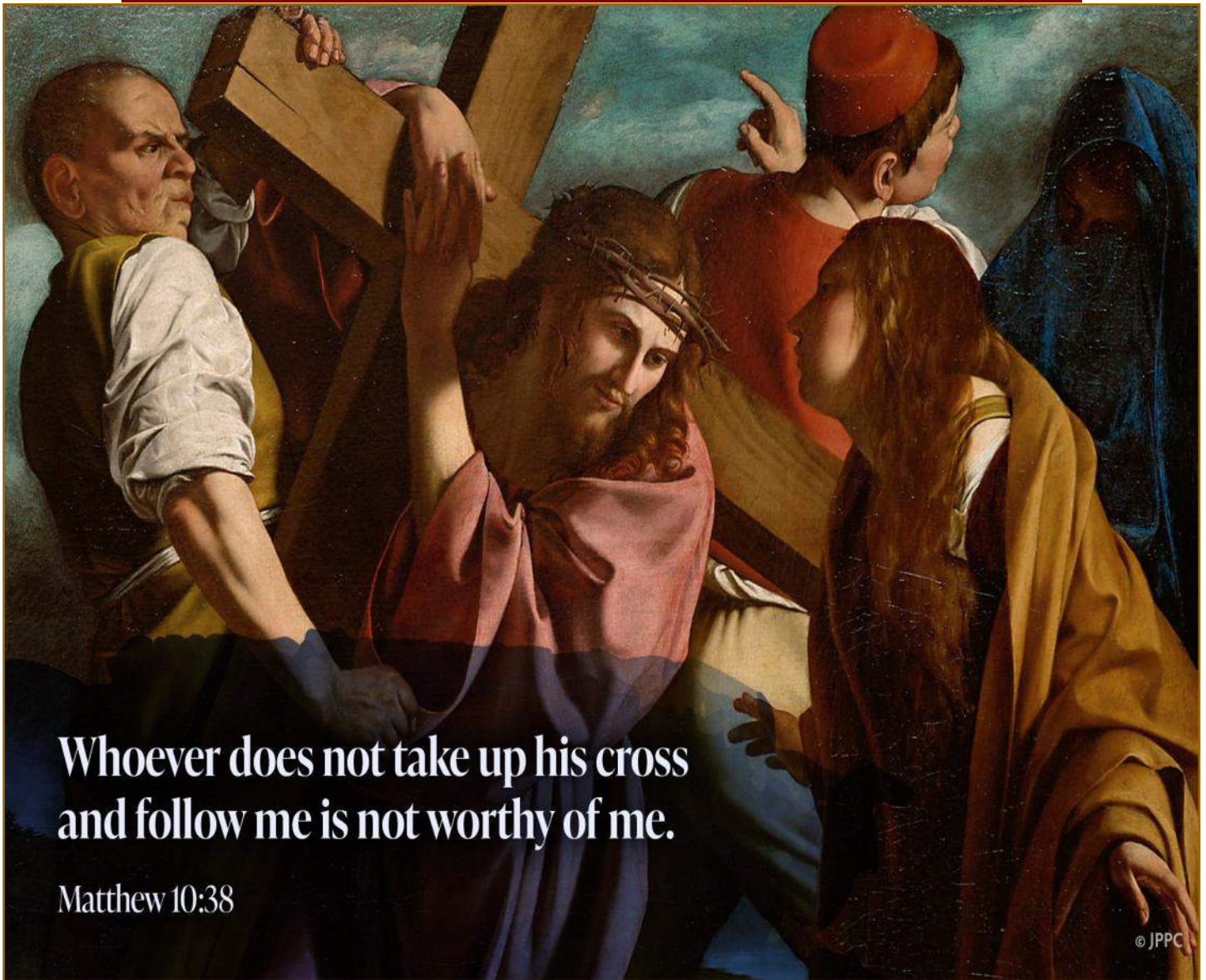

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

By definition, human interest stories that come our way through books or other sources are a welcome reprieve from the negative types that dominate the news these days. Otherwise, we would conclude that nothing good ever happens on our home planet. Smiles would be rare and laughter never heard.

In today's Gospel section, Our Lord makes clear where He should rank in our list of loves, we agree. But note that truly loving Him involves embracing His cross. He expounds on the simple but decisive ways we can attain the reward of heaven through service to others; such service is always of human interest.

So, who are the "little ones" in our world that deserve "even a cup of cold water?" In the context of this gospel, the "little ones" Our Lord refers to starts with the Apostles. Ordinary men called to be extraordinary.

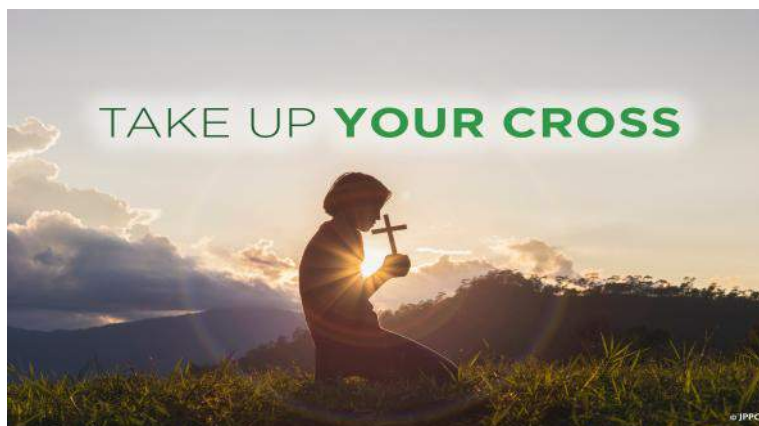
So, they must rely on the hospitality of others. Jesus insists that when we serve others we are actually serving Him.

