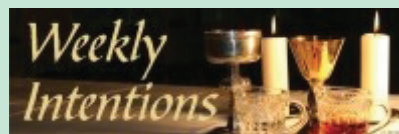

Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Happy Sunday to all of you. This past Tuesday we were all scared and were ready to wait for this big Hurricane Isaias. We did not know how that would go for us here in the South Jersey area. However, God continues to show us that He is the master of nature. We did not know if we would see the sun, but at the end of the day it was a hot, beautiful, sunny evening. The Cyclone did not do the damage that was forecasted in so many places. We thank God for being in our boat during the storm. Yes, He continues to show us that He is the master of the universe.

The reflection for this weekend leads us to experience the words of Ecclesiastes 3:1 that state: "There is a time and a season for everything under the heavens". "When Jesus had dismissed the crowds," Matthew tells us, "He went to the mountain alone to pray. In the evening, He was there, alone." I believe that Jesus was in constant dialogue with His Father, but perhaps sometimes He felt the need for silence, to be more available to the Spirit who was telling Him which direction to take. Even Jesus took time off from doing missionary work, so He could regain physical strength to manage His divine power. Jesus felt the necessity to rejuvenate Himself in prayer by asking God the Father for more strength to do His mission.

As we can see in the gospel, the event of this weekend happens immediately after the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Based on the story, the disciples were busy, and they barely had time to pick up the twelve baskets of what was left after all the crowd had been satisfied. They were told to leave the place immediately. Now we may wonder why Jesus asks them to leave the place so quickly after the miracle of the loaves and fishes. It seems there was an urgency for the mission. In the Gospel of Mark 1:38 Jesus said, "Let us go elsewhere, to the neighboring towns, so that I can proclaim the message there too, because that is why I came." In other words, there is no time to waste.

Let us look at what is happening in the boat: "The apostles were so scared because they were tossed by the waves; they were sailing against the wind. Peter and his companions were regularly fishing in Lake Tiberias, and it does not appear that they were panicked by the bad weather. However, things changed when they saw someone approaching the boat, walking on the waves. They became scared, mistaking Jesus for a ghost, and they started to scream. Then, the familiar friendly voice said, "Trust! It's me; do not be afraid!" Peter wanted to be assured that what He saw was true. He requested to have this experience, to walk on the water. No more fear- now he wants to have a true experience of imitating Jesus in walking on the water.

Yet, Jesus allows Peter to walk on the water. During this astonishing experience he got scared and took his eyes off Jesus; then he started to sink. His only fault was to have looked elsewhere. If he had not taken his eyes off Jesus, he would have been able to continue steadily walking on the water.

Brothers and Sisters, this is a lesson to learn. Let us constantly look to Jesus rather than elsewhere. Even in our imperfections, our scary moments, and our life difficulties we need to be inspired to call on Jesus for help, to which He never resists. We are in safety when we call to Jesus for help.

Man of little faith why did you doubt? When Jesus says, "Come", He will give us the means to get to Him, but we must put our trust in Him. He is our Good Shepherd.

May this reflection help you all to continue to trust in Jesus. Even in the moment of doubt do not cease to call upon Him. Even if we feel we are on the boat alone, know that we are surrounded by His grace and blessings.

Believe and do not look elsewhere. Always look upon Jesus who is the way, the truth, and the life.

May the Lord bless you all!

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

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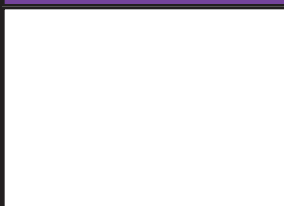
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
