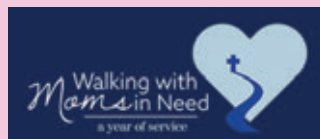
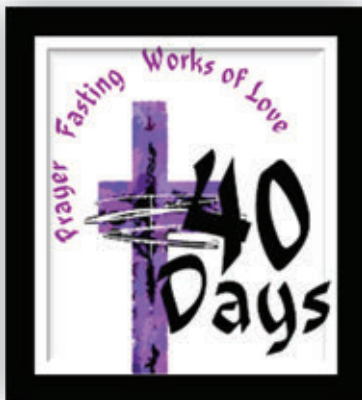

3rd Sunday of Lent: March 7, 2021

It's Personal
Pat Lipperini

In today's first reading, we hear the familiar guidance of the Ten Commandments. At first glance, it does not seem like the most inspiring reading. We all probably memorized the Ten Commandments when we were younger, and they have long formed a moral backdrop for our lives. We take them for granted. They certainly do not seem a springboard for prayer. Rather, we slot them as part and parcel of the intricate weaving of rules and requirements that make up our civic and religious life. And let us acknowledge, that though we know rules in general are essential to the fabric of society, we sometimes chafe at the limits they set. We see this with children and teenagers as their rebellion against restrictions becomes almost a routine rite of passage. Thankfully, most of us grow out of such rebellion and learn to coexist and appreciate rules but sometimes a certain cynicism remains. This is even more common in a religious context. I have heard many people describe religion as "just a bunch of rules." When that happens, we have let the rules obscure the giver of the rules, therefore missing the heart of our faith. Thus, our readings today remind us to look again and marvel, not just at the specific commandments, but at the One who gave these laws.

The history of the Israelites, woven throughout the Hebrew Scriptures, shows that God gave them these laws. Although we call them Commandments, the Hebrew word they used, Torah, is better translated as instruction. Think of the change in meaning when we go from "law" or "rule" to "instruction". We can all appreciate where instructions lead us. We learn, we get greater clarity, we find the right way to do something, the correct sequence to put something together, the best path to our destination. For the Israelites, there was no sense of these "instructions" as being unreasonable or a burden. Thus, the Torah inspired gratitude. It was the great gift of God which enabled the Jews to know God's will. Knowing God's will and following God's will would bring them SHALOM: completeness, wholeness, fullness and maturity. Torah would bring them to life's flourishing.

We see many instances of this profound gratitude for God's instructions in Sacred Scripture. The book of Deuteronomy 4:7-8 notes, "For what nation is great enough to have a god as near to them as the LORD our God is to us whenever we call on Him? And what nation is great enough to have righteous statutes and ordinances like this entire law I set before you today?" Today's psalm is a beautiful song of gratitude for God's laws and guidance. We hear that God's laws are "perfect," "refreshing," "trustworthy," "right," "true," "just." "They are more precious than gold, than a heap of purest gold; sweeter also than syrup or honey from the comb."

We can never forget that there is a personal God behind all that we are asked to believe and how we are asked to live. Parents know this instinctively. They want their children to thrive and they would give their lives for their children's well-being. Secondly, parents provide parameters of behavior. But their love always precedes the rules. Perhaps that is why Jesus reacted so strenuously to the noisy commerce and lack of prayerfulness of the Temple in today's Gospel. He saw the sacrificial "system" preceding attention to the personal love of God. Jesus took that very personally.

To remind us of the personal nature of our faith, the Lenten season asks us to give of ourselves in particular ways, unique to our lifestyles. We try to renew our friendship with God in prayer, our connection to our brothers and sisters by giving alms, and our perception of the true needs of human beings by abstaining from what we think is necessary to our happiness. The more we let our faith require something from us personally, the more we will grow in it. And God will help us in this journey. Our well-being and flourishing *are* possible because our religion is based *first* on the personal love of God, not on the rules which flow from God's overriding and far-reaching concern for each of us. And that is truly inspiring.

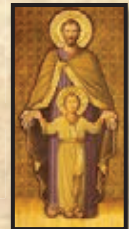

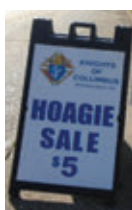

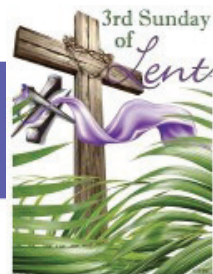

FIRST READING: Exodus 20: 1-17



In those days, God delivered all these commandments:

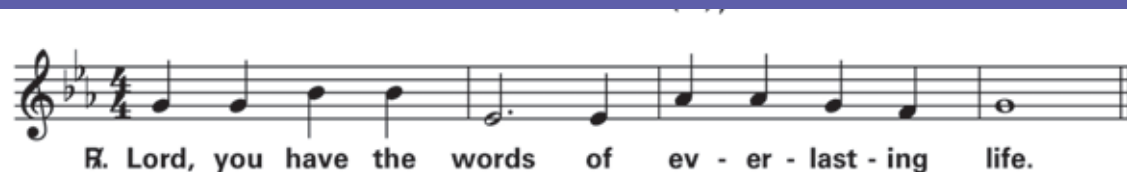
"I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments.

"You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. For the LORD will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain.

"Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the LORD has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy.

"Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you. You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male or female slave, nor his ox or ass, nor anything else that belongs to him."

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SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1: 22-25

Brothers and sisters: Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

R. Praise to you, Lord Je-sus Christ, King of end-less glo-ry!

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GOSPEL: John 2: 13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.



CREED:

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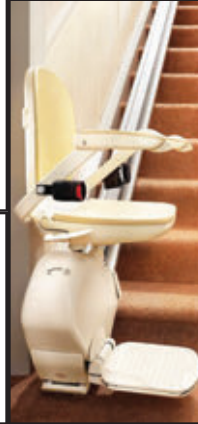
