Pentecost Sunday: May 23, 2021

Last year around this time was a horrible time for the world. We have known and experienced the worst in our lives. We were living one day at a time and did not know exactly what tomorrow was going to bring. A year later we are still fighting to get out of this pandemic. However, we need brothers and sisters to be aware of the situation in the world. We all need to make an effort to use the tools that we have to help the world get better and stronger.

Last year around this time, we were approaching 100 days since our confinement began. Our churches were closed, and it was not possible for us Christians to gather in our worship places to pray together. We were so isolated from each other; we almost became strangers. This pandemic is teaching us how to take our spiritual life seriously. It allowed us to spend a Pentecost Sunday as the first Christians and the Apostles did. After the resurrection they were hiding to pray for fear of the Jews. Jesus, who is a promise-keeper, knew their situation. He knew they were in trouble. He knew he was going to intercede by sending them the advocate, the comfort, the Spirit.

Like the frightened disciples, we were physically troubled but spiritually grounded in our faith. Even though we could not gather to worship, we knew that within each house we had a church. This pandemic came to rekindle in our world the need for our savior Jesus Christ. This pandemic allowed families to be connected and the domestic church to be truly alive.

When approaching God, most of us run away, not wanting to believe that His tenderness brings healing, that His Spirit transforms. However, the certainty of the Holy Spirit has brought hope to all of us. This is how the Holy Spirit works powerfully to transform human lives! For those who want to see it, it is obvious. This same force is also there in the daily routine of our lives.

Let us continue to value the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives so we can continue to increase our spiritual life and our connection with our Lord Jesus. We have the tools in our hands to become effective Christians. We just have to open our hearts to let the Holy Spirit work in us and with us to develop a more religious and spiritual life in our Church and in our prayer life.

Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love. Let us repeat Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer, "Come Holy Spirit."

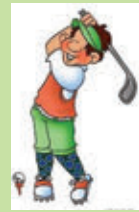

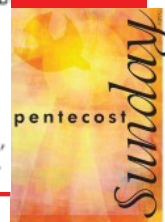

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.
