Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: August 8, 2021

In reading the Gospel today, I started to wonder how Jesus felt. He is telling the people in His hometown that He is the bread that has come down from heaven. But their reaction is that of disbelief. They are questioning Him on how this can be; it did not make any sense to them. I can imagine He is troubled as they clearly did not understand. Prior to this, Jesus had fed the multitude with five barley loaves and two fish. Last week, the people were following Jesus because He gave them food and maybe thought He was going to give them more.

Jesus explained to them that He is the bread that has come down from Heaven. They seemed to believe, but I am sure they did not understand. But since they saw all the miracles, maybe He thought He had gotten through to them. From the Gospel, it is clear He did not.

When you connect this Gospel with the first reading, you have to wonder if Jesus might have been thinking that they did not understand; what is the point? Even after showing the people and proving Himself time after time they still did not get it. Did He feel He was wasting His time? The connection with the first reading is only clear if you understand what happened before Elijah was praying for death. He was also thinking even though he was doing the work of God it was just a waste of time.

Elijah was a prophet hundreds of years before Jesus. This is the story of what took place before we find Elijah so depressed he just wanted to die. Elijah was called by God to go before the King of Israel, Ahab, and curse the land with a famine because Ahab and his wife, Jezebel, were practicing idolatry and were poisoning the minds of the people saying this was an acceptable practice. The drought in Samaria had lasted about three years so far and was, as you can expect, very severe. Elijah proved the power of God. He called on the priests of Baal to make a sacrifice to Baal and see if he even responds. They offered a sacrifice and nothing happened, no matter how much they begged.

Elijah did the same thing, and to make it symbolic he went to Mount Carmel and repaired an altar to the Lord that had been long since abandoned. He prepared the sacrifice and poured water on it - lots of water - to make it very clear there were no tricks. He offered the prayer and immediately the sacrifice was completely consumed in flames. Elijah, after showing the power of God, had the priests of Baal rounded up and slaughtered. When the news of this reached Jezebel she was furious and sent notice to Elijah that she would find him and kill him for what he did. Elijah is said to have run away scared of the queen, and this is where the first reading begins. Elijah is praying for death. Why? He just proved the power of God. Why run? It did not make sense, but it happened. God sent an angel to Elijah providing him with food and water so that he could continue his journey. Elijah continued his journey and, from the Gospel, Jesus also obviously continued His journey.

The lesson to be learned here is that when you feel you are fighting a losing battle, even if you did great things but they seem to have made no difference, keep your faith in God. He will provide for you, give you strength, lift your spirits and help you get back up to complete the journey.

As I am writing this I keep thinking of the Olympic gymnast, Simone Biles. The thoughts going through her mind may have been the same as Elijah. She has proven herself not just a champion but blessed with the ability to do remarkable things. I feel that with all the pressure of the Olympics she momentarily lost her rhythm. We all realize her fear of not doing them now because that if she does those flips and is off just the slightest bit, she could be severely injured. If you are not in the proper mindset don't even think about doing them.

I imagine she probably felt as depressed as Elijah and maybe even as depressed as Jesus. What is the point? I can no longer do this great routine I was just doing. It is lost. It is a waste of time. I was happy to see she is still competing and I think we should all keep her in our prayers because of the work she put forth and the obstacles she overcame to become this champion. I believe she will get her groove back after the pressures of the Olympics are over, but it is a shame she can't do them right now. As far as I'm concerned it does not matter. I know what she is capable of.

Let us reflect on this: Even when you put forth great effort and it appears you are having no impact, keep going, keep working and God will help you. You are still here, you got up this morning you have another chance, just like Elijah, just like Simone. God is not done with you, He has great things lined up for you. You just have keep going, keep walking by faith. Why else are you here today?

- Make turkey or beef bologna and cheese sandwiches to be included in our dinner guest's take-away bags.

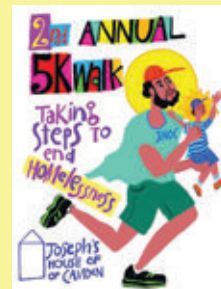

RCIA

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th. Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

All families attending in person must commit to attending two intergenerational events between October-May.

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water. After he ate and drank, he lay down again, but the angel of the LORD came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.

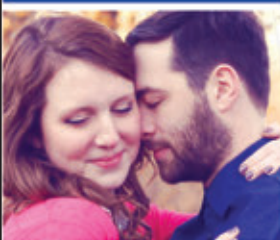
