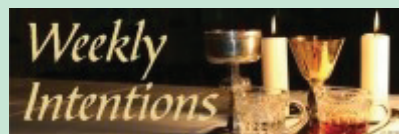

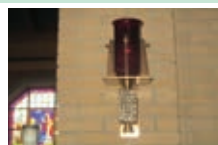

Twentieth Sunday of Ordinary Time

It is interesting to see that this scene in the gospel for this 20th Sunday of Ordinary time takes place immediately after a teaching of Jesus about purity; we know that in the Jewish world, purity is not the absence of sin, but the ability to be closer to God. The Pharisees attached great importance to the rules of purity, to be worthy to pray and come to the Temple. Jesus has just said that purity is first and foremost a matter of heart and intention. At the risk of scandalizing the Pharisees, he said, "What comes out of the mouth comes from the heart, and that is what makes a man unclean. From the heart, indeed, come evil intentions ... This is what makes a man unclean; but eating without washing his hands does not make a man unclean." (Mt 15, 19-21).

However, it is just after this controversy that Jesus decides to go to a pagan territory, where precisely everyone is unclean in the eyes of the Jews, since no one respects the rules of purity of the Jewish law. This Canaanite woman who came to meet Jesus is a pagan; however, she does not hesitate to approach him and ask for healing for her daughter: "Have mercy on me, Lord, son of David!" My daughter is tormented by a demon." No doubt she heard of Jesus' reputation as a healer.

Strangely, Jesus did not respond to her quest, which incites the disciples to intervene saying: "Send her away because she is following us and keeps crying after us". This event reminds us of the parable of the **needed** friend reported in the gospel of Saint Luke: "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him, and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything. I tell you, if he does not get up to give him the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence' (Lk 11: 5-8).

It seems that through this parable Jesus recommends perseverance in prayer. The parable of the widow and the judge (in Luke chapter 18) goes in the same direction and Saint Luke specifies that Jesus told this parable to tell his disciples "the **need** to pray constantly and not to be discouraged". This is exactly what the Canaanite woman does, and she annoys the disciples who plead with Jesus to intervene, to which he replies that this woman is a foreigner, a Canaanite: "I was only sent to the lost sheep of Israel.

In saying this, he places himself firmly in the perspective of God's plan, the first stage of which concerns the people of Israel. He had already taken a very clear stand in the same way when he had sent his apostles on a mission; Matthew relates: "Jesus sent them on a mission with the following instructions: 'Do not take the way of the Gentiles and do not enter a city of Samaritans; rather go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel'." (Mt 10, 6).

Jesus goes even further. He begins by justifying his refusal to intervene: "It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." But he ended up acting in favor of the Canaanite; and why is he changing his mind? "Because she has faith," he said. "Woman, great is your faith. Let everything turn out for you as you want!"

There are three important aspects in the story: First, Jesus said that the Canaanite woman has faith simply because she persists in trusting Him; she does not let herself be put off. On the contrary, she insists: "The little dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table."

Second, Jesus does not demand of the Canaanite woman any of the practices of the Jewish religion: only faith. The attitude of Jesus towards the Canaanite was understood as a model of welcoming the pagans, in the name of their faith.

Finally, it is evident that the mother's stubbornness was guided by her love for her daughter. Perhaps when we love this world enough, we too will have sufficient stubbornness and persistence to ask God for the salvation of the world. Pray with great faith in the Lord!

Have faith and believe. Surely your prayers will be answered.

May God bless and protect you and continue to heal us all.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.
