## Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: June 13, 2021



In today's Gospel Jesus gives the example of what the Kingdom of Heaven can be likened to; a sower spreading seed in a field. He knows what will happen to the seed when it is placed in the ground, but has no idea how or why it grows. He just knows that if He plants them at certain times of the year, they grow plentiful and food can be harvested. Jesus explains that the Kingdom of God is just like that.

The sower, Jesus, plants His Word in our heart. If we listen to Him we will grow to do many wonderful things. What is God? He is simply Love, and the seed He is sowing is love. When we listen to Jesus we are receiving the Word of God and something happens to us that we cannot explain. If we nurture this Word it will grow in our hearts as wheat grows in the field. Better yet, the power of His word can enable us to grow tremendously, like a large tree.

Today, how a seed grows to a large extent is explainable, but when talking to a friend about this he told me about something I might have learned in high school, but have long since forgotten. In biology there is the concept of tropism when seeds are planted. The root of the plant for some reason will grow down in search of water and the sprout grows up in search of the sun.

How and why this happens we do not know but it does. There are all kinds of strange little things we cannot explain in nature and to me, I think of them as a signature of God. Just as the artist signs the painting, in all natural wonder, God's signature is everywhere.

I see them as blessings. If you ever think there is no God look at the beauty of nature. Better yet, look in the mirror; we are all walking talking marvels. We see, we hear, we speak; your eye alone looking in the mirror is a miracle. We are amazing in countless ways. The world of nature is amazing in just the same way.

The Kingdom of Heaven, Jesus said, is like the seed. I wonder what God has in store for us. It would take me many lifetimes to fully explore only some of the wonders in this world. It seems sad to think we leave here only experiencing a small part of them. To really see we would have to be immortal just like God. This is the world we live in. What wonders lie ahead for us in Heaven?

But to get there, we have to be good; we have to follow His rules. He is the creator, and we are His creations. For me, glory and honor to God is appreciating all the things God allows me to know. He gave us all minds that can think so we can keep learning things. Always learning, constantly figuring out nature's mysteries is the real blessing God gives us.

Keep looking and thinking; Jesus plants His seed in us all the time, and that seed is love. It will grow in our hearts. It will spread as we share it with others and will grow in their hearts as well. Love as small as just a smile can change a person's day, and it is contagious. That little bit of love may change a great many people. So whatever you do, do it with love. You will grow closer to God and you will be leading others to Him also. Evangelizing without talking about God at all and realizing that with just a little bit of faith, as small as a mustard seed, we can move mountains.

### RCIA

### Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office. Families can register for the following models:

#### *For Grades K through 7*

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7<sup>th</sup>.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7<sup>th</sup>

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

**Possible** Remote sessions (grades 1-7 weekly). We will offer these if there is enough interest and if we have catechists for the grades. In addition to completing weekly assignments, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events between October-May. If registering for Remote, please indicate an alternate preference.

#### *For 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (2<sup>nd</sup> year Confirmation Prep)*

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

**Please note: Children registering for 2<sup>nd</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.**

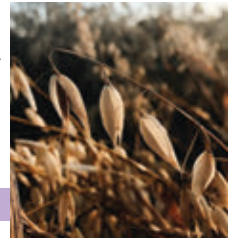

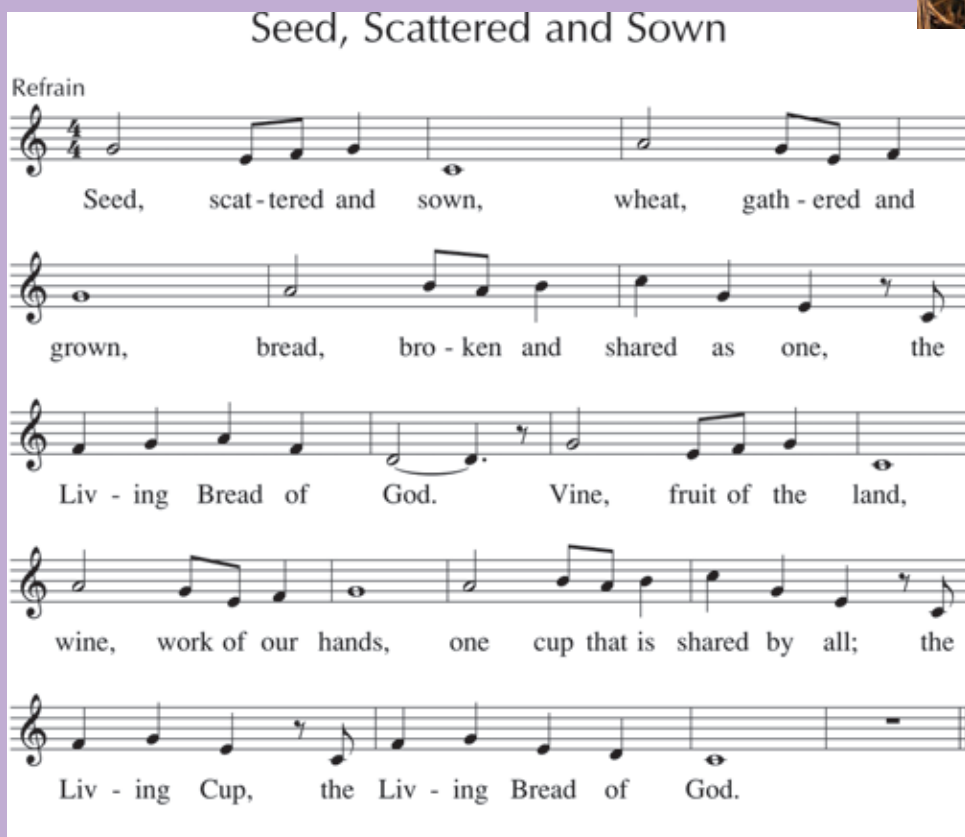

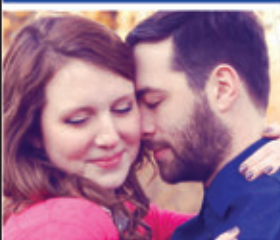
