Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Fruitful Reception

I heard a priest recently point out that God is not like a Pez dispenser. We cannot push a button and get what we want. Today's First Reading and Gospel illustrate that truth very well.

In the First Reading, the Israelites complain about their uncomfortable circumstances in the desert, forgetting that slavery in Egypt was a far worse experience. They are hungry and want relief. And God provides. But the Israelites do not get meals delivered to their tents. That would be too easy. They must work each morning to collect the manna for the day's sustenance.

The gospel shows the crowds chasing after Jesus, eager to be near the one who had just multiplied the loaves and fishes. They perceive Jesus as a miracle worker and want *THAT* power in their lives. But Jesus quickly disallows that interpretation of his work: "*Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.*" How quickly Jesus realizes their desire for the easy fix, the effortless connection to him. But that has never been the way of God.

For a few weeks this summer, we hear the "Bread of Life" discourses from chapter six in the Gospel of John where Jesus proclaims "*I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.*" In these beautiful narratives, we hear Jesus explain how God will provide for God's people, not through the momentary miracle the crowds just witnessed, but by an intimate and everlasting nourishment. God becomes bread for us, and we feed upon *THAT* power. This power is not flashy, nor does it provide immediate solutions or swift respite, as does the Pez dispenser, promptly responding to our clicks. Instead, the gift of the Eucharist, our great sustaining Sacrament, asks something of us—to say yes to God making a home in our hearts. Indeed, there is a call and response aspect of the Eucharist. We must be open to absorbing God into our lives. Just like our bodies accept the food that will make it strong and healthy, so we too must not block God's saving action. In other words, we can receive the Eucharist regularly each week, but do we receive the Eucharist faithfully?

As the discourse continues in Chapter 6, we see many of the listeners argue and reject Jesus' teaching, hoping again for something easier or at least, more logical. Later in the gospel we hear, "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." Sadly, this attitude still exists today among the followers of Jesus. A 2019 Pew survey showed that 69% of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the elements of bread and wine but instead see them as symbols of Jesus' body and blood. Perhaps this disbelief would lessen if people did not desire the easy, obvious fix, the sensible solution. Perhaps they need to understand that belief takes work and that the miracle of the Eucharist is ultimately a miracle of love, which has never been simple. Just as the Israelites got up every morning and collected the manna for that day, so we too must put the time in each day to pray and practice our faith. God does not override our senses or our minds, but maybe we can calm them down enough to notice the quiet guest who has been with us all along.

RCIA

Registration is now underway. All families have received emails with details and registration forms. If you need a registration form, please contact the parish office. Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:00-10:30 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-5:00 for grades 1 through 7th

Both sessions will begin with a mass in the school cafeteria. Classroom lessons will follow. All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God.” In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, “What is this?” for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, “This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat.”

For on him the Father, God, has set his seal.” So they said to him, “What can we do to accomplish the works of God?” Jesus answered and said to them, “This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent.” So they said to him, “What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*” So Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.”

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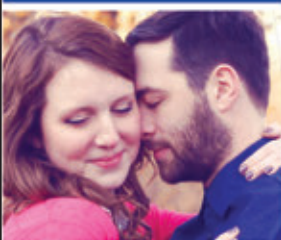


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
