Seventeenth Sunday of Ordinary Time



Brothers and Sisters,

On this 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time, the readings still keep us in the field. This time it is very different. In the first reading, Solomon teaches us a lesson that should be an important tool for all of us. He was chosen by God to be the successor of David. It was not due to his personal strength because he was not the qualified one. Even if they would have had a choice, he would not have been chosen.

From the beginning of his power he proved that he was a man of wisdom and logic. As a young king, he had his merit and was blessed by God to know that Wisdom is the most precious gift in life. Later in today's gospel, Matthew will speak of treasure and pearl.

Solomon understands that only God holds true knowledge and true wisdom. Solomon's prayer at the Sanctuary of Gibeon is a model of humility and confidence: "I am a very young man, unable to govern. Give your servant an attentive heart so that he may know how to govern your people and discern good and evil; how else can you govern your people who are so important? "

The second lesson of this passage concerns the first Book of Kings but also all those who hold power in any area whatsoever. What is remarkable in Solomon's prayer is that his request aimed for wisdom to serve people, not to showcase his knowledge and blessings. He does not ask for anything for himself personally; he only asks for the necessary strength and wisdom to exercise the mission that has been entrusted to him by God. The young king proves that he perfectly integrated the monarchical ideal prescribed by God to David (through the prophet Nathan): in Israel, from the very beginning of the kingship, the prophets, one after another, reminded all kings that they must have only one concern in mind, namely the happiness and security of the people entrusted to them.

God's response insists on this quite remarkable disinterest of Solomon's prayer: "Since you did not ask me for long days, nor for wealth, nor for the death of your enemies, but since you asked for discernment, the art of being attentive and of governing, I do what you asked. I give you an intelligent and wise heart, such as no one had before you and no one will have after you." This exceeds all the hopes of the young king. And God does not stop there. The reading, unfortunately, does not make us hear the continuation which is, nevertheless, a very beautiful lesson on the generosity of God: "And even what you did not ask, I give it to you; And riches and glory, so that during all your life, there will be no one like you among kings."

The story of Solomon is a great message that can help us to pray appropriately. In reading this first reading, one needs to ask God for the gift of the wisdom of Solomon. Every day in my life I ask God to enrich me with Solomon's wisdom. I want to be taught every day how to minister to his people so they can be closer to him.

Does the evangelist try to point out the difference of the two characters? The first exults with joy at his discovery ("In his joy, he is going to sell everything he owns, and he buys this field"). The second is less demonstrative, but he too "will sell everything he has to buy the pearl."

What do these three stories in the gospel have in common? The gospel talks about good fish and bad fish, similar to last week's gospel that talks about the wheat and the weeds. There is a choice to be made between the good fish and the bad fish in the net, between the treasure buried in the field and the value of the possession of the gardener, between the pearl and the value of what the merchant possessed. The lesson is clear: Receiving the Good News of the Kingdom of God requires a choice and deserves that we sacrifice everything else. As Christians, the Lord created us to be free. It is up to us to choose between what is necessary in life and what is important for our souls.

May the Lord continue to work in us so we are not thrown away like a bad fish but rather be the hidden pearl that is so important, not in the eyes of others but in the eyes of God.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

Someone's trash is another's treasure: from flea markets, finds on the beach, in a dresser drawer, or if we are lucky enough to find a genie lamp, etc.—where or how the treasure is found. It always surprises us.

We have heard about the kingdom of heaven. Jesus describes the kingdom as something extraordinary that is “hidden in plain sight.” — “It is like...a coin, a pearl.”

In truth, when we think about it, the kingdom can be found anywhere because the kingdom is God himself.

But, have we seen the kingdom of heaven?

If we respond generously to opportunities to “reach out and touch someone,” we will find and experience the kingdom of heaven—and, that is a treasure to rejoice!
