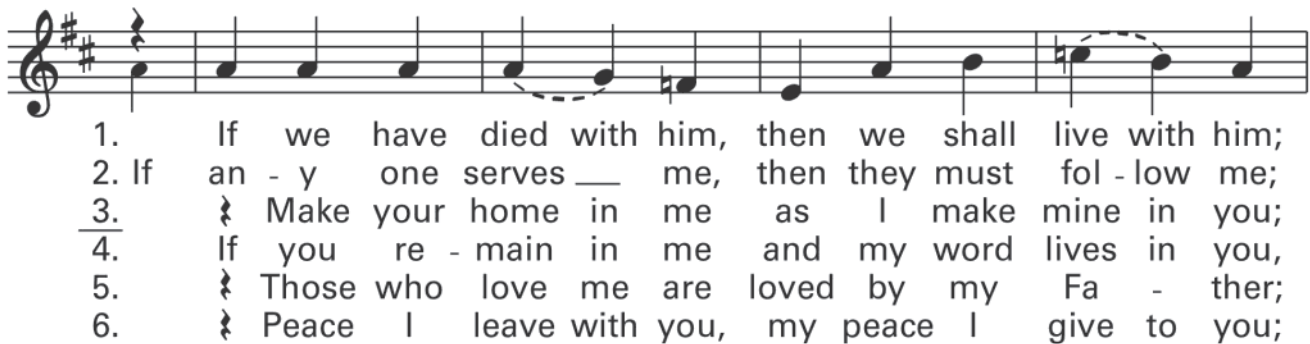
