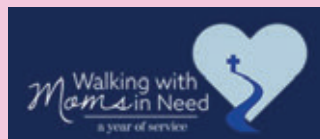
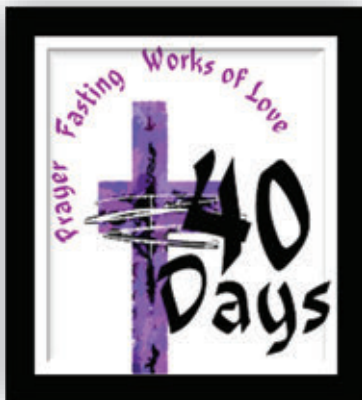

Father Yvans' Installation as Pastor: February 7, 2021



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I was so amazed with the warm applause you gave me in welcoming me as your new pastor. I feel blessed to be among you to serve your spiritual needs, to pray with you and worship the Lord with you within this community.



Last year, along with the parish council, we were working on a six-year pastoral plan, but then Covid-19 came, everything was in turmoil, and we did not have a chance to finish that plan. Now I think it is time for our parish council to continue with our pastoral plan to help all of us to live the parish mission statement, *"We are the welcoming community of Saint Teresa of Calcutta living our faith by endeavoring to follow her example to see, share and be the light of Christ's love and compassion."*

Again, I thank you all for welcoming me here to work with you and be your pastor. I ask you please to keep me in your fervent prayers, as I will do the same for you every day.

LENT: During the Lenten season, we have several spiritual activities that we as a parish came up with to help increase our prayer life and connect with the Lord. The members of Missionary Disciples group are leading a faith-sharing group that I encourage you to sign up for. I also encourage you to put your mask on and come back to church for mass. I know some of you do not feel comfortable right now. However, we cannot let the Covid-19 take our community away when we can use practical measures and precautions to be safe.

Our Church community is very important. I know some of you continue to support our church even though you do not attend mass but most importantly, I am more concerned about you not being with us and not being served because of the pandemic situation that we are in. I want you to know even though you do not attend mass right now, your presence is valuable in the community, and I want you to know you are greatly missed. We are now in the second phase of our reopening. I would love to see us reach the capacity of our church every Sunday so we can open another mass. We need you, your family and your friends back with us.

During this Lenten Season, we will start Morning Prayer every day before mass. Instruction and a little story will be given so I can explain the beauty of this communal prayer.

Every Thursday night during Lent, we will have Liturgy of the Hours (evening prayer) on Facebook and YouTube so that everyone can participate with us. Every Wednesday night two priests will be available for confession. One will be at Saint John, and another one will be at Holy Saviour Church in Westmont. I want to create many ways for Saint Teresa parishioners to have a good spiritual preparation for Easter.

This year we will not have a communal Lenten service, yet I want to encourage everyone to go to confession frequently, at least once a week. As I said, I will bring another priest in for confession every Wednesday in case you do not want to use your parish priest. We will still have confession on Saturday at 3 pm at Holy Saviour Church.

Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday night at 7 p.m. based on our Lenten theme: "Let's get back on the road to a deeper, and a reflection will be given on the theme. I encourage you to join with us.

I will start preparing for the second Annual Mother's Day Concert, which is to be held on May 9. Location to be determined.

Thank you, everyone, for all your support and prayers.

Days of Fast

Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are bound to the mandate to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting entails eating one "normal" meal and two smaller meals.

Days of Abstinence

Catholics ages 14 and up are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays during Lent.

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into

heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

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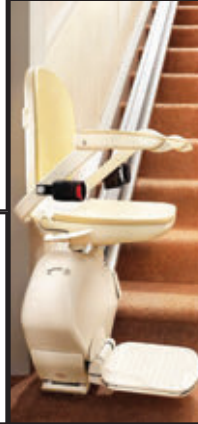
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
