Trinity Sunday: May 30, 2021



Trinity Sunday brings us radically back to the mystery of God. Does God have a name? Even the Bible affirms that the name by which God reveals himself to humanity is Yahweh (I am who I am). But we still find traces of other names like EL, or Elohim which is a plural. And then there are the other gods of the neighboring nations, the Baals, the gods of Canaan, the gods of Egypt, the gods of Babylon and Nineveh.

In popular language, we speak of God, of the good Lord. God is love, says the Gospel of John. The Trinity is God in three persons. Understand that this does not mean that there are three gods at all. Also remember that the word "Trinity" is not found in the Bible. This term is used to describe the Triune God: one God in three persons who coexist and are co-eternal. Most importantly, the concept expressed by this word is present in the Scriptures. This is what the Word of God says about the Trinity.

The Holy Spirit is the instrument by which the Father performs the following works: the creation and maintenance of the universe (Genesis 1.2, Job 26.13, Psalms 104.30), divine revelation (John 16.12-15, Ephesians 3.5, 2 Peter 1.21), (John 3.6, Titus 3.5, 1 Peter 1.2) and the work of Jesus (Isaiah 61.1, Acts 10.38) So the Father does all these things by the power of the Holy Spirit.

There are many attempts to illustrate the Trinity, but none of these popular images exactly match. The egg and apple comparisons are flawed in that the shell, white and yolk are parts of the egg, not the egg itself, as well as with the skin, the heart and apple seeds. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are not parts of God: each of them is God.

The image of water is somewhat better, but also fails to adequately describe the Trinity. Liquid, vapor, and ice are states of water. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are not a state of God: each of them is God. So, while these images can give us an idea of the Trinity, they do not match perfectly. An infinite God cannot be fully described by a finite image.

The doctrine of the Trinity has caused many divisions in the Christian Churches throughout history. While the essential aspects of the Trinity are clearly presented in the Word of God, some secondary aspects are not so explicit. The Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God, but there is only one God. This is the biblical doctrine of the Trinity. Everything else is uncertain and futile. Instead of focusing on a limited human definition of the Trinity, it is more important to focus on the greatness and infinitely higher nature of God. "How deep are the riches, wisdom and knowledge of God! How infinite are his judgments and his compassion! For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?" (Romans 11.33-34)

Brothers and Sisters, as we celebrate this Trinity Sunday, the feast of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, let us ask the Father, who is the Creator, the Son who is the Savior, and the Holy Spirit, who is the Sanctifier, to bless us and open the Heart of Humanity to receive blessings from on High.

Dispensation Removed

Due to the observance of public safety protocols and the availability of vaccines, the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey are lifting the **dispensation** of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation **beginning on Saturday, June 5 and Sunday, June 6**. They welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist.

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. Fr. Yvans should be consulted if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass.

Safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remain in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office.

Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School).

Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7th

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

Possible Remote sessions (grades 1-7 weekly). We will offer these if there is enough interest and if we have catechists for the grades. In addition to completing weekly assignments, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events between October-May. If registering for Remote, please indicate an alternate preference.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00.

Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 4: 32-34,39-40

Was it ever heard of? Did a people ever hear the voice of God speaking from the midst of fire, as you did, and live? Or did any god ven-

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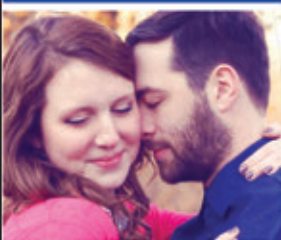


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
