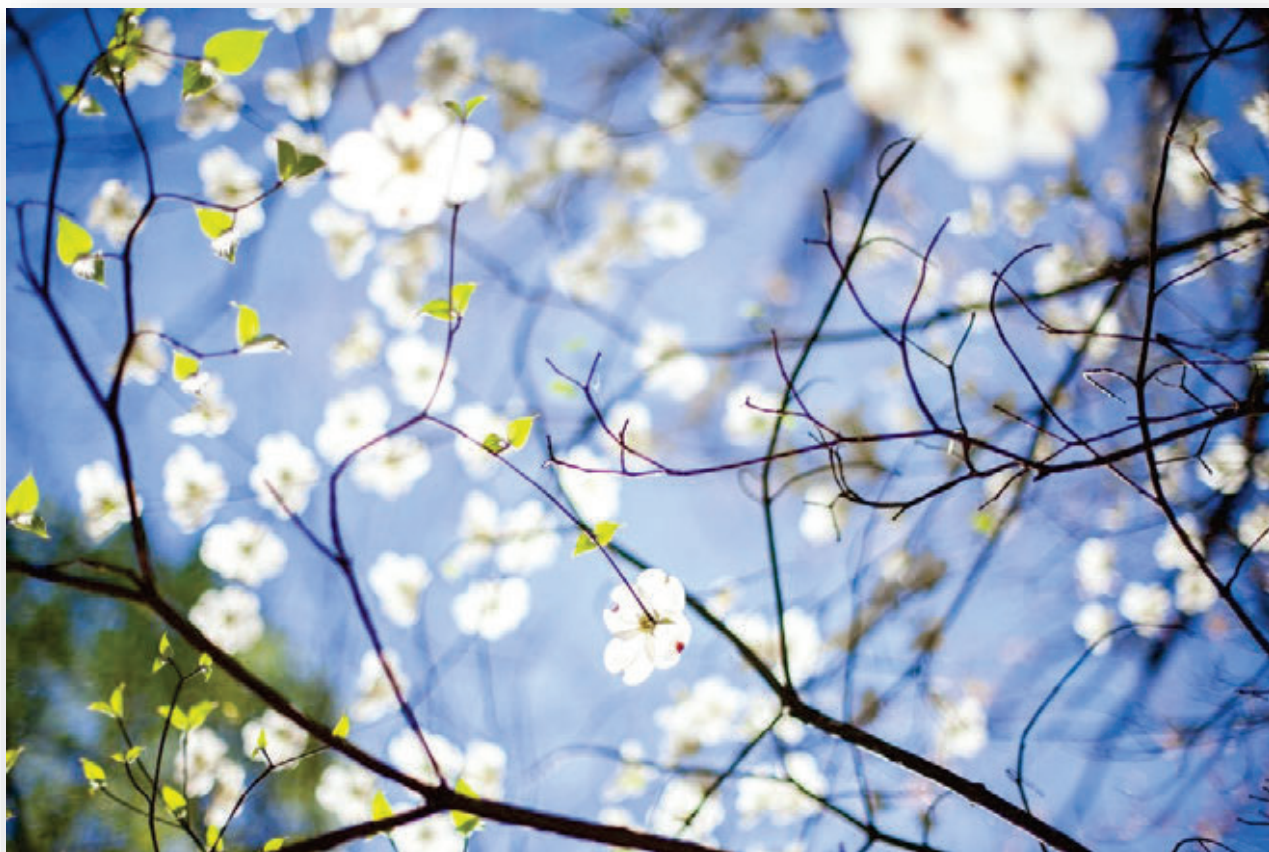

Sixth Sunday of Easter: May 9, 2021



In today's Gospel Jesus says something absolutely wonderful but at the same time very challenging. He tells us that we did not choose Him, but rather He chose us. He tells us this and at the same time reinforces what He has told us so many times, the most important commandment of all, love one another.

The challenge of this Gospel is asking, "What Jesus chose me to do?" Just as God chose Mary to be the mother of Jesus and Joseph to be his father. Just as God chose Moses to lead His people out of slavery. Just as God chose St. Paul, a man who started out persecuting Christians and later became a founding Father of the Faith. He has a specific purpose for us also.

