Matthew 13: 1 – 23

One of the reasons Jesus spoke in parables was that they are easy to understand and not quickly forgotten. But you have to wonder why He did not explain them to the crowds. Some parables can be very difficult to understand. What was the point of telling them if the people do not understand them?

To answer this we must consider why so many people went out to see Jesus? Jesus was famous to many because of the miracles he performed. They did not care about his teaching; they just wanted a show. Jesus used his parables to divide the people who came to learn and those who came simply to be entertained.

Those with hearts not interested in the ways of heaven would leave disappointed exactly as Isaiah prophesied, "You shall indeed hear but not understand. You shall indeed look and not see." But those whose hearts were open to love could gain life changing insight. And the parable of the sower addressed the four different hearts that the seed could be sown among.

The seed that is sown on the path represents people who live in the moment doing whatever they feel like, blindly following whatever is popular or their own ambitions at the time. These are the people who simply came to be entertained. They never had a chance; they received the word, did not understand it and quickly forgot it.

The seed that is sown on the rocks represents the people who hear and understand, but they have hearts that are not rooted in God. When it comes down to deciding what they really stand for, they do not stand for the ways of God.

The seed that is sown among the thorns represents the people who also hear and understand and are very similar to those who sow seeds among the rocks. These people may have strong roots, but they are very much attracted to the ways of the world. When it comes down to deciding what they really stand for, they also do not stand for the ways of God.

The seed sown on the rich soil represents those who hear and understand, have strong roots, and realize that the ways of the world will pass. In the end all that matters is the way of God. When it comes down to deciding what they stand for, it is God. They become the largest of trees. They are the blessed, who hear and understand and look and see.

Here comes the most important part of the Gospel. Why did Jesus not explain this parable to the people? The disciples were very confused about this and had to know why Jesus was not explaining this to them. And then Jesus tells them that they are blessed because they have been granted the ability to see and understand. Even more confusing, what made the disciples so much different from the people in the crowd?

Nothing!!! But when Jesus approached his disciples, He asked them to drop what they were doing, obey and follow Him. They did!!!! They never looked back!!! Even when Jesus was saying some really controversial things that made many in the crowds simply turn and walk away, they did not go. In the Gospel of John, what did Peter say? "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life".

To be of rich soil we must profess our discipleship. There is no other way. Jesus asks each of us to come and follow him. When we say yes, we are of that rich soil, roots will grow, and the seeds will grow to full bloom. But it is not easy! Jesus, as I have told you before, is not easy! You must do exactly what Jesus asks, "Obey and follow". We all want to do this, but giving up our own independence is difficult.

We must become like sheep, and what do sheep do? They follow their shepherd. They blindly go where they are told. This is difficult. How many times in our own lives do we rely on our own logic and reason rather than follow Jesus? Even more difficult, Jesus is not physical in our world. We have to pray more and more for His guidance. But have no fear if in your heart you choose to follow and obey Him; He will always guide. You will be blessed the same way as the disciples. You will hear and understand. You will look and you will see!

The Yoke of Jesus **by Pat Lipperini**

Today's gospel includes one of the most cherished and comforting lines in all of scripture: "Come to me all who labor and are heavy burdened and I will give you rest." After these last few wearisome months, Jesus' words seem to call to us so directly. What is our response? How have we been managing our worries and fears? Are we still trying to deal with today's challenges on our own, or have we brought our concerns to God?

The good news of our faith is that God is with us. We hear this truth at the birth of Jesus, in the very first chapter of Matthew's gospel: "and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means God is with us." The good news is repeated in the gospel's last line: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." It is one thing to know this intellectually, as acknowledgment of the words of scripture. It is another to know it in one's heart and in one's bones. God is with us. God is companion on our journey. God is witness and succor to our struggles.

However, as we mature in our faith, we realize that God does not magically remove the obstacles we face. We will always be confronted with some trouble. Thus, in today's reading Jesus speaks, not of removing our burden, but instead, of replacing *how* we carry the burden. "Take *my* yoke upon you and learn from me." Miraculously, when we take Jesus' yoke upon our shoulders it does not add weight to our own loads. Rather, his yoke helps us carry our burdens with greater ease.

How does this happen? First, because of the good news that God is with us. The weight of our burden is distributed along the yoke. We do not pull by ourselves. God shares every moment of our journey. Secondly, Jesus' yoke is not like any other. It is fashioned with exquisite care, perfectly designed, without superfluous attachments. It works because the yoke is finely attuned to God's will and God's ways. That means the yoke of Jesus works better than any other yoke ever devised. "My yoke is easy and my burden light." Jesus wants us to discard our own yokes, perhaps too heavy with attachments that leach away our energies and peace. He invites us to choose to use his yoke instead.

Jesus also asks us to "learn from me." It is not enough that God pulls alongside us. God also wants to give us the ability to pull our part with greater strength and less anxiety. So, as we take on the yoke of Jesus, we watch him. We match his pace and adopt his attitudes. We change, we become more whole-heartedly aligned with God's will, not immediately, but gradually as we walk alongside our Lord and imitate his ways. When we walk with Jesus and learn his pace, we come to see a better way to live. We start to choose attitudes and activities that fill us with the peace the world cannot give. We start to spend our time and energies on what really matters.

In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds the Romans that they are called to align with the qualities and character of God and not succumb to the worldly temptations that will ultimately weaken and deplete their lives. "You are not in the flesh. Rather you are in the Spirit." Paul is not identifying an opposition between the body and the soul, but rather a conflict between the things of God and those things wholly unconnected, which only lead to division and pain, in both our souls and in the world around us. As we continue to navigate these troubled times, let us choose to do so as people of the Spirit, people who have accepted the yoke of Jesus, people who are willing to learn and live the will of God. In doing this Jesus tells us, "You will find rest for yourselves." Let us take him at his word.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

Ministry with the Deaf and Persons with Disabilities

This ministry assists those with communication, developmental, behavioral, and other physical limitations through advocacy and actions which safeguard their full integration and participation in the life of the church. It seeks out opportunities for social engagement that can lighten the burden of dependency, allowing the person to emerge with joy as a social being. Programs include Masses in American Sign Language, visits to the sick and shut-ins, Faith Formation, sacramental preparation, support for hearing parents of deaf children, and outreach programs.

Senior Health & Well-Being Membership Program

VITALity offers a free membership program for all South Jersey residents age 65 and over. As an active member, you can request important health topics, spiritual enrichment, and lifestyle information. You will also receive our quarterly newsletter with upcoming diocesan events, health tips, and information on VITALity programs. Our staff also visits locations such as senior clubs, health fairs, and senior housing residences to provide health education and information on resources VITALity offers. 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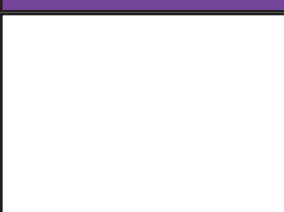
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
