### Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

**Registration:** We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

**Anointing of the Sick:** In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

**Pastoral Care:** Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

**Marriage:** Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

**Baptisms:** Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

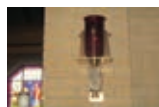

*In* today's Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the Wedding Feast to the chief priests and the elders. In this story Jesus is once again letting them know they are turning their back on God and that they will be condemned in the end.

As the story goes, a king carefully chose and invited guests from his kingdom, but they would not come. God did this for the Israelites in the Old Testament. God chose the Israelites as His people, but they resisted Him. Think of Moses. What did the people do when Moses went away? They started to worship a golden calf.

God forgave them and once again kept them as His people. Over time they started to fall away and God sent his servants, the prophets, to lead them back to Him, but what did they do? They did not listen, and just like the invited guests in the story they killed some of them.

What did God do? He allowed the armies from Assyria and Babylon to come in and destroy Israel. Israel was led out in bondage just like the man in the story without the wedding garment.

But God still loved His people and He sent the greatest of all the prophets, John the Baptist. We know what happened to John. He was beheaded. Jesus knew his time was coming, just like John. He was telling the chief priests and the elders they had better listen because God would do to them what the king did in the story.

In the Gospel the king once again sent his servants into the streets and gathered all the people they could find, the good and the bad alike, and they filled the banquet hall. This is judgment time.

The king inspects the guests and finds a man without a wedding garment. (Here is a little bit of history.) In many ancient wedding customs the king usually provided the wedding garments for the guests. Not being dressed appropriately would be very disrespectful.

The people gathered had a choice to make— wear a wedding garment or not. I like to think that John the Baptist, the servant of God, was providing the people with the wedding garment, and the wedding garment was and still is complete repentance just as He preached. Jesus, also God's servant, fine-tuned this garment with His message of love of God and neighbor. As the people follow Jesus the good shepherd, they were clothed in the greatest dress out of respect for God; they were wearing the wedding garment.

The chief priests and the elders knew what John and Jesus preached, but they paid them no attention. Now the feast is about to begin. The chief priests and the elders are already cast out, and the people in the hall were ready for inspection. Did they clothe themselves in Christ by following Him, or are they following their own gods: money, pleasure and selfish vices.

This is our reflection. We are like the people in the streets herded into a banquet hall. We have heard the Gospel, so we know what Jesus preached. However, just like the man that is tossed outside, just because we know what Jesus preached, do we really believe in Him? Do we really practice and do what He commands us?

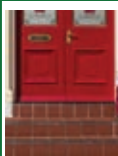

## What Is an Intercessory Prayer Ministry?

- They will be published in the bulletin for that week, on the parish web site, and also on the parish's Facebook Page.
- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).
- If they are unable to attend in person, the members of the ministry are asked to spend an hour in prayer for the intentions sometime during that ministry's week. Choose a place and time that works for you. The exposition will be streamed on Facebook Live if this is convenient for any of the members of your ministry.
