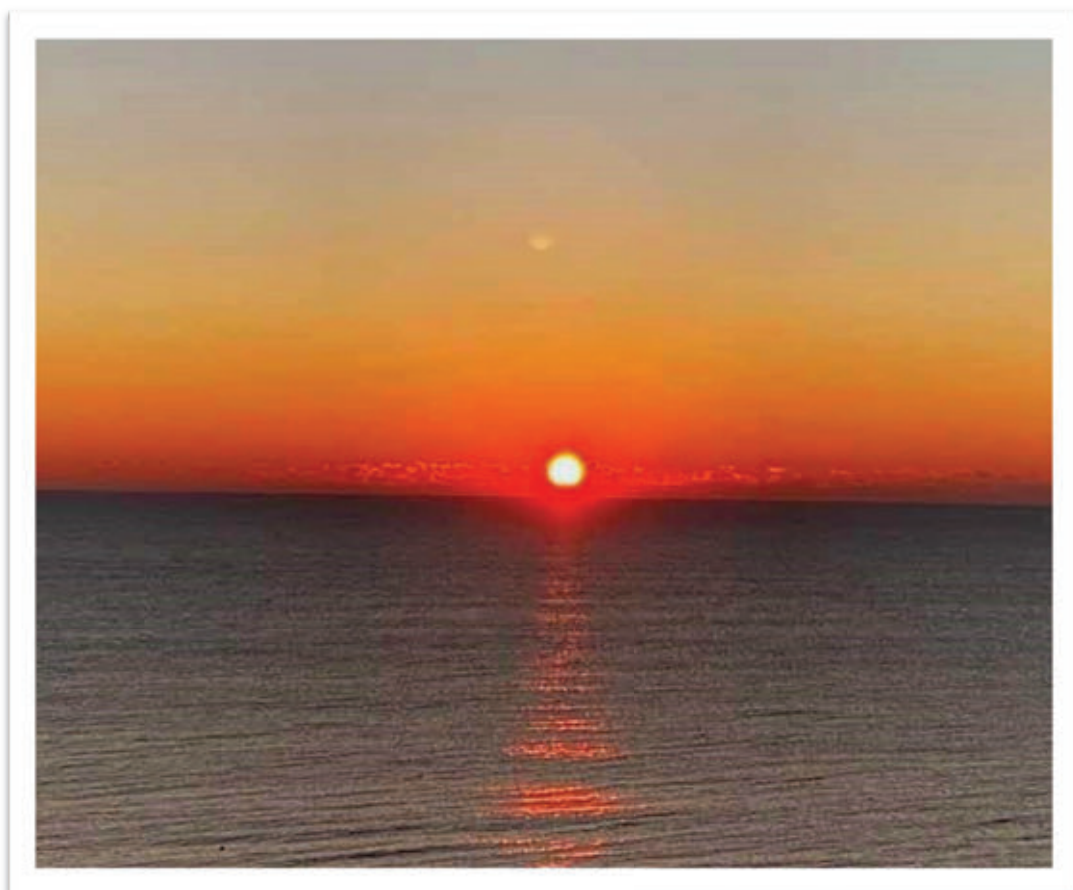

Divine Mercy Sunday

In today's Gospel we hear about Thomas, and I think we can all relate to Thomas. The disciples were all together in a house with the doors locked because they were in fear of the Jews after the crucifixion of Jesus. They obviously thought they were next, but where was Thomas? In a time like this, I would want to be with my friends. I would not want to be out alone knowing so many people may want to kill me.

Was he thinking of giving up this part of his life and moving on? I do not know. Maybe he was purposely avoiding the other disciples. Again, I do not know. But regardless, the disciples eventually found him and told him the news. I assume Thomas was praying in his heart that the story was true and that Jesus was alive. He must have because this was a week later. If he really believed that Jesus was dead, why would he have hung around?

This is Divine Mercy Sunday and what Jesus showed to Thomas was just that. He knew how much he was hurting and made it known to Him that the stories were true. He was more than still alive; He had defeated death. And for us we are blessed all the more. We did not get to witness anything like this, but we still believe. But just like God sent prophets in the Old Testament, Jesus does something even more important for us.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, the feast day of a little Polish nun, Sister Maria Faustina Kowalski. She was from a large family, one of ten children, on a small, poor farm in Poland. She received only a few years of education. Jesus appeared to her many times from a very young age. She literally talked to Him.

She entered a convent as soon as she could and received no additional education. She did the menial jobs: the kitchen, garden, answering the door. But these appearances continued so she was told by her spiritual director to keep a diary. And she did. Today you can get this at any religious store, but beware. It's huge- about 700 pages.

We may not get to physically see Jesus but we have the witnesses in the Bible and in the stories of countless saints that He is real and very much alive. This diary is full of the stories of her visitations and conversations with Jesus. It really is unbelievable. To me the diary is a real miracle. It never deviated from Catholic Doctrine, despite her very limited education. It has the seal of approval of Saint John Paul the Second who was responsible for her canonization.

The time when this diary was written is very important because it was the early 1930's in Poland, right before the Nazi Invasion, and the beginning of World War II. Her message spoke of urgency for us to return to Jesus with all of our hearts because a terrible war was coming. She died in 1938, almost one year to the day before the Nazi Invasion into Poland.

At the command of Jesus, she was instructed to have painted the famous picture of the Divine Mercy. This is the picture of Jesus with the white and red rays coming from the wound on His side that Thomas had to touch. The words at the bottom, 'Jesus I trust in You.'

Saving the most important part of this Gospel for the very end - what did Jesus say to the apostles when He appeared to them the first time? "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven". I bet Jesus probably repeated this his second time around when Thomas was there.

This is the message of the Gospel - forgiveness. It is a power we all have, not just the apostles and it is our salvation. We are directly responsible for each other's salvation. How we forgive others is how Jesus will forgive us. Jesus will show us mercy in just the same way we show others mercy. Jesus is ready to give us Divine Mercy regardless of all the things we may have done.

Exactly what that means I do not know, but I know it is greater than any other gift He has given us. I know it is something we must all do for each other. The key is that the mercy Jesus is ready to show us it beyond measure, more than the mercy he showed to Thomas. For now we must be faithful, kind and forgiving to each other. That is the best we can do. Jesus will take care of the rest. Just remember those words, "Jesus I Trust in You". God Bless.

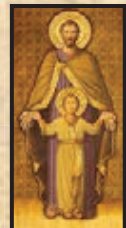
Casserole pans for the Joseph House are available at the back of both churches. They can be dropped off at the Parish Office during office hours.

SECOND READING: 1 John 5: 1-6 Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

CREED:

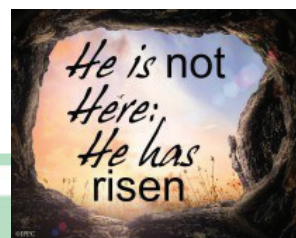
