Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord: April 4, 2021

I want to wish you all a blessed Easter Season. During these past 40 days we have been together on so many occasions to prepare for this Feast, one of the most important days in our Christian Faith. I believe that if the Church invites us to celebrate the feast of Easter every year, it is not to just commemorate a past event but to begin life anew with the resurrected Jesus.

Contrary to last year, we have the blessing to celebrate one of the most fundamental events in the story of our church. Easter is the feast of life, of spring, of renewal, of joy. The feast of Easter opens a whole new perspective on life and death. Therefore, we cannot limit ourselves to recognizing that Jesus is alive in our lives. We are called to attest that he is alive.

When we visit a cemetery, we meet all kinds of headstones with inscriptions of great sadness: "Farewell. This is the end of our love", "We will never see each other again", "Our friendship ends with death ..." On the other hand, on the Christian tombs of the catacombs we find inscriptions full of hope: "We will see each other again soon", "You are alive in the Lord," " You are going to our God," " Peace be with you!" There are those who believe that death is the end of everything. However, through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have the experience that death is a passage to a different life, and this gives meaning not only to death but also to what we experience every day. Christian poets have used all kinds of images to illustrate this kind of new life: a child who leaves his mother's womb to "come into the world", a caterpillar that becomes a butterfly, a seed of wheat that seems to rot in the soil and die before it becomes a new plant.

After a night that represents the power of death and darkness, we find ourselves early in the morning, when the light of life shines in our world again. "The first day of the week," the gospel says, and it reminds us of the first verses of the Bible when God illuminated the world to create the first day.

What distinguishes Christians from unbelievers is the resurrection, faith and trust in a God who is life and who does not accept that everything ends on earth. The resurrection is the response of God the Father to the violence, to the injustice of torture and the cross. "Why are you looking for the living one among the dead?" (Luke 24: 5).

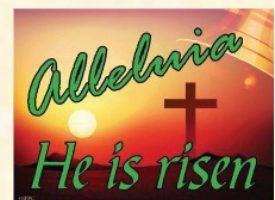
Jesus leaving the tomb reminds us that our life does not end here. Easter continues to inspire us to take our Christian life seriously. Christ invites us to live fully from now on, to come out of our graves, our discouragement, and our fears. "Come out of your graves, out of your hopeless lives. Start another breath of air. I have come that you may have life and have it abundantly". (John 10: 10)

After the Last Supper, on His way to the Mount of Olives, Jesus said to his disciples: "When I am risen, I will go before you into Galilee." It is this same invitation that Jesus gives to women after the resurrection: "Go and tell my brothers that they are to go to Galilee: it is there that they will see me." They are invited to return to their place of origin, to their families, their boats, and their nets to preach, to teach, and bless others with the good news of resurrection.

The Risen Christ gives us the courage to return to our families, to our work environment, to experience the spring of God there. He is here on this first day of the week, on this day of the Lord's Resurrection to bless people with the Good News. He is risen!

Happy Easter to all of you. May the risen Christ bless you and your family.
"The Lord is risen, alleluia, alleluia."

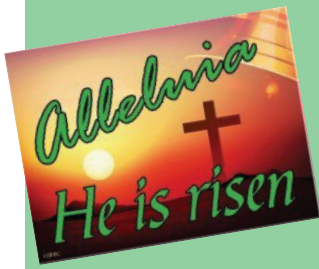
SECOND READING: Colossians 3: 1-4

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GOSPEL: On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

CREED:

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
