Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Confidence

If we had only one scripture passage available to us during these last few months, our second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Romans would have been my choice. I can read it again and again and I always receive an immense uplift of spirits and stirring of courage. We do well to review it today, especially in the light of all that we have experienced this year.

We can sense Paul's passion when he asks, "Who will separate us from the love of Christ?" It is a good question and certainly one that we ask ourselves. Mostly, when things are going poorly, don't we wonder about God's place in our lives? Is God really watching us? Does God see our sadness and anxiety? Does God care about me and my fears? But Paul asks this question as if a negative answer is unimaginable. Paul assures us that God is on our side. God's care is personal and intimate. Leading up to this question, Paul reminds us that Christ gave his life for us. Why then, after giving the ultimate, would Christ suddenly look the other way?

Paul goes on and lists some experiences that may make us feel abandoned by Christ: "Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword?" We could change those words to today's stresses: will social distancing, loneliness, anxiety, undecided school plans, cancelled weddings and family gatherings, sickness, death, economic turmoil or social unrest? The list keeps growing. But Paul states, "No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us."

What does Paul mean when he says we conquer overwhelmingly? We certainly cannot make these terrible occurrences go away! But perhaps he is suggesting that Christ gives us the ability *to not let events conquer us*. What does that look like?

How many of us know people in our lives who seem unshakable by events, whether it is personal or societal? My mother comes to mind quickly. She has spent a lifetime staying connected to God and draws on God's strength, living with steadiness and compassion, even amid terrible heartache. It is no coincidence that this chapter of Paul's letter to the Romans contains her favorite bible passage: "We know that things work for good for those who love God (8:28). Her heart is steadfast, and she rests always in the faithfulness of God. She looks at the big picture, the long haul, not the daily setbacks and sorrows. If we look around, we will see other examples of people who are likewise unflappable. We gravitate towards them in a crisis. It feels safer to be around them, like standing next to a captain on a ship who knows the right passage through a stormy channel at sea. They exude a peace we all desire.



This peace and confidence in God does not come to us overnight, but it *is* available to all of us. That is why we are asked to pray daily, in whatever fashion works best for us, and to worship with our community, whether remotely or in person. We need to *practice* our faith in God until the muscle memory (or heart memory) becomes natural and the only choice. Then, the problematic events that surround us will be the context of our prayer, not the cause of our collapse. How would it change our lives to have the confidence of St. Paul?

*For I am convinced that neither death, nor life,
nor angels, nor principalities,
nor present things, nor future things,
nor powers, nor height, nor depth,
nor any other creature will be able to separate us
from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

They all ate and were satisfied.

I was always amazed in watching my pups, Leo (Puggle) and Charlie (King Charles), sitting and waiting patiently as I prepared their food... contentment in their dark brown eyes, because they didn't mind the size they were receiving. In all that preparation and waiting, even the smallest portion is worth waiting for... even if it's gone in seconds.

The crowd of 5,000 was getting hungry, and all they had were five loaves and two fish. It was not enough, and obviously there was nothing that the disciples could do about the hungry situation.

And here is where we must believe that when we can't do anything, then God can and will do something: with the smallest portion, smallest fragment, smallest piece of what we have.

We might have experienced receiving a small fragment of Holy Communion when we approached the priest or minister—as they were running low—the question is: Were we disappointed, upset, or satisfied?

The big question we may ask ourselves: Did we receive the full or partial presence of Jesus? So, does size matter? Not according to Leo, Charlie, and the great crowd of people. Why? Because the crowds believed in Jesus' mercy and love.

As we approach Holy Communion, if by chance, the priest or minister is running low and we receive a crumb "from the table" —remember that the smallest piece is still the full presence of Jesus...and enough of the Lord's grace to be satisfied.

We are not called to do great things. But, we are called to do small things with great love. —St. Mother Teresa
