A unique feast - CORPUS CHRISTI—June 7th
Everyone Loves a Procession!

This Sunday's **Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction** are common devotional practices as are Eucharistic processions along city streets.

Today we will honor the **Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist**. It is one of the few celebrations that do not commemorate an event in the life of Jesus or Mary. Instead, it is dedicated to a fundamental tenet of Catholicism — Jesus' sacramental presence in the consecrated bread and wine. **Come and join** our procession around Collingswood with Jesus in the Eucharist **after the 10am Mass ending with Benediction at St John's church.**

Reflection for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

In 1976, I wandered around the Eucharistic Congress at the Convention Center in Philadelphia, not really knowing what it was all about. I turned a corner and encountered a room filled with people, kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance, singing "Gift of Finest Wheat." There was such a palpable energy in the room that, even in my inexperienced faith, I recognized as an exchange of love. I knew the Lord was truly present.

Later that same day I found myself in a room listening to Mother Teresa and Dorothy Day. I had no idea of the depth of their holiness at the time, but as they spoke, so humbly but so confident in their message, I glimpsed what the fruit of their adoration and daily reception of the Eucharist looked like. I saw what the holy exchange of love between ourselves and the Lord can accomplish. I knew the Lord was truly present in their lives. It was a presence that benefitted the world.

Last week's readings from the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity included this prayer from Moses: *"If I find favor with you, O Lord, do come along in our company."* Moses knew that the journey through the desert could never be accomplished without God's presence. And God obliged. Throughout Sacred Scripture we witness this ongoing care, culminating in the Gospel of Matthew when we learn that Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us" (1:23). And at the end of the Gospel Jesus promises, "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (28:20).

Our faith is grounded in the most wonderful miracle of God's continuing presence with us. Thus, our journey through life was never intended to be a solo enterprise. It was designed to be a loving exchange. That is why the Solemnity of Corpus Christi is such an important feast for our faith, for it reminds us and redirects us to the source of our strength. However, a true "exchange" requires two parties, giving and receiving, receiving and giving. And that requires showing up, being there, being present to the one who is always present.

Let this beautiful feast energize us towards spending time with the Eucharist, receiving the Sacrament at mass and sitting before the our Lord in quiet prayer. The more we contemplate God's presence, the more our faith in God's presence will grow, regardless of our doubts or feelings. The more this quiet, sometimes hidden faith grows, the more our decisions and actions will align with God's heart. And the fruit of our prayer, our transformation, will be a blessing for all those who come along in our company. As we sing "The Gift of Finest Wheat" we remember:

*"The mystery of your presence, Lord, No mortal tongue can tell:
Whom all the world cannot contain, Comes in our hearts to dwell.
You give yourself to us, O Lord; Then selfless let us be,
To serve each other in your name In truth and charity."*

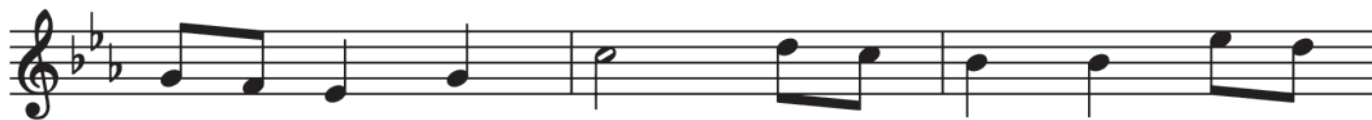

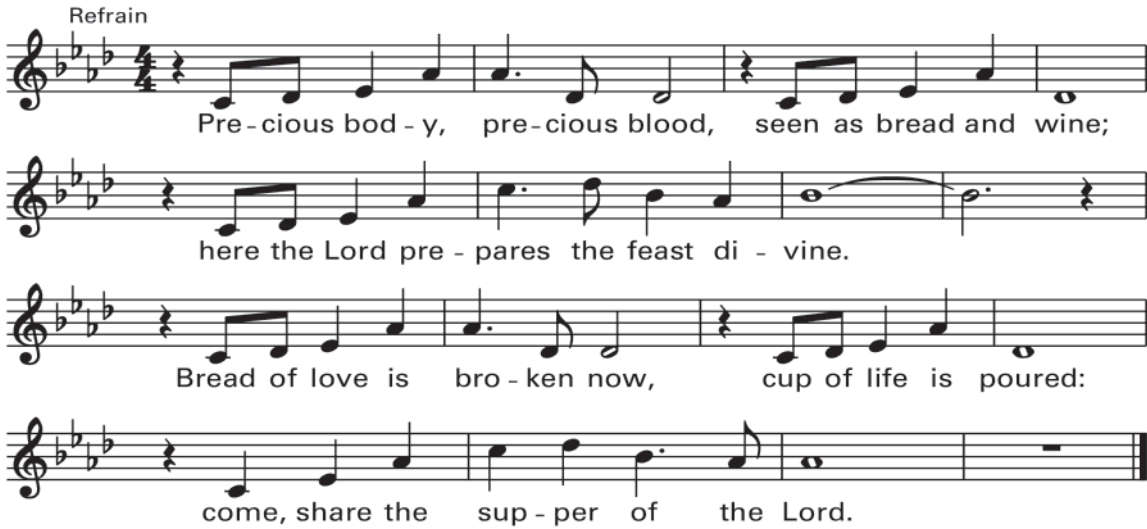

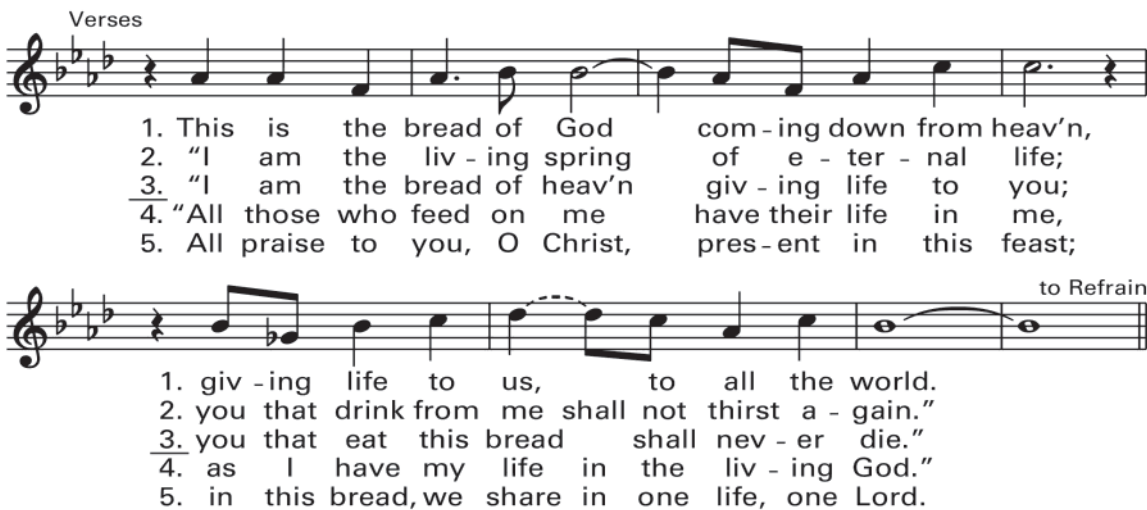
