Our Healthy Vine Pat Lipperini

During the Easter season, we are reminded of the joyful growth of the early church, especially through the various readings from the Acts of the Apostles. I find these readings heartwarming and inspiring because they help me see that the church began with real people trying to do the right thing, trying to figure out what the momentous event of the resurrection meant for their lives. They had no New Testament scriptures at this time. They had no catechism. But they had the Holy Spirit alive in their hearts and they responded to the call to go forth, proclaim the risen Jesus, and live their lives with new purpose.

More than 2000 years later here we are, still trying to do the right thing, still trying to respond to the Good News of the risen Jesus. We of course, have the insight of our Sacred Scriptures and the guidance of our tradition's moral and social teachings. But even more, we have the inspiration of countless men and women who have modeled living for Christ and others in every walk of life and in every moment of history. Some of these are our official saints. Many more we know as just plain "good people," who understood what St. John tells us today: "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." These are the brothers and sisters who encourage me because they put flesh on the gospel. They make it real. They help us all to see that living for others is attractive and doable in our everyday lives.

During this past year, I have been privileged to witness an extraordinary group of men and women living their faith in word, deed, and love: our parish's catechists. These parishioners have just completed a particularly challenging year where the common practices of faith formation, as with so many other aspects of our society, needed to change. I cannot emphasize enough that our catechists are VOLUNTEERS who, out of the goodness of their hearts and their love of God, embraced the challenges inherent in our pandemic world. They studied, worked, and adapted to these new demands. Many of the catechists led remote classes. That is a simple sentence until we understand that this entailed learning from scratch how to invite, how to manage the remote platform, how to facilitate a meaningful lesson, and how to build community with just faces on a screen. Likewise, our in-person catechists were in uncharted territory. Teaching masked children while wearing a mask and respecting the social distance requirements of the classroom were hurdles that needed to be managed. In every class, the catechists cheerfully rose to the occasion. And the children came every week. We think they were smiling, although we couldn't really tell!

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses the image of the branches and vine to emphasize our dependence upon God. It also illustrates our connection with each other. We are intertwined. If we stay healthy and connected, we flourish. If we remove ourselves from our Lord and from each other, we shrivel up and the whole vine suffers. The vine that is St. Teresa of Calcutta has been made stronger this year by the actions of so many good people in many different ministries who heard the words of Jesus: "Remain in me, as I remain in you." Today, let us give thanks for our catechists who remained with the Lord and kept our program steady.

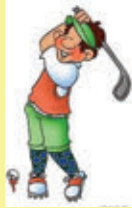
New Adoration Schedule

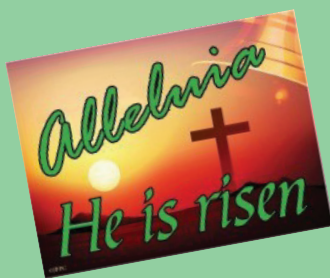

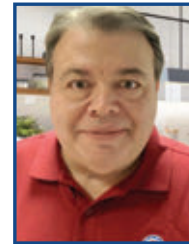

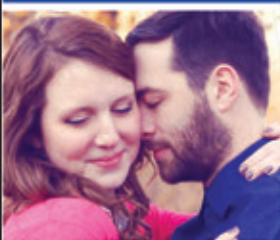
