No Limits

It's the 4th of July and we are entering into full-on summer mode. Admittedly, that will look different for each one of us, but I am certain there will be one commonality—we will spend time (in person) with people we have not seen in a long while. I just saw one of my brothers for the first time in over a year and a half. As we caught up with each other, talking of family, sports, politics, religion, I was newly appreciative of life's dynamic. We all grow and change. We think new thoughts, glimpse new possibilities. We turn corners and move in new directions. None of us are stagnant, though we may have felt stuck during this past year. None of us are identical, though we may have grown up in similar fashion. We still grow within, despite or because of the challenges of age, sickness, financial stress, or anxieties.

Today's Gospel portrays a painful experience of rejection as Jesus returns to his hometown of Nazareth. Prior to his return, Jesus moved around Galilee, gathering disciples, healing physical and psychological ailments, and teaching about the kingdom of God. Surely, his reputation must have preceded him. But his fellow townspeople quickly judge him based on their prior knowledge and relationship with him. They knew Jesus a long time ago. His "wisdom" and "mighty deeds" could not overcome their prior impressions. "Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary...and they took offense at him." Their rigid opinion of Jesus limited his effectiveness and "he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith."

We have often been encouraged to pray for the gift of imagination. This does not mean living in some fantasy world with dragons and magic wands. It means living in our real world and being open to surprise, innovation, and course correction. It means living as if we believe in the power of the Holy Spirit to renew and recreate the face of the earth. It means expecting diversity of thought and action, even with the people we think we know the best. God can do all things. God acts despite and through our inflexible assumptions. But what if those assumptions disappeared? What if the townspeople of Nazareth listened to Jesus, rejoiced at his power, responded to his teaching? What if they could have imagined this gift from God? What if we truly accepted the changes in others, or at the least, allowed them time to unfold in a healthy manner? What transformation could God accomplish if we trusted in God's invitation to growth?

As we enjoy our gatherings with friends and families this summer, let us acknowledge that we are not the same people we were prior to the pandemic. Societal lockdowns and social distancing requirements did not extinguish growth in ourselves and others. We did not put a "hold" on our evolution as human beings, for God's "imperishable spirit is in all things" (Wis 12:1). Let us listen to each other's stories and musings and be open to God's presence in the ideas and changes we notice. Who are we to limit the work of the Holy Spirit? Why would we take offense at such a gift?

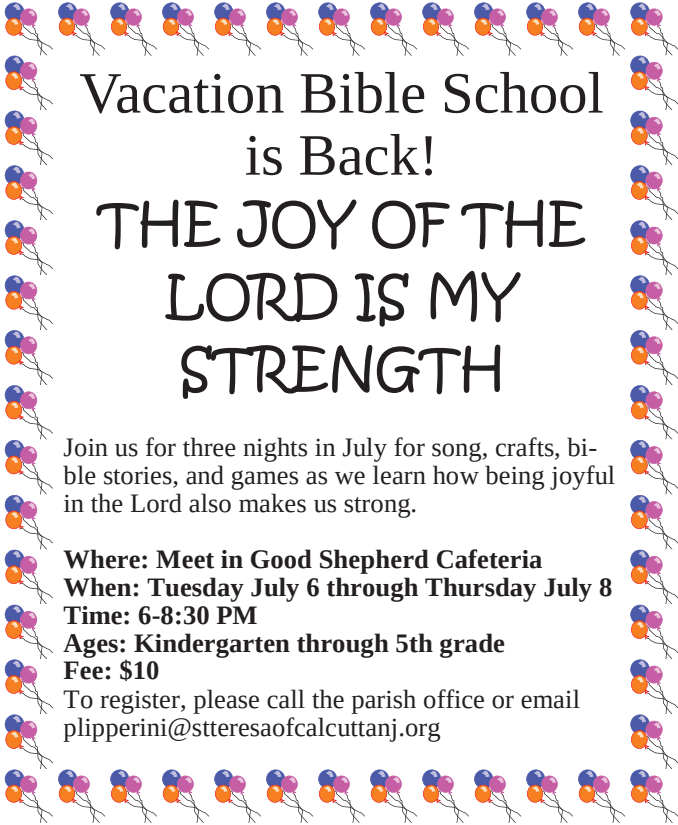

RCIA

Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office. Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7th

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

Possible Remote sessions (grades 1-7 weekly). We will offer these if there is enough interest and if we have catechists for the grades. In addition to completing weekly assignments, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events between October-May. If registering for Remote, please indicate an alternate preference.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

Stewardship Calling

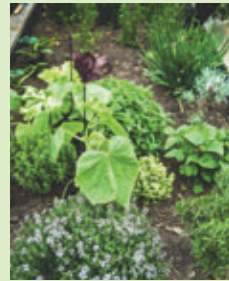
"For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

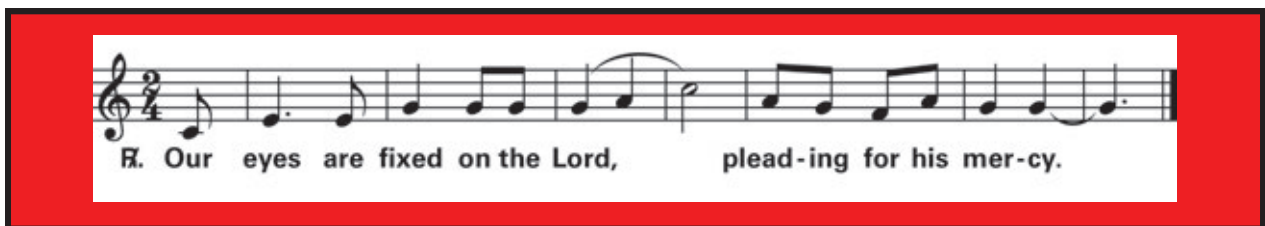

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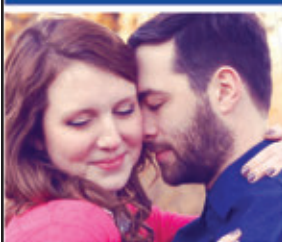
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
