Finally, last week our Church opened! After 3 months out of our spiritual home, the Stay at Home order was lifted, and we were able to enter our church for public celebration together. I thank God for answering our cry for healing our world from the massive spread of the virus and for the ability to keep a social distance to protect one another from the virus. I am so happy that we are able to gather as a parish community again. Let us be appreciative of the efforts of our Parish Council and the Parish Staff who spent time in helping implement the Diocesan guidelines for the preparation of the church for the first phase of opening and celebration of Mass. Their efforts help to make sure that everyone is safe as you come back to our church services. Let us all thank the members of these teams for caring so much to give of their time to help out in forming committees to implement the new procedures. It has been three hard months for the world and for our Church.

This pandemic teaches us a great lesson, that we are one and God created all of us in his love. We have been seeing all the protests all over the world where people are crying for justice and for peace. God teaches us to be just and peaceful. The world needs to be united in faith and through their/our faith. Let us surrender ourselves to God's commandment in John 13:34, where he asks us to love one another as he loves all of us.

This past three months brought so much sadness in our hearts in so many ways. Some parishioners have lost members of their family and friends. Some of them have departed without their family present and could not even have a funeral. Let us remember to be sensitive and caring to our brothers and sisters who have suffered great losses and may be in mourning. It's also been extremely sad to hear that we must close our Good Shepherd School. We will miss the presence of our children at our parish campus. We will miss our wonderful teachers and staff. Continue to pray for all of them in their time of adjustments into a new school family. Like Jeremiah in the first reading today: "We pray for the Lord to be with them, like a mighty champion" (Jeremiah 20:11). As Jesus said in the Gospel: "Every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows" (Mt 10:30).

And Jesus continues: "He who will speak for me before men, I too will speak for him before my Father who is in heaven." It is a matter of declaring oneself publicly and in deeds, in solidarity with Christ; to be one with him. It is not a calculation, but a relationship of love because by our baptism, we have been grafted on to Jesus Christ. We are inseparable from Him; and with him we remain in the intimacy of the Trinity. As St. Paul says, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God manifested in Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 8:39).

"He who denies me before men, I too will deny him before my Father in heaven." We are always free to go away and say like Saint Peter at the time of Christ's arrest: "I do not know this man" (Mt 26, 72). But we know very well that whoever goes away like Peter can always come back with a repentant heart; and like Peter, perhaps Christ will say to them, "Do you love me?" (Jn 21, 15...).

Remember the courage of the prophet Jeremiah, who had to face the calumnies of the crowd and the betrayal of his friends. He always remained faithful to the Lord, remembering the word of the Lord" which had been addressed to him: "Do not be afraid of confronting them, for I am with you to rescue you," Yahweh declares (Jer 1:8). May the Lord continue to be with us, guide us, and protect us as the world is working to fight against the spread of the virus, search for cures, begin to operate businesses again, and recover financially, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and positive attitude as our church continues to take necessary measures to follow the guidelines set forth by the Diocese to reopen our church, begin our ministries, and to begin the administration of the Sacraments again. Please keep your faith strong through these times of change and always remember not to focus on our inconveniences, but that our goal is to grow closer to Jesus and to practice what Jesus has taught us.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th.

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet three times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



A lecturer once gave an examination with just this question: What is courage?

And he gave the class 3 hours to answer that question. Everybody began to write immediately.

After about 5 minutes a student walked up with just a piece of paper.

There is only one sentence in that paper.

He handed it over to the lecturer and left the examination hall.

Everybody was surprised, but carried on writing.

When the results were out, everybody was also surprised. It was that student who passed up that one piece of paper with only one sentence who got the highest marks.

He wrote only 3 words: This is courage!

Courage is not about words. Courage is about actions.

Certainly we would want to know what he wrote and how he answered that question.

In today's gospel, Jesus told his disciples not to be afraid. What is there to be afraid of? Plenty these days! There is the fear of going to the dentist, fear of losing the job, fear of illness, fear of failure, etc.

So how do we pray when we come face to face with troubles and difficulties?

We need to look at how Jesus prayed when He was in the Garden of Gethsemane.

At first He asked His heavenly Father to take that cup away, meaning to save him from suffering, pain and the cross.

After that, He prayed that God's will be done and not His will.

In life there are many dangerous storms. We can react with fear, or we can decide to have courage. Because it takes courage to believe and trust in Jesus who declares to us: "Do not be afraid. I have conquered the world."

God our Father, you are the source of all life and blessings.

In your great wisdom and love you made all things.

Bless these men,

that they may be strengthened as Christian fathers.
