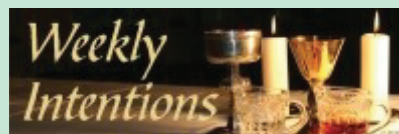

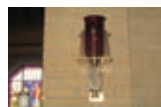

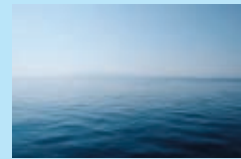
“Our Powerful God”

When we gaze on something immense, something beyond our understanding in its beauty or size, like the Grand Canyon, the ocean, or a sky full of stars, we struggle to find words to fit our feelings. More than likely, words simply fail us as we compare the majesty of what we see with the very minute place we take up in the universe. Sometimes, this experience of awe can be good for us because it can help us grow a little humility. We are not all that. But other times, standing before the overwhelming forces of nature leaves us apprehensive and maybe a little lonely. Do we matter at all?

I have been thinking about this since I read last week’s second reading from St. Paul’s letter to the Romans. He includes a beautiful hymn to the majesty of God.

*“Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!
How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways!
For who has known the mind of the Lord
or who has been his counselor?”*



And I wondered, when we hear God described as such, how do we feel? Are we overwhelmed and afraid of God’s power, as when we gaze at a cascade of mountains stretching endless before us? Or can we find comfort in God’s strength?

The religions of the ancient world believed that their gods controlled every aspect of the physical world. Moreover, they understood that these same gods had very little interest or desire to be involved with humanity, especially in any benign or benevolent sense. There was no solace in their power unless the gods deigned to end a drought or calm a storm. But enter the one God of the Israelites, who shattered this assumption about the Divine. Power and majesty did not mean cold-hearted neglect. No, the God of the Israelites, the one true God, had a might that went beyond the control of the natural world and involved the protection and nurturance of the human heart. This God was a powerful, personal God who cared about their lives, desired their growth, and had a plan for their fruition. The prophet Isaiah taught that God’s strength was not something to be feared, but to be celebrated. God’s strength is our salvation:

*“The LORD is the eternal God, creator of the ends of the earth.
He does not faint nor grow weary, and his knowledge is beyond scrutiny.
He gives strength to the fainting; for the weak he makes vigor abound” (40:28-29).*

This is who Paul is calling us to believe in and count on: God incarnate in Jesus. Jesus, who embodies God’s majesty; Jesus, who assures us “whoever has seen me has seen the Father” (Jn 14:9). God’s majesty is Good News for us. It is humbling but it can also reassure.

As 2020 continues to unfold, we have all realized our inability to control events. We have all been chastened by the tremendous power nature (a virus) can wield. As we struggle with continued uncertainty, we need to remind ourselves of the surety of God’s powerful love, existing and working in the midst of our turmoil. In last week’s gospel, Jesus asked Peter, “who do you say that I am,” which is arguably the most important question of all our lives. Who do we say that Jesus is for us? Is he Healer? Saviour? Friend? Judge? Comforter? My Lord and My God? If we allow ourselves to struggle honestly with this question, we are well on the way to deeper faith. And deeper faith is needed now more than ever. Our powerful, majestic, loving God works wonders beyond us but also *through* us. And so, we realize that we really do matter! Jesus could build a church upon the shoulders of Peter’s brave, if fragile, faith. Likewise, God’s power can heal our wounds, freeing us to serve our families, church, nation and world with humility and competency.

HAVE YOU BEEN COUNTED? CENSUS COLLECTION ENDING EARLY

The Census Bureau said it will **end the 2020 census count one month early** on September 30th in order to meet the year-end deadline. This could have severe consequences for the vulnerable populations, which have already been adversely affected by the pandemic that has made door-to-door data collection unsafe. Responses are low in Camden County and virtually in every city and state. If the counting time is cut short, communities most in need of resources to improve quality of life and standards of living will be chronically underfunded for the next decade.

WHAT IS THE SEASON OF CREATION?

Christian organizations around the world are celebrating the Season of Creation, the annual celebration of prayer and action for our common home. It starts on 1 September, the Day of Prayer for Creation, and concludes on 4 October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology.

The Season of Creation is an ecumenical initiative that has been celebrated since 1989. Pope Francis followed for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015. Pope Francis used powerful words last year to invite all Catholics to take part. "This is the season for *letting our prayer be inspired anew* by closeness to nature . . . to *reflect* on our lifestyles . . . for *undertaking prophetic actions* . . . *directing the planet towards life*, not death."

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

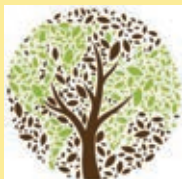
2020 PRAYER

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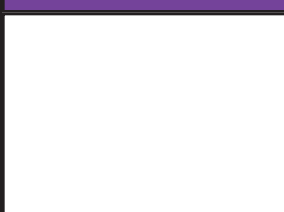
