Reflection for the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Deacon Leo Howitz,

Today's reflection is on the Second Reading from Saint Paul. Paul is talking about how God sees everything. All the good that we will do, all the bad and He still loves us. Think about this, if you could see the future with just the people who you know and you saw that one day they would hurt you intentionally, would you still love them? Imagine if you saw your mother or father betraying you later in life and saw the pain it would bring, what would you do? Would you be willing to love them? Die for them?

This is what God saw, He saw all of humanity and saw all the good and the bad things it would do, but He still loved us. Loved us so much that He sent His only Son into the world to die for us. So that we would be saved. Saved, we hear this all the time, but what does it truly mean?

With the death of Jesus we are saved, meaning we have been reconciled by the blood of Jesus to be more than just friends with God, more like seeing Jesus as a brother or a sister. Or as we really are adopted sons and daughters of the Father. God loves us unconditionally and through the Sacrifice of Jesus on the cross He has restored this friendship, if we would like it. I think it can easily be better than it once was with Adam and Eve. Think of Adam and Eve, they used to walk and talk together with God, but they disobeyed the one request He gave them. Just like with us, when a friend hurts us, or we hurt them, sometimes we can forgive but the friendship doesn't seem to be the same.

Through the mercy of God, when Jesus died on that Cross, this friendship can exist again as pure as it was in the beginning. We still have death, sickness, sorrow and pain in this life but if we remain close to Jesus, we can be one with Him now and be like Adam and Eve for all eternity.

The first thing the resurrected Jesus did was to appear to his disciples and give them the power to forgive sins. When we look at Paul his entire ministry revolved around reconciliation. We can be saved when we encounter Jesus in that confessional. We can be intimately united with Him.

But we have to do this right. There is a process we must follow. The first is to realize that we have offended God, the second is to confess this offense and have full intentions of not doing it again. This can be difficult, but we do our best. The third is to confess the sin, and do the penance prescribed by the priest.

I believe when we are absolved in that confessional, we are free. We are no longer a slave to the sin but can freely choose not to do it again, make any amendment we have to and go forth with Jesus right at your side. Intimacy is there; you are not the same person. But we live in a very messy world, sin always seems to be creeping around the corner. We do our best, but if we fall again, we are free to start over.

But what Paul is saying is that we have the power to be and remain reconciled to God who loves us. The best part, Jesus did all this so that we can be more than just reconciled to God. This forgiveness was granted to us while we were still sinners. God sent His only Son to do this while we were still enemies of God.

So, we can live reconciled to Jesus whenever we choose to do so, but what frequent reconciliation brings, if we always keep that process in mind, is Holiness! Reconciled to God, the ability to be friends intimately with Him. Holy as we were meant to be at our baptisms. A bumpy ride, but in the end Holy none the less. Paul is right, the final product of constant reconciliation is pure joy!

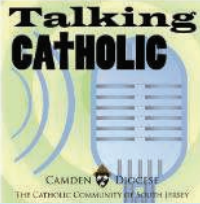

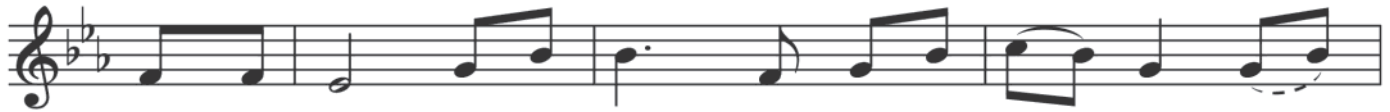

You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

Brothers and sisters:

Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

GOSPEL:

