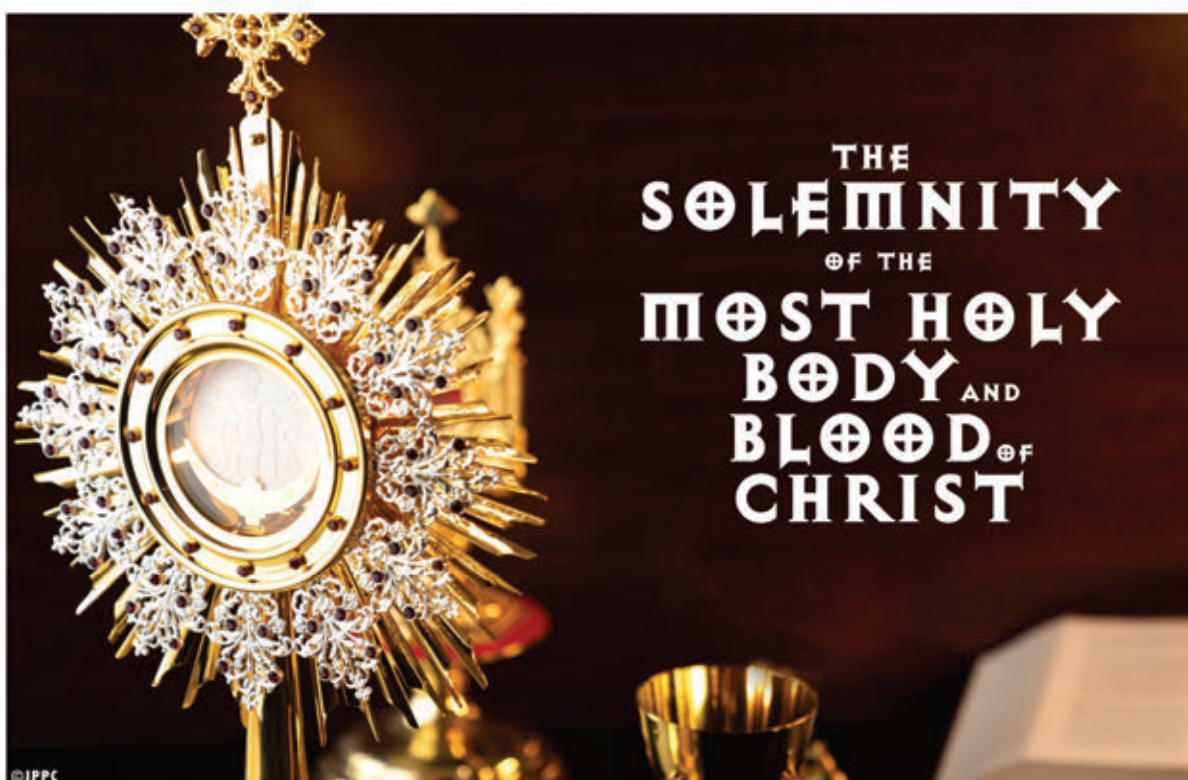

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 6, 2021



This weekend's Readings tell us it is suddenly Holy Thursday again, the night that changed the world. They take us back to the Last Supper just where we left it, without much time to celebrate the miraculous change brought to the bread and wine that had passed around that famous table. Yes we acknowledge the events of this first night of the Triduum, which also featured the washing of feet. But we were collectively conscious of Christ's imminent death coming in a matter of hours the next day. It hardly seemed right to be celebrating anything.

But now, on this side of the Resurrection, it is truly right and just that we give full recognition, honor, and thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us. It is the Church's true and greatest treasure: the Body and Blood of Christ, "Corpus Christi" in the traditional Latin name of today's feast. It is not our real estate, nor the tangible valuables in painted art or sculpture. Not even the Gospels themselves have the first rank. For this sacrament is Christ Himself: Body, blood, soul and divinity.

Simply put, it all began when the real Jesus took real bread and wine and identified Himself with them. With centuries of Church history behind us, concomitant with the development of her doctrine and devotion, more could be said and has been. Saints male and female, together with popes and theologians have had their say, and we can all benefit from them. But the fact remains that we start with the remarkably simple ritual gesture done by a Man who was facing death.

It happened on a night two thousand plus years ago in the upper room of a borrowed house in the city of Jerusalem amid that city's most hectic time of year, the annual Passover. It happened in a world lit only by fire. But the greater fire of mutual love between mankind and God has stayed lit, despite the tempests of war and human folly ever since.

In his new book, *Things Worth Dying For*, Charles J. Chaput, OFM Cap., retired archbishop of Philadelphia, posed questions about the Church to a broad selection of his many friends. To the question "What gives you the most joy about the Church?" A convert, husband, and father answered this way: *"The Eucharist, without question...The Church gives me a home with spiritual peers I never had before and is more of a family than I ever experienced. Most of all, the Church gives us the sacraments, and they've allowed me to encounter Jesus with greater intimacy than I ever knew."* Converts get us to snap out of any stupid stupor that the easy availability of the Eucharist can induce.

Of course, as members of the living Church, present in the world with all her strengths and weaknesses, we have to remember that other meaning of "Corpus Christi", namely that we are also the Body of Christ, with Him as our Head. Mystical yes, but exceedingly real. Immediately we should feel a certain "yoke" on our shoulders, that of living what we believe. When we truly love Christ, that yoke really is easy; that burden really is light. Our task is no more nor less than exhibiting that transparency, which on another level is a fashionable idea these days.

God love you, and give you His peace.

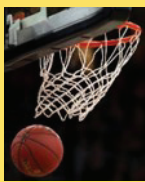

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office.

Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School).

Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7th

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

Possible Remote sessions (grades 1-7 weekly). We will offer these if there is enough interest and if we have catechists for the grades. In addition to completing weekly assignments, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events between October-May. If registering for Remote, please indicate an alternate preference.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00.

Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

SECOND READING: Hebrews 9: 11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet

you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

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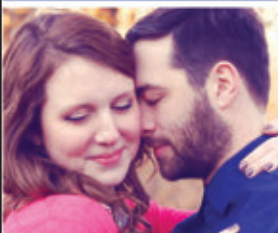
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
