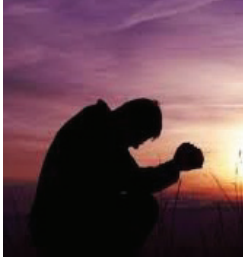

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord: March 28, 2021

An Episcopal priest was preaching in an unfamiliar church on Palm Sunday. As he stood in the pulpit to begin the service, he tapped the microphone to make sure that it was on. He heard nothing, even though the microphone was working fine. So, he leaned closer to the microphone and said to himself; "There is something wrong with this thing." The congregation, being well trained church people immediately responded, "And also with you."

This is Palm or Passion Sunday. Some Christians do not like to use the word "Passion." This word brings only the sad part of the suffering of Christ and sometimes does not open our eyes to the great event of Salvation that it brings. When we talk about the passion of Christ, we only see the images of the crown of thorns, beating, crucifixion, torture, and death.

It is quite clear that we must not minimize the sufferings of Christ; we cannot erase the leading moments of our salvation story. It is impossible not to acknowledge our Christ disfigured. His suffering on the cross is the reason why every Friday during Lent we celebrate the Stations of the Cross. However, to live Holy Week, we must not see it only as a week of trial and suffering. We enter a week that is part of God's plan for us, that Jesus, his only begotten Son, was obedient and accepted His Father's will to express God's love for humanity.

Whether it is at the Last Supper, the Washing of the Feet, the Garden of Olives before He was arrested, the forgiveness of Peter who denied Him three times, or during the dialogue with the good thief ("Dimas" according to tradition but this name is not in the Bible), everything that happens in the life of Jesus that leads to his death was to express self-giving, forgiveness and love for us all. The Cross is no longer the summit of shame and punishment. Rather, it becomes the summit of love for humanity.

With all Christians around the world, today we enter Holy Week. Today we remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. His journey began in Galilee. It is about to end here. Today is the last step. Jesus stops on the Mount of Olives and sends two of his disciples to find him a colt to ride on.

Until now, the Messiah has lived in hiding. But on this day, He wants to take possession of the holy city and the temple. This is how He will reveal the true mission of the new Shepherd of Israel. He does not arrive on a chariot, as the leader of a liberating army would, but on a small donkey. Upon entering the city, He is acclaimed by the crowd. The olive branches spread over Jesus' passage make for Him a triumphal carpet. Full of enthusiasm, the crowd shouts, "Hosanna!"

The same Jesus enters our towns and villages today. He wants to join us at the very heart of our lives. He presents himself to us as the only one who can deliver us from all our painful situations. He alone can make us actors in a more human and united life. His face is not that of a mighty, strong man. It is that of a meek and humble man. A few days later it will be that of a crucified man. The only crown that will be placed on the head of this king will be a crown of thorns. In the eyes of so many, His death will be considered a defeat. But for us it is a victory, the victory of love over sin.

We will go home today with a blessed branch. This branch will remind us that we sang, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Seized by the anguish of death, He wants His people to remain with Him under the olive trees of Gethsemane. It is the same call he makes to us today. So yes, may this branch we take into our homes be the sign of our commitment to the Lord.

Throughout this Holy Week, we are invited to dive into prayer with Him. By celebrating this Eucharist, we receive all the fruits of Jesus' Passion. He gives us not only His Body and His Blood but also His union with the Father.

May God's blessings continue to be with you and shine His light upon you for a blessed Easter.

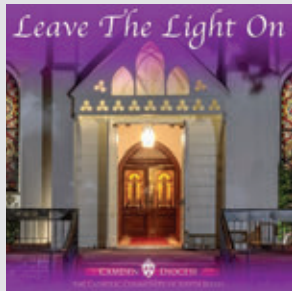
Parish Prayer Intention for the Week of March 28—April 3

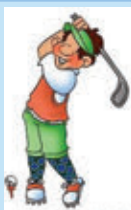

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Scholars of the Scriptures warn us not to be taken in by Hollywood recreations of the Passion events in terms of crowd size. The streets of old Jerusalem, which I have been privileged to walk, were narrow to the point that we might call them “alleys.” The procession of Our Lord that wound up and down them on the way to Calvary would hardly have to attract many people to be called “a crowd.” This not to ignore the real crowds that had followed Him during the years of His missionary days. We twenty-first century followers of Christ, who follow in His path know that crowd size hardly matters. We know enough about Jesus to build our lives upon Him. We number in the billions. No matter the number of times we hear Mark’s gospel, it never loses its punch and power.

Some years ago there was a popular song derived from a movie with the vapid lyric: “Love means never having to say ‘I’m sorry.’” What an empty definition when placed against the scenes of Our Lord’s final hours! He shows us more than what love looks like. He shows us love. St. John went further when he wrote “God is love.” Good Friday preachers struggle to say something new about its implications and are often bereft of the right words. All they can really do is stare in shock at what human hate can produce against its target and remind us of God showing us what love can do for the beloved. We are the beloved in this case, and our often shameful indifference is embarrassing to say the least. All this becomes personal when we realize that our sins had a part to play in this unique tragedy. Our ugly response to God at times is what held the whips that lacerated His back. Our gross ingratitude hammered the nails into His hands and feet. Our vulgar voices did the shouting at Him. Our vincible ignorance spat at Him. Somehow we push all that aside when we willfully sin. In the end, the size of the original group of onlookers that witnessed all this doesn’t matter. That His Mother Mary was among them causes that ache in our throats that leads to tears. That His aunts and the youngest Apostle were there, gives our side a tiny morale boost. But the absence of the other Eleven shames us. But we really must admit that “we were there when they crucified Our Lord.” Only His divine mercy makes us eligible for pardon.

So, as we begin Holy Week 2021, the call goes out to be a people who pause to think and remember why all these mostly ugly events happened. And if we need words, we have those of our great St. Francis of Assisi: “We adore you O Christ and we bless You, because by Your holy Cross You have redeemed the world.”

GOSPEL READING: Mark 11: 1-10

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no

one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you, ‘Why are you doing this?’ reply, ‘The Master has need of it and will send it back here at once.’” So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. 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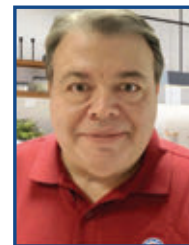
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
