Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

What Is an Intercessory Prayer Ministry?

This is a group of people who devote specific time to pray for the needs of others in the parish. As part of the Intercessory Prayer group, each of our parish ministries will be assigned a week and create an intention for a specific need of our parish.

In order to give structure to this hour, these are the areas that we will concentrate on praying for: Church leadership, the world, our parish ministries, parish missions, parish pastoral planning, and parish spiritual events.

How This Ministry Will Work

During the year, each ministry will be assigned a week to participate in the Intercessory Prayer devotion along with the Intercessory Prayer Ministry and the entire parish as follows:

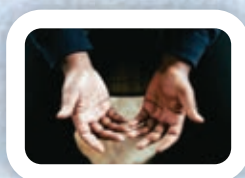
- Each ministry will be assigned a week.
- The ministry will develop prayer intentions for the week and submit them to the parish office two weeks prior to the beginning of their assigned week. Submit intentions to Stephanie at scampbell@stteresaofcalcuttanj.org.
- They will be published in the bulletin for that week, on the parish web site, and also on the parish's Facebook page.
- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions.
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).
- If they are unable to attend in person, the members of the ministry are asked to spend an hour in prayer for the intentions sometime during that ministry's week. Choose a place and time that works for you. The exposition will be streamed on Facebook Live if this is convenient for any of the members of your ministry.

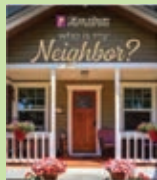

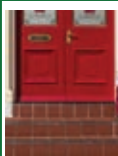

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. A Time to Remember & Pray for All Souls

"Let light shine out of darkness" 2 Corinthians 4:6

Masses for All Souls, typically held November 2, are cancelled due to the COVID-19 social distancing guidelines. However, we invite all to place a solar light on their loved one's grave or outside of the mausoleum, for those entombed indoors, to honor them in a special way during the month of November. We especially want to recognize those lost this year, particularly those lost during the time of restricted gatherings. We ask that solar lights be removed by December 1, 2020. In honor of All Souls Day, all diocesan managed chapel mausoleums will be open from 9 AM to 7 PM on Monday, November 2, 2020.

OCTOBER IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH.

Catholics believe that God loves and cares for everyone, and that God knows their pain and concerns. Catholics for Family Peace (based at Catholic University) invites you to join us in a moment of prayer at 3 pm, wherever you are, for those suffering from violence and abuse and those who use violence to control others.
