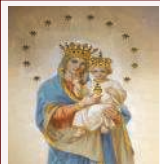

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Reflection by Deacon Leo Howitz

The Gospel this week is a personal favorite; Jesus walking on the water. In this reflection let us just focus on two things: what the Scriptural Text is telling us about Jesus and what we can personally take away from this in our own lives.

The first is that Matthew points out the Divinity of Jesus. Most people think of the Gospel of John when it comes to the Divinity of Jesus but look at what is happening here. When Jesus is out on the water in the middle of the night during a storm, Matthew writes something interesting, something we could easily miss because of the translation.

The words Matthew used are the exact Hebrew words from the Book of Exodus when God spoke to Moses at the burning bush. The name God told Moses to use to tell the Pharaoh the name of God was, 'I AM.' When Jesus tells them, 'It is I' as it is written in our Bible, the translation of the original text is 'I AM' from the Book of Exodus.

Consider this along with a phrase that is used repeatedly in the Bible whenever God speaks, 'take heart, have no fear' and Jesus' walking on the waves in the middle of the sea. Jesus is really revealing His Divinity.

Also, consider the ending of the Gospel. When Jesus came aboard the boat, what happened? The storm subsided, only God can control the sea. And what did the disciples do? They bow down and worship Him saying, 'truly you are the Son of God.' This is the exact homage the devil wanted Jesus to show him when He was tempted in the desert and offered all the kingdoms of the world.

The second is the personal message I get from this Gospel. All things are possible through Jesus. Peter walks on the water and got as far as Jesus before he realized he was doing the impossible and saw the waves and heard the wind. For a moment in time Peter forgot all of that and completely trusted in Jesus.

When Peter started to doubt was when he started to sink. He became distracted by the wind and the waves and realized this was impossible. The trust and focus he had in Jesus was broken; without Jesus nothing is possible. If we can keep it together, with complete trust and love in Jesus, amazing things are very possible for Peter, and of course for you and me.

Here is a possibility that seems to happen to me when I am not careful. I can feel fully connected to Jesus, but in my own excitement I start thinking, wow I am walking on water; I am doing amazing things on my own. Maybe, Peter thought the same thing. Maybe Peter thought, in his own excitement, I am doing the impossible; I am walking on water. When he looked at Jesus, maybe for a moment, he thought, I can walk on water just like Jesus.

That is the danger, the sneakiest sin we must watch out for: pride. Do you know when this happens the most to me? When my prayer life is weak. Prayer keeps me grounded, but for me it is so easy to sometimes let it slide. If everything we do in our lives is grounded in prayer, we can do anything. God will let us walk on water and do amazing things, but we must always have complete faith and trust in Him.

This is not easy, I am telling you this, and I struggle to do this myself. Pride is the one sin that limits me, that keeps me from being close to God because I get excited and think I can do this on my own, maybe for only a moment, but maybe that is all it takes.

National Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities

History and Background

In 2016, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops called for a National Day of Prayer to be observed on September 9, the Memorial of St. Peter Claver, as a response to increased racial tensions. This initiative was introduced to foster honest and respectful dialogue, and to promote reconciliation, within communities facing heightened tensions.

Why September 9?

September 9 is the Memorial of St. Peter Claver, a Jesuit priest from Catalonia who served and ministered to enslaved Africans in Cartagena, Colombia for 38 years. St. Peter Claver baptized more than 300,000 people and called himself the "slave of the slaves forever". He died in 1654 and was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. He is the patron saint of African Americans and of enslaved peoples. The Memorial of St. Peter Claver is an occasion for heightened prayer and action to strive for peace in our communities.

Prayer Accomplishes Wonderful Things

Reflecting on this Day of Prayer for Peace, Bishop Joseph Perry, former chairman of the Subcommittee for the Promotion of Racial Justice and Reconciliation, said: "We Christians believe that prayer accomplishes wonderful things for our families and communities. Prayer is the miracle salve for the ills of individuals as well as communities. The Lord Jesus promises that our prayer is heard by God. Let us never give up on prayer being able to bring us closer to God and to one another."

[Isaiah 55:1-3](#)

At the mountain of God, Horeb, Elijah came to a cave where he took shelter. Then the LORD said to him, “Go outside and stand on the mountain before the LORD; the LORD will be passing by.” A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the LORD—but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake—but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was fire—but the LORD was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.

GOSPEL:

[Matthew 14:22-33](#)

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. “It is a ghost,” they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, “Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid.” Peter said to him in reply, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.” He said, “Come.” Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, “Lord, save me!” Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?” After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, “Truly, you are the Son of God.”

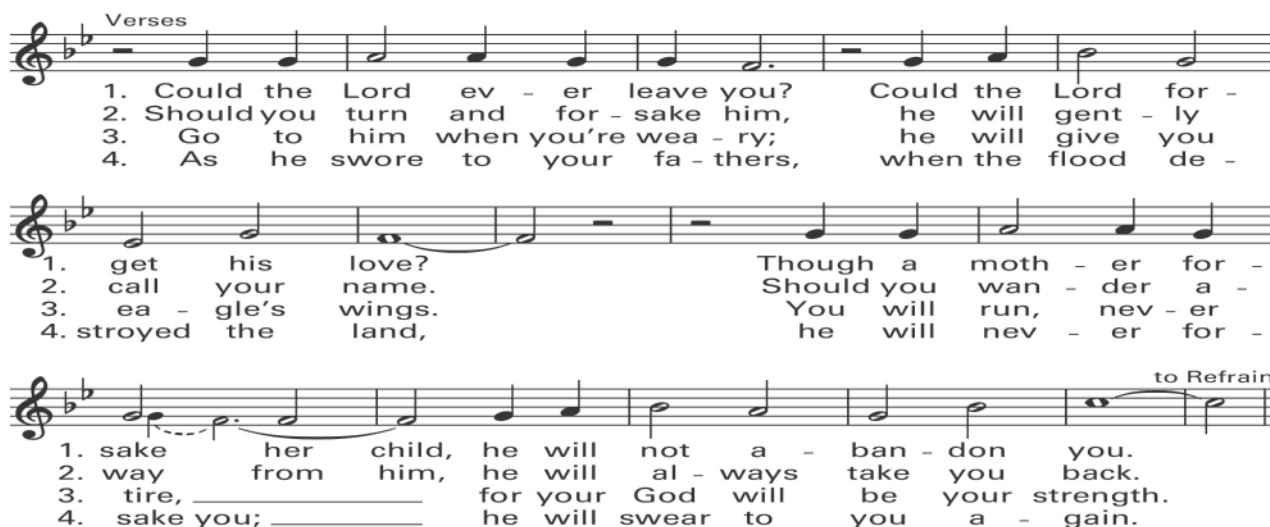
