Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time



The author of the biblical book of Wisdom, I should say the preacher, will therefore say loud and clear to his contemporaries that only God has true wisdom, the secrets of knowledge. He already understood what Jesus would say a few decades later, that the secrets of God are not within the rich, or the wise and the learned, but the humble. I am referring here to this phrase from Jesus that we heard recently in the Gospel of Matthew (three weeks ago, on the Fourteenth Sunday): "Father, Lord of heaven and earth, I proclaim your praise: what you have hidden from the wise and the learned, you revealed to the little ones. (Mt. 11, 25).

The first reading for this Sunday helps us to meditate on two major themes of the Jewish faith: the power and the goodness of God. I'll start with the latter, because the author insists particularly on it. God "takes care of everything", he is "patient with everything", he "judges with kindness and love", he "governs with great care", and finally, "to those who have sinned he grants conversion". This first reading creates hope for all of us who are God's followers and even for us sinners who strive to do his will every day. We know he judges with clemency; therefore, he constantly gives us opportunities to acknowledge his goodness toward us and toward the world. Yes, we believe there is no other God like our God.

Last Sunday's gospel was insistent on the quality of the ground that can be less favorable for the harvest. This Sunday we find ourselves in the field where it is more direct and more organized to sow. The present parable involves an enemy who, during the night, sows weeds in the field to destroy all the effort of the sower. Many times in our lives, we work hard to build our reputation, our career, or our family, but there is always an evil spirit that wants to come and sow weeds either to destroy what we have worked so hard to build, or to damage it and make it difficult for us. The only thing that we know is that our Lord Jesus Christ always gives us patience to continue to pray for the will of God to be done. As we heard in the gospel, we cannot uproot the weeds. We need to let them be part of the wheat because the Lord knows it all. This is the reason why we need to pray to ask for strength, so we can continue to have faith in the Lord by sowing only good seeds.

Jesus gives us this parable to show us how it is the same in the human heart. God sows and plants his words in our hearts, but the evil one comes and tries to sow wrong seeds within it, which means sometimes, evil habits, thoughts, and actions. Today's parable teaches us how hard it is to be good soil and a good sower in this world. The evil spirit comes in many forms, seeking and waiting to destroy the good seeds that are planted in our hearts. It teaches us that it is hard to distinguish between those who are in the kingdom and those who are not. That leads us sometimes to be impatient with ourselves or with others. We are living in the world that is quick to judge, quick to give up, quick to let go, quick to abandon, quick to destroy, and quick to change even the history.

Our heavenly Father is slow to anger, abounding in kindness and fidelity (Psalm 145:5). The comparison of the master and the harvester is the image of God as gracious and patient toward us. His patience is infinite. The Lord always gives us another chance to repent and to convert. He gives us time to grow and develop a relationship with him. Therefore, we are called to be patient with our brothers and sisters, to forgive and give them a second chance in life. How many chances do we usually give to our children, our neighbors, spouses, co-workers, our siblings, and to our parents before condemning them for misbehavior? God is slow to anger. Let us ask the Lord to give us the grace and strength to reproduce his patient image among our society and our families.

Jesus invites us to trust in him, to be patient and humble. Notice the fragility of the beginnings, like the smallness of the seed compared to the size of the result. Patience: the harvest will come. This message of patience which sounds so good in the first reading suggests a new reading of the parable of the wheat: if God is so patient, it is an example to be patient, so we do not risk losing the goodness of the Lord's harvest by pulling weeds which could also uproot good wheat (every gardener knows this risk). But it is mainly because he never despairs of transforming the tares (which is a weed which resembles wheat when young) of our hearts into good grain!

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

"Do you want us to go and pull them up?"

He replied, "No. If you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them."

We may know of some people who have left the Church because of a bad experience. The bad experience can be anything from being told off by a priest to an argument with another Catholic in Church.

And their common complaint is: How can Church people/ Catholics be like this? Yes, how can Catholics or people who go to Church be like this? Just what is the Church all about?

Well, ideally we would think that the Church is made up of good and nice people who would not give any kind of trouble whatsoever. After all the Church is called the Holy Catholic Church. Right? Yet if Jesus came for sinners, then the Church is also refuge for sinners and a place where sinners will slowly learn to be saints.

The Church is essentially the font of God's grace for these kind of people, and no one in the Church can ever say that he/she is without sin....mmm, some people do...saints in our midst...that's another homily. In other words, the Church is certainly not a garden without its weeds, as reflected in the parable in the gospel.

Even Jesus Himself did not weed out people like Peter and Judas, and He even gave hope to sinners who want to repent.

May we acknowledge that we are indeed sinners but let us also acknowledge the power of God's grace.

May we journey this week in repentance and conversion and may others see the Church as a sign of salvation.