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

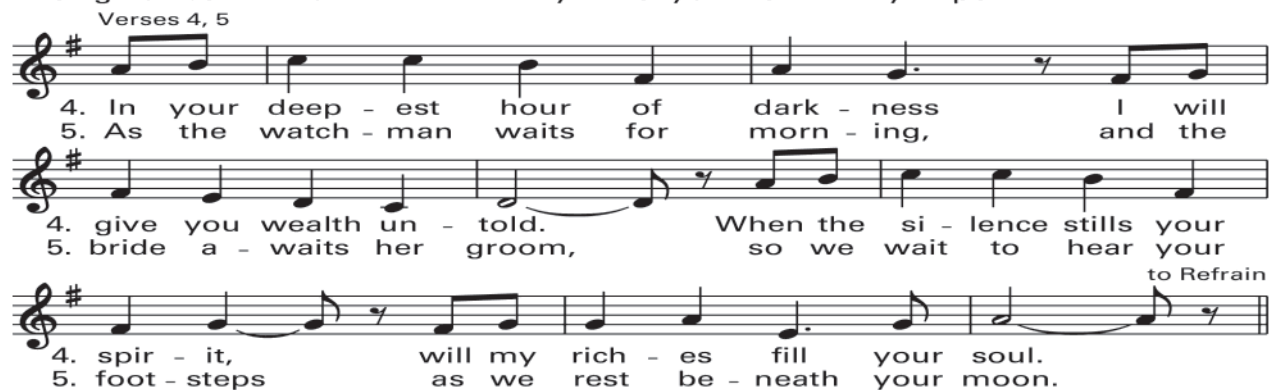

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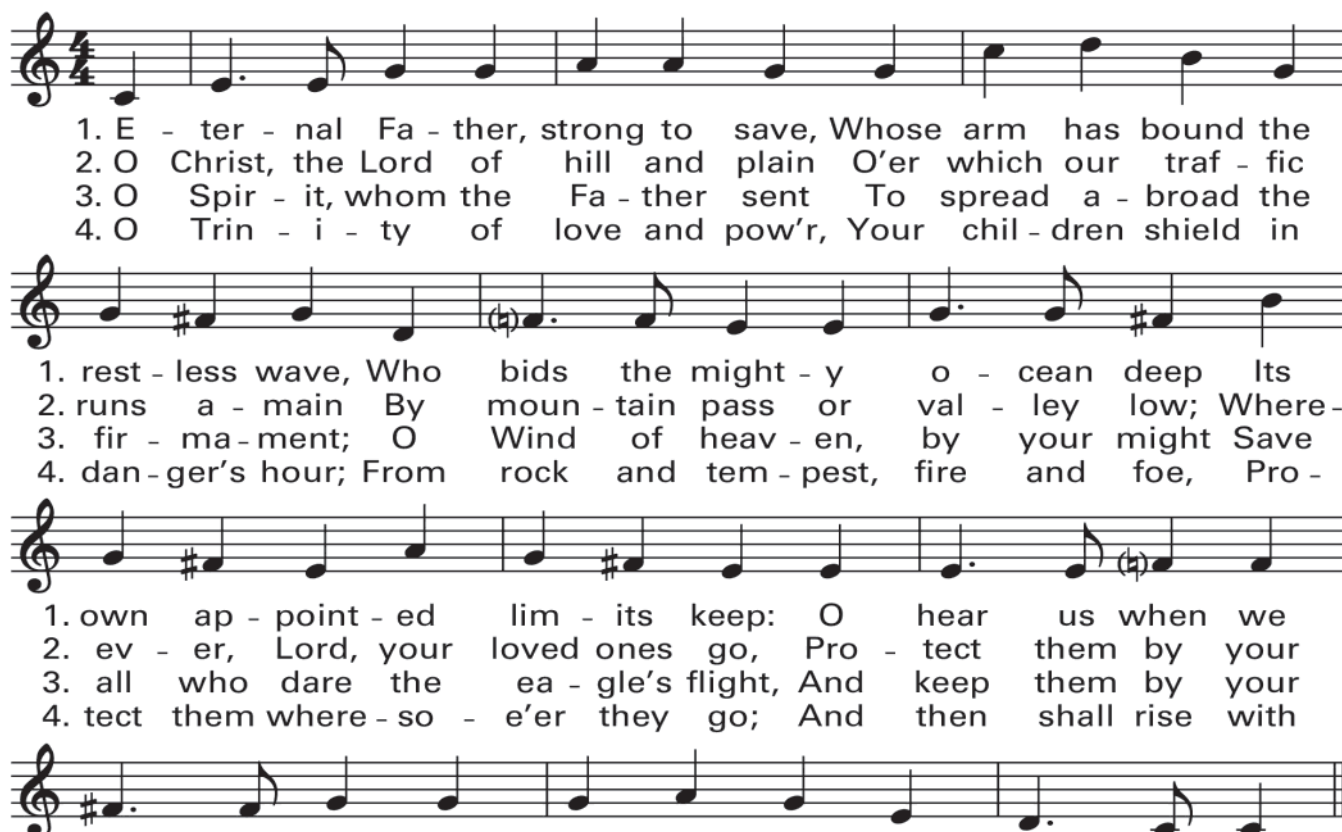
