Holy Father's Statement on Racism

Dear brothers and sisters in the United States,

I have witnessed with great concern the disturbing social unrest in your nation in these past days, following the tragic death of Mr. George Floyd.

We cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of human life. At the same time, we have to recognize that "the violence of recent nights is self-destructive and self-defeating. Nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost."

Today I join the church in Minneapolis and the entire United States, in praying for the repose of the soul of George Floyd and those of all others who have lost their lives as a result of the sin of racism. Let us pray for the consolation of their grieving families and friends and let us implore the national reconciliation and peace for which we yearn. May Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mother of America, intercede for all those who work for peace and justice in your land and throughout the world.

Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 14, 2000

Corpus Christi *By Pat Lipperini*

It seems fitting that we finally have a return to parish celebration of the mass on Corpus Christi Sunday-The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. All who have watched mass on TV and prayed the prayer for spiritual communion can now, once again, receive the Bread of Life. Welcome back to those in our socially distanced pews! And for those who are still going to wait a bit—we look forward to your return when health concerns are not as predominate.

We thank Fr. Yvans for his dedication to streaming the celebration of the mass to us each day. His hopeful and joyous spirit helped people through some very long weeks. He had a dedicated tech team helping him each day and we give special thanks to them, especially Don Bowker and Rolland Coutinho.

Although the dispensation to attend Mass is still in effect, and hopefully those vulnerable to the virus remain home during Phase I, I know that many who are able will be glad to return to mass attendance. If absence makes the heart grow fonder, then the prohibition to attend mass has made the longing for the celebration of Eucharist greater. We missed seeing each other and praying alongside each other. We found a hole in our lives that could not be adequately filled, even with the beautiful and heartfelt streamed masses.

The early Christians understood the importance of celebrating mass together. They never saw it as an obligation. It was a need. They *needed* to celebrate together because through their words and actions, they experienced the risen Lord in their midst. St. Luke writes, “He was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.” By partaking of the Body and Blood of the Lord, the Christian community experienced life within them—a life beyond mere breathing and moving. They experienced the intimate life of the Trinity. As Jesus states, “Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me.”

But the life of the Trinity also includes respect and care for each other. St. Paul was at pains to make that clear to the Corinthians, who were already experiencing divisions and factions as they met for Eucharist. St. Paul speaks to the Corinthians about our “participation” in the body and blood of Christ. Translated from the Greek word *koinonia*, participation means intimate fellowship and profound connection. We cannot say Amen to Holy Communion with the Lord without accepting our communion with each other. We say yes to caring for our brothers and sisters at our Eucharistic table. That is why we have missed Holy Communion so much. We miss the strength given at Eucharist, through the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ *and* the experience of the community celebrating together.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi celebrates the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is a joyous feast because we are reminded that we are nurtured by the life of God. “The Gift of Finest Wheat” is our daily bread. Jesus tells us “for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.” We eat this food so that we can be nourished and transformed. Once fortified by the Body of Christ, we are gradually transformed into the Body of Christ in and for the world. As St. Teresa of Avila writes, “Christ has no body but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on the world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world.” As we celebrate and partake of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, let us recommit to building our parish community into a place where people truly experience the loving touch of God. Fortified by our *koinonia* with the Lord and with each other, let us also strive to make Christ truly present to a world in need of the saving power of God.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. Elementary and Junior High Faith Formation 2020-21

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

GENERAL OUTLINE:

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will NOT offer a Summer Intensive program this year.

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents, at least one monthly lesson for children given remotely by a catechist, and monthly family gathering. This family gathering will be offered remotely at various times. Families will be assigned a “gathering” to attend. If the health anxiety goes away, then we will begin to meet face to face (but in small groups).

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet three times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.