Another deserving group is that of children. Jesus often uses them as examples in His teaching on faith. They are literally "little ones." Children are innocent and trusting. So, they are apt pupils for learning the ways of right living in Christ. How awful when we adults let them down by our bad example. What delight there is in knowing of all the parents, teachers and other adults in the world who dedicate themselves to giving children good example.

As is so, often the case, the gospel acts as a mirror held up to our consciences for inspection. Could a human interest story or two be written about us? Does Sunday Mass have a lasting effect on our behavior? Good question to ask and answer on a Spring Sunday or anytime.

Of course, it is good not to look for praise to come when you are doing your good deeds. Once when George Bush the elder was president, he was doing his public relations thing by visiting a nursing home. He came upon a wizened old man hobbling down the corridor. President Bush took the man by the hand and asked, "Sir, do you know who I am?" The man replied, "No, but if you ask one of the nurses, she'll tell you."

God love you and give you His peace.

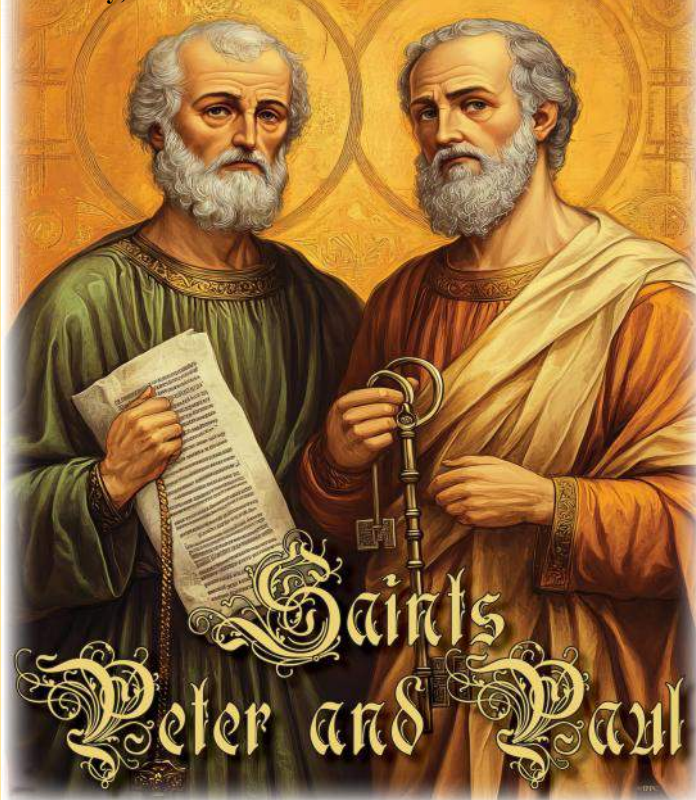

National Centre for Padre Pio Announces Year of Saint Pio in Celebration of the 25th Anniversary of His Canonization

BARTO, PA - On June 16, 2026 the National Centre for Padre Pio was pleased to announce its observance of a special Year of Saint Pio, beginning June 16, 2026, and culminating on June 16, 2027, with the celebration of the **25th Anniversary of the Canonization of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina**. This yearlong observance will offer the faithful opportunities for prayer, spiritual renewal, and deeper devotion to one of the Church's most beloved saints.

As part of this sacred observance, the National Centre for Padre Pio will host a variety of prayer services, devotions, conferences, retreats, and special events designed to deepen participants' relationship with Christ through the intercession of Saint Pio.

The Centre is also honored to announce that The Most Reverend Alfred A. Schlert, Bishop of the Diocese of Allentown, has granted special indulgences for the Year of Saint Pio. A plenary indulgence will be available to the faithful who visit the National Centre for Padre Pio and devoutly participate in Holy Mass on May 2, 2027, the anniversary of Saint Pio's Beatification, and on June 16, 2027, the 25th Anniversary of his Canonization. In addition, partial indulgences will be available throughout the year to pilgrims who visit the Centre and fulfill the usual conditions prescribed by the Church.

Major Events During the Year of Saint Pio

July 15, 2026 – Anniversary of the Enthronement of the Relic Veil of Manoppello The Centre will commemorate the first anniversary of the enshrinement of the relic of the Holy Face of Jesus. Bishop Alfred Schlert, who presided over the enthronement ceremony in 2025, will serve as principal celebrant.

September 14–23, 2026 – Novena of Masses and Feast of Saint Pio The annual Novena of Masses in honor of Saint Pio will culminate in the celebration of his feast day. Daily Mass and Confession will be available, with weekend festivities including processions, music, and food on September 19–20.

September 29, 2026 – Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael Pilgrims are invited to celebrate the feast of the Archangels with a procession through the Centre grounds and a presentation exploring Saint Pio's devotion to Saint Michael and his relationship with his guardian angel.

November 5–8, 2026 – Holy Relics Exposition Visitors will have the rare opportunity to venerate more than 600 major relics of saints and blessed of the Church. The exposition will include relics associated with Our Lord, Our Lady, Saint Pio, Pope Saint John Paul II, Saint Carlo Acutis, and the Apostles and Evangelists.

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight. Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.
