Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

No Excuses *By Pat Lipperini*

If you are a young athlete, dreaming of becoming a major star in your sport, you probably go to that sport's Hall of Fame. You see the faces of the stars and hear stories of their hard work and accomplishments. They inspire you towards great achievement even as they humble you by their dedication and drive. By the end of your visit, you have either discarded your dream of greatness, realizing its impossibility, or you have become even more enthused. If the latter, you set your sights on someday having your own display in the Hall of Fame, motivated to do the hard work necessary to achieve your goal.

Unfortunately, we all know that getting into any Hall of Fame, whether sports or music or any other field, takes MORE than hard work. There is a genetic factor that cannot be denied. Some people are supremely suited to a field and through their efforts, they hone their skills. I might have loved basketball as a high school athlete, but there was no way that my love of the sport alone could convey me to greatness. I would have needed an extra 8 inches and a much better jump shot!

Today's celebration of All Saints Day is our yearly visit to the Church's Hall of Fame. We celebrate all the saints-- those we know by name and more importantly, those unknown to us but now enjoying the fullness of God's presence. We honor a long list of people and we say, well done good and faithful servants! But as we celebrate the liturgies and contemplate these holy people, do we ever also wonder or dream about someday being included in this "great cloud of witnesses?" Or do we make a distinction between their vocation and our lives, attributing their extraordinary holiness to some rare saint gene that is usually not found in the general population? Do we secretly give thanks that God has not called us to such a life?

Our patron saint, Mother Teresa, seemed very aware of our tendency to dismiss the call to holiness. When we state that sainthood could not possibly pertain to our lives, when we hold up our weakness and sinfulness as proof of its impossibility, Mother Teresa does not let us off the hook. She notes, "Holiness is not the luxury of the few. It is a simple duty for me and for you. I must be a saint in my way, and you in yours." Moreover, she did not want us to imagine replicating her exact calling, as if we could all go to India and serve the poor. She knew that might also dissuade us from even trying. Instead, she suggested that we imitate her approach. She writes, "Stay where you are. Find your own Calcutta. Find the sick, the suffering, and the lonely, right where you are — in your own homes and in your own families, in homes and in your workplaces and in your schools. You can find Calcutta all over the world if you have eyes to see."

When we view the Saints' Hall of Fame, we need to envision our own section there with our own biography: A loving husband, a devoted mother, a selfless friend, an innovative teacher, an honest boss, a caring doctor, a dedicated worker, an energetic civil rights activist, a generous caregiver. We need to accept where God has put us (our own Calcutta) and make it a more loving environment. We need to imagine that our lives, lived with courage, creativity, compassion, and commitment, are exactly the avenue and vehicle to grow into holiness. No other way is required.



On All Saints Day, we do not get to excuse ourselves from the possibility of sainthood. It has been expected of us since our Baptism. It is dearly desired by Our Lord. It is absolutely needed in our world. And we are capable of such growth, not because of any genetic markings, but because of the power of the Holy Spirit, which guides and energizes our days. Let us not leave this Hall of Fame disillusioned by our own weaknesses. Let us leave heartened by God's strength.



What Is an Intercessory Prayer Ministry?

This is a group of people who devote specific time to pray for the needs of others in the parish. As part of the Intercessory Prayer group, each of our parish ministries will be assigned a week and create an intention for a specific need of our parish.

In order to give structure to this hour, these are the areas that we will concentrate on praying for: Church leadership, the world, our parish ministries, parish missions, parish pastoral planning, and parish spiritual events.

During the year, each ministry will be assigned a week to participate in the Intercessory Prayer devotion along with the Intercessory Prayer Ministry and the entire parish as follows:

- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions.
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).

If they are unable to attend in person, the members of the ministry are asked to spend an hour in prayer for the intentions sometime during that ministry's week. Choose a place and time that works for you. The exposition will be streamed on Facebook Live if this is convenient for any of the members of your ministry.

For individuals who are experiencing the effects of estrangement from their families;

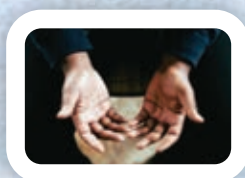
For those who suffer from fear, anxiety or painful - often debilitating - memories of past events in their lives;

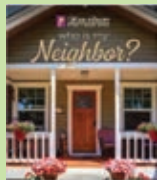

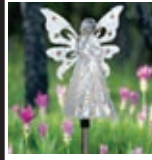

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith.
