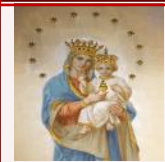

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Pat Lipperini

Today's gospel includes one of the most cherished and comforting lines in all of scripture. "Come to me all who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." I'm sure these words call to each of us, for who hasn't experienced moments of great weariness? But then, what is our response? How do we manage our worries and fears? Do we try to deal with our daily challenges all on our own, or have we brought our concerns to God?

As I mentioned in last month's essay, our faith is grounded in the amazing truth that God is with us. I can never tire of proclaiming this! However, it is one thing to know this intellectually, as acknowledgment of the words of scripture. It is another to know it in one's heart and in one's bones. God is with us. God is companion on our journey. God is witness and succor to our struggles.

However, as we mature in our faith, we realize that God does not magically remove the obstacles we face. We will always be confronted with some trouble. Thus, in today's reading Jesus speaks, not of removing our burden, but instead, of replacing how we carry the burden. "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me." Miraculously, when we take Jesus' yoke upon our shoulders, it does not add weight to our own loads. Rather, his yoke helps us carry our burdens with greater ease.

How does this happen? First, because of the good news that God is with us. The weight of our burden is distributed along the yoke. We do not pull by ourselves. God shares every moment of our journey. Secondly, Jesus' yoke is not like any other. It is fashioned with exquisite care, perfectly designed, without superfluous attachments. It works because the yoke is finely attuned to God's will and God's ways. That means the yoke of Jesus works better than any other yoke ever devised. "My yoke is easy and my burden light." Jesus wants us to discard our own yokes, perhaps too heavy with attachments that leach away our energies and peace. He invites us to choose to use his yoke instead.

Jesus also asks us to "learn from him." It is not enough that God pulls alongside us. God also wants to give us the ability to pull our part with greater strength and less anxiety. So, as we take on the yoke of Jesus, we watch him. We match his pace and adopt his attitudes. We change, we become more wholeheartedly aligned with God's will, not immediately, but gradually as we walk alongside our Lord and imitate his ways. When we walk with Jesus and learn his pace, we come to see a better way to live. We start to choose attitudes and activities that fill us with the peace the world cannot give. We start to spend our time and energy on what really matters.

In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds the Romans that they are called to align with the qualities and character of God and not succumb to the worldly temptations that will ultimately weaken and deplete their lives: "you are not in the flesh. Rather you are in the Spirit." Paul is not identifying an opposition between the body and the soul, but rather, a conflict between the things of God and those things wholly unconnected, which only lead to division and pain, in both our souls and in the world around us.

As we navigate our lives, let us choose to do so as people of the Spirit, people who have accepted the yoke of Jesus, people who are willing to learn and live the will of God. In doing this Jesus tells us, "You will find rest for your souls." Let us take him at his word.

June 2026 is devoted to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion centers on meditating upon and venerating the immense love, compassion, and mercy of Christ for humanity, often symbolized by His physical heart—pierced, crowned with thorns, and aflame with love

Prayer to the Sacred Heart for Healing and Wholeness

"Heavenly Father, I come before you, asking for Your healing. I ask for Your guidance as I work towards sobriety and seek to mend the areas of my life broken by my addiction. Help me become whole in mind, body, and spirit, and give me the determination to stay committed to this journey. I ask this through the saving grace of your Most Holy Sacred Heart. Amen."

Devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus in Recovery

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus offers divine guidance in addiction recovery with an emphasis on surrender, humility, forgiveness, mercy, and the transformation of attachments. By replacing addiction with a deep love for Christ, this devotion provides a profoundly comforting framework for all who are working through the trials of sobriety.

Devotional & Practice Considerations:

- **Spiritual Surrender:** The central premise is to "give" your addiction, cravings, or unhealthy attachments to Jesus. Relapsing is viewed not as a moral failure alone, but as "taking back" the object of addiction that you previously surrendered to His care.
- **Connection to 12-Step Programs:** The iconic tradition of handing out recovery chips or tokens has Catholic roots. Early Alcoholics Anonymous co-founder, Dr. Bob Smith, was assisted by Sister Mary Ignatia Gavin, who famously gave recovering patients a Sacred Heart badge when they completed treatment.
- **Calix Society:** This specialized ministry is open to Catholics in recovery, who are maintaining their sobriety through the participation in their Catholic faith and a 12-step program.
- **First Friday Devotions:** Making reparation for sins and regularly consecrating yourself to the Sacred Heart each month builds a habit of accountability and spiritual reliance.
