**Baptisms:** Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held via Zoom at 7PM until further notice. Please call the office to register.

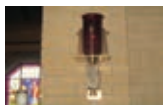

Receiving God's Word  
Pat Lipperini

Between the Christmas season and the beginning of Lent, the liturgical year gives us a small slice of Ordinary Time. The readings during this time speak of Jesus' public ministry, his call of the disciples and their gradual understanding of who he was. We hear the Sunday readings over a three-year cycle so after a while we realize we have heard these passages before. Today, Jesus is at the Sea of Galilee again, inviting Simon and Andrew to come with him. How many times have we listened to that story, wondering how they could leave everything to follow him? For that matter, how many times have we heard the story of the birth of Jesus? His miracles? His healings? His crucifixion? Perhaps the more important question is: What have we been doing with what we have heard?

The genius of the readings during the liturgical season is the assumption that our own growth in faith is not linear. Inspired by scripture, we might stretch a bit, try out some new idea, and begin to trust God in a new way. But quite often, we return to our previous state because we are hesitant and fearful of making true adjustments to our lifestyles, our attitudes, and our goals. Maybe we *could* be capable of abandoning our nets to follow Jesus, but we usually need more time than Simon and Andrew. So, the church gives us the opportunity to watch and see and listen to the life of Jesus over and over again.

The prophet Jonah is the perfect example of someone hearing God say the same thing more than once. The first time, Jonah runs from God's request and calamitous things happen to him. With some humor, the scripture passage then states, "The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time" (3:1). God gave Jonah another chance. Jonah responds and shares God's message with the citizens of Nineveh. If you read through to the end of the story, you realize that even then, Jonah (the recipient of a second chance from God) comes up short, pouting and complaining about God's mercy. God continues to teach Jonah through his self-centered tantrum. We never hear what happened to Jonah, but the story shows us much about God's forbearance.

Likewise, we know that the quick response of the disciples to Jesus portrayed in today's Gospel does not equate to whole-hearted acceptance. They all leave Jesus when he needs them most. The disciples "heard" him call, but they did not "receive" that call at the deepest level. They were not yet willing to align themselves with Him. That would come later after much more time spent reflecting on the meaning of Jesus' life.

During this Liturgical Year, we will listen to familiar stories about the life of Jesus. Let us not overlook their meaning, as if we already know the story, for very few of us have allowed these words to make a home in our hearts. But we *are* given chance after chance to do so. Perhaps the best new year's resolution we could have this year is to give greater attention to the Sunday scriptures. What if we approach each Sunday with the expectation that God has a personal word for each of one of us? If we set out to really listen, what would we hear? And if we really heard God speak to us, what would we do?

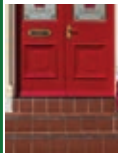

### Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

St. Mark, in giving us this scene for meditation as the Holy Spirit’s spokesman, hits upon the secret of every good salesperson as well. For it seems to me that such people are actually selling a dream. One they passionately believe in. My own dear Dad spent the bulk of his working years selling life insurance. In this case, the “dream” is guaranteed security and strong protection against the twin nightmares of uncertainty and fear. But all salespeople offer a product that will not only preclude disaster but also bring a strong dose of hope and optimism.

Our Lord Jesus could also be called “the World’s Greatest Salesman.” He has all the good qualities of a person who believes in what they’re selling, so to speak, and none of the dark characteristics often attributed to salespeople. His “product” of course is “the Kingdom of God.” He tells us it is nearer than we think. In the process He was actually selling Himself as the perfect actualization of that kingdom. He made His hearers understand that this kingdom is such that positivity is the law of the land and undying love is its hallmark. In other words, He was “selling” God back to those who had abandoned Him. How good He was at His work shows in the way even His first listeners were so quickly able to leave behind much of their old life and walk with Him.

Some of the actors who have played Jesus in Hollywood films have managed for me to capture His charm to a satisfying degree. It may be that as a confirmed romantic I fell for their portrayals too easily. But I watched through the lens of a committed believer in Jesus, and one who has his own ideas of how to play Jesus. However, the Bible tells me not just to play the role but live it. But no matter our nature or temperament, we are all “hard wired” to be attracted by truth and the obvious conviction of an authentic truth teller. We “buy into” their wares with ease. Is it any wonder that Simon and Andrew, James and John dropped their fishing nets to follow the Divine Troubadour? And aren’t you glad that you did too? What we have gained from this magnetism of the Master is the joy of having Someone to believe in. That cannot be taken away from us by anyone, especially the one “evil salesman” who was formerly an archangel. That’s why it’s best for us to remember: “*You are writing a Gospel, a chapter each day, By deeds that you do, by words that you say. People read what you write, whether faithless or true. Say! What is that gospel, according to YOU?*”

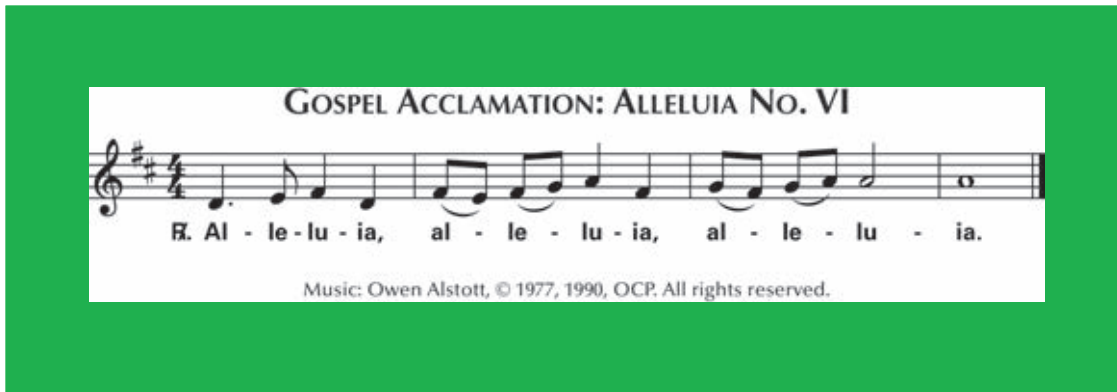

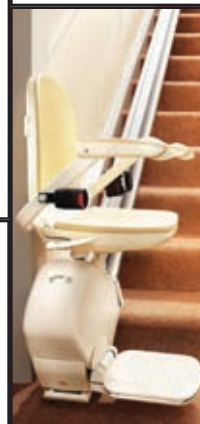