I believe God calls us no differently than he called any of those people. When you consider each of those people, you find they were called to do totally different things: a mother, a father, a liberator, and a defender of the faith. I believe very much that as a people we form one body with many different parts, all important in their own way.

Whatever it is, He will provide for us, lead us and protect us in all that we do. God has given us all brains that do so much more than just store knowledge. We can figure things out. He has given us hearts that love, and I feel this is where God reaches us. The mind and the heart - together these are what we pray with. Prayer is more than just reciting prayers; it is figuring out what God has chosen us to do and staying on track. When the heart loves something, the brain has to figure out how to get it. Prayer for me, is quiet meditation, reflecting on how to use the skills God gave me to help people. Some figure it out very young; some ponder all their lives on what that really means. But, here is the connection between God choosing us and the commandment of love one another.

If we follow that simple commandment, love one another, we are already doing what God wants us to do. If we can do this and we love what we do, God will bend for us, because he loves us that much. He will bless us and guide us in the direction we need to be going. Trust in God all the while and we are doing what God has chosen us to do.

Pray on it. Reflect on your family. When it comes down to it, family should be where we learn what love truly means. All those mothers out there, you love your sons and daughters. All of us children should love our parents. All brothers and sisters should love one another. I believe there is a relationship between the love we have as family and what God has chosen us to be.

Now that Lent is over, I have been doing many baptisms. This is where many of our journeys start. My daughter's Baptism inspired me to become a Deacon. At a baptism, the baby is being baptized but the real Sacrament is the grace it instills in the hearts of the baby's family.

Baptism is a covenant we make in our hearts just like the covenant God made with Abraham. Just as he did for Abraham, God will do great things for us, but He requires one thing from us, and that is trust. With trust, sometimes logic and reason go right out the window. When I think about just how far out the window, I think of when God told Abraham to offer his son as a sacrifice. Can we ever trust this much?

So let us reflect on this. God chose us for something, and it is different for each of us. If we believe in Him and keep His commandment, we are already doing what He wants. If we are doing what we love, it might just be that simple. This is what God has chosen us to do.

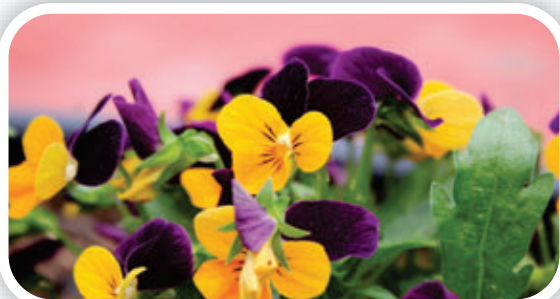

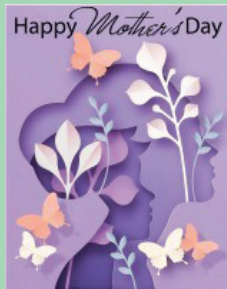

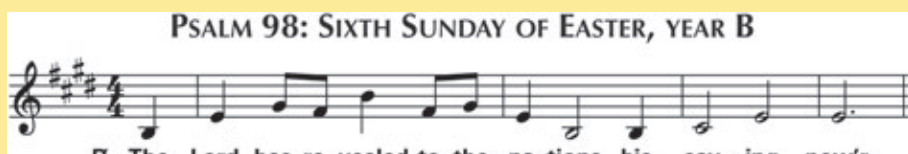
FIRST READING: Acts 10: 25-26, 34-35,44-48

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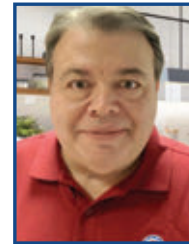
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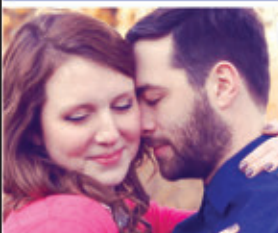
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
