Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: July 11, 2021

This week's reflection is largely based on the first reading which is from the book of Amos. In this story, understanding the world that Amos lived in is important to get the full effect.

Amos was just a simple shepherd in the Southern Kingdom of Judah. He wasn't a prophet, but God had a plan for him. What God called Amos to do in many ways is what He calls us to do, if we are bold enough to take it up. Speak out loudly about injustice, bring people back to the God who loves them, who saved them, and protects them - the God they turned their back on.

At the time of Amos, Israel was in two parts; a northern kingdom, the "Kingdom of Israel" and a southern kingdom, the "Kingdom of Judah" and this lasted about two hundred years. The Southern Kingdom included Jerusalem and the temple that contained the Arc of the Covenant. They were more faithful to Yahweh.

The North was a mess. It was larger, more commercial, and heavily influenced by foreigners. It was very wealthy; times were great, similar to the country we live in today. Think about that! The king, Jeroboam, did not want his people going to Jerusalem in the south to worship. He built his own temples for them in the city of Bethel so they could worship there and not have to go to the south. Bethel had become something like the capital for the Northern Kingdom.

So Amos goes to Bethel which has significance to him and to the Israelites. Bethel was the same place that God told Jacob to go to find a wife. It is also the place that Jacob had the dream about the staircase going to heaven and the angels ascending and descending.

God had made Israel His chosen people centuries ago in the time of Abraham. God does not go back on His Word; He was to be their God. But when the kingdom divided, the north turned their backs on Him. The Lord's temple and priests were still in Jerusalem, but Israel, the kingdom in the north, now worshiped new idols in the city of Bethel and created a new order of priests, all in accordance with their king, Jeroboam.

While God had mercifully given them peace and prosperity for many years under Jeroboam, the northern nation was now abusing its own people. The rich were oppressing the poor. The judges were accepting bribes. God had promised to bless the nation if they obeyed Him and curse them if they rebelled. But God wasn't going to punish Israel without explaining what's going on. This is where Amos the shepherd, goes to Bethel and proclaims God's message of justice, punishment, and restoration. He makes two prophecies. The first is that King Jeroboam will die. The second is that the northern kingdom will fall and they will be led away in slavery. As you can imagine, this message doesn't sit well with Jeroboam or his false priests.

In the first reading we hear of a priest named Amaziah. He was the priest at Bethel who heard what Amos was saying and sent a note telling Jeroboam. He told him that a man from the south had come to town and has been saying some crazy things. He told them he was going to die by the sword and the northern kingdom was going to be conquered and led away in slavery.

The first reading ends with Amaziah telling Amos he was not welcome and to go back to his home in the south. From what I can tell Amos did just that and just like what Jesus told his disciples to do when they were not welcome; shake the dust from their feet and leave. Amos did the same.

Just like Amos, Jesus sent his disciples out to preach repentance. Just as Jesus told his disciples to go without food or money, it seems that Amos did the same. Why did Jesus tell them no food or money? So they would be completely dependent on God, and see firsthand that God will always provide. A powerful lesson only learned when experienced!!!

The greatest lesson I get from Amos is being bold enough to do what God wants and not get scared and back down. Like the Gospel, when Jesus gave his disciples power over demons, it must start from within just like it probably did for Amos! The greatest demon we face is probably the same demon they faced - fear and worry!

Worry is the greatest sin and the biggest demon. It accomplishes nothing and it is good for nothing either!! You cannot change the past, and you cannot control the future. All we have is the present and if we worry we simply waste that time also! When we worry we doubt the power of God! We lose our trust in Him which is something we must never do! When we cast out this demon we are now free to cast out all other demons!

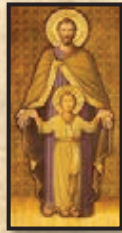

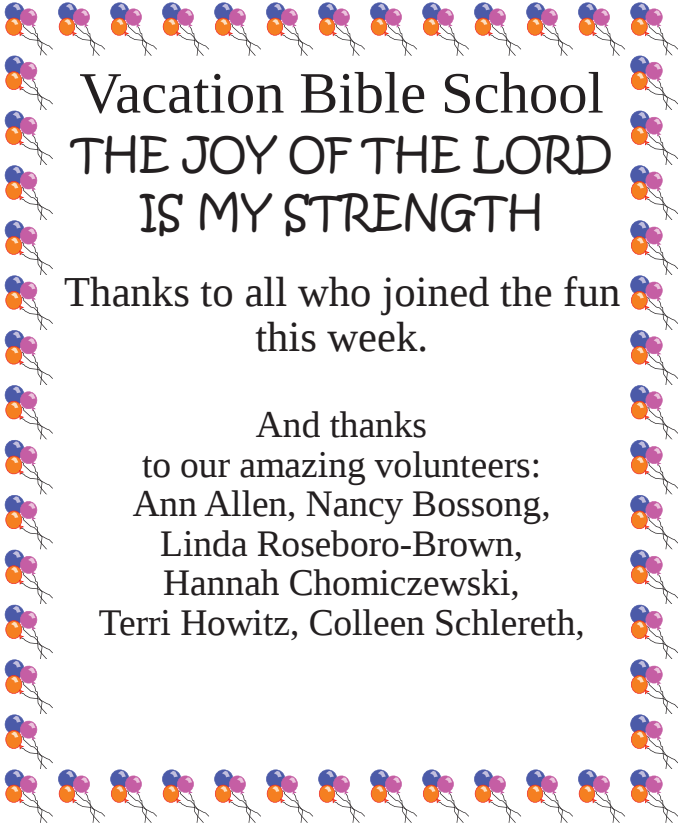

Registration for Faith Formation 2021-22

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office. Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7th

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

Possible Remote sessions (grades 1-7 weekly). We will offer these if there is enough interest and if we have catechists for the grades. In addition to completing weekly assignments, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events between October-May. If registering for Remote, please indicate an alternate preference.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

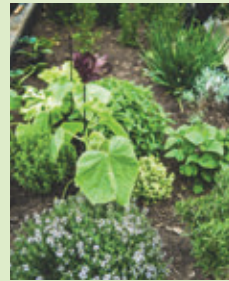
"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack, no money in their belts." MARK 6:8

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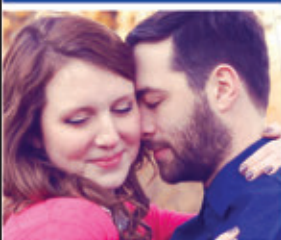


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
