Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

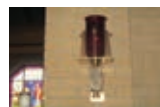

Feast of Christ the King: November 22, 2020

The liturgical year closes with the great description of Christ's Last Judgment. That is a great awareness of the beautiful gospel of Matthew 25:31-46. This Thanksgiving week is a feast of family gathering to thank God for all of his goodness to us. I would like to encourage everyone to stay safe and be prudent at every event attend with your family. No one is exempt; however, we have to do our best to survive this pandemic. I hope you continue to live in solidarity with those who do not have family nearby, or who do not have the blessings to have family members around, or who have lost a loved one during the pandemic by reaching out through a phone call, email, sending a card or via a text message.

This is the last Sunday of our liturgical year A. We are praising the name of the Lord for giving us the possibility to gather as a community to celebrate him as the King of our World. The Covid-19 has taken away our Lenten Season celebration, our Easter Celebration, and other major feast days of the year. Since this past June we have had the opportunity to gather prudently, following the guidelines of the diocese and the States as a community where we were able to listen, read, and hear the word of God at our Sunday Masses. The Liturgical year A comes to a conclusion and next week we will start a new Liturgical year known as B, where we will reflect every Sunday on the gospel of Mark. I wish you all a blessed New Liturgical year B. I pray for the Lord to continue to be in your heart, for you to live His gospel, to understand what you read, and to put it into practice. May He give you intelligence and wisdom to understand and proclaim His words.

Jesus Christ is a unique King with a unique Kingdom; a king who lives in solidarity with the least of His brothers and sisters. This is the only King who always makes himself available to the hungry, the sick, and the imprisoned. As a King He shows us how to humble ourselves to the lowest and most shameful human situations and become acquainted with the outcast and the rejected. This is the reason why Jesus Christ still lives as King in so many human hearts all over the world. The cross is his throne, and the Sermon on the Mount is his rule of law. His citizens need to obey only one major law: *"Love one another as I have loved you."* His love is selfless, sacrificial, kind, compassionate, forgiving and unconditional. That is why the preface in today's Mass describes Jesus' Kingdom as "a Kingdom of truth and life, a Kingdom of holiness and grace, and a Kingdom of justice, love and peace." Let us approach the Advent season with a more devout heart as we read the gospel of Mark. Please be safe. Let us continue to pray for all those affected by the Covid-19 virus and to ask the Lord to save the world from this virus.

Happy Advent Season and have a blessed new liturgical year.

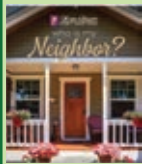

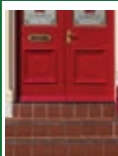

Intercessory Prayer Ministry

This is a group of people who devote specific time to pray for the needs of others in the parish. As part of the Intercessory Prayer group, each of our parish ministries will be assigned a week and create an intention for a specific need of our parish.

In order to give structure to this hour, these are the areas that we will concentrate on praying for: Church leadership, the world, our parish ministries, parish missions, parish pastoral planning, and parish spiritual events.

During the year, each ministry will be assigned a week to participate in the Intercessory Prayer devotion along with the Intercessory Prayer Ministry and the entire parish as follows:

- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions.
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).

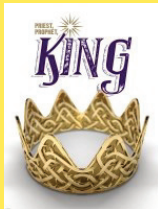

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. 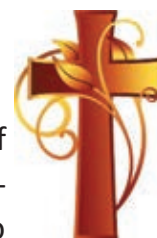

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SECOND READING: [1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28](#)

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the first-fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. GOSPEL: MT. 25: 31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

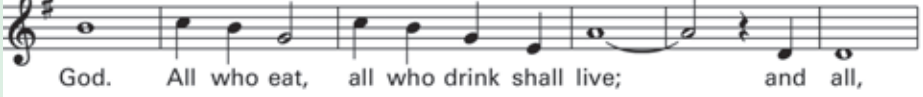

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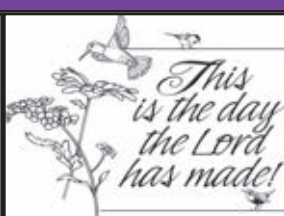
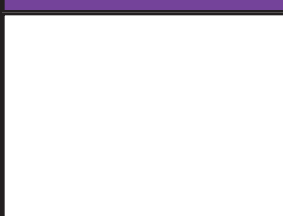
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
