Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: August 29, 2021

Casuistry. Now there's a word none of us are likely to use this late August Sunday, unless you're a theologian or a lawyer, or trying to solve a tough crossword puzzle. You just heard it in action in today's Gospel passage from Mark. What is it? "Someone, usually a theologian, who resolves problems of conscience or duty, etc., often with a clever but false reasoning." A thoroughly modern version is the so-called "pro-choice" stance regarding abortion. Here a clever use of the word "choice." (What red-blooded American could be against choice?) But here the phrase is a substitute for "pro the murder of infants in the womb." That is casuistry, pure and simple. It's also very disingenuous and involves mockery of the opposite opinion.

In the instance reported in today's gospel, the Holy Spirit, as the primary Author of Scripture, wants us to hear and reflect on as believers. With His penetrating mind, Jesus notes the Pharisees being so careful here about ritual purity. Note that His reaction is far from the "good and gentle Jesus" of typical holy card description. He would hardly have been smiling when He said, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites!" Afterward He quoted their greatest prophets on the subject of lip service.

Then Our Lord turns to the crowd present, and forthrightly taught some undeniable logic: "Nothing that enters one from outside can defile a person; but rather the things that come from within are what defile." Just think about your last impure thought, perhaps followed by an action that defiled your soul. Consider maybe your impulsive thought to slam on your brakes ahead of an annoying tailgater behind you. Or how about that time you spilled out a juicy tidbit of gossip about a somebody in between sips of your favorite spirits. Those items come from inside, right?

No less a figure than St. Paul understood himself on such matters and humbly admitted it in his Letter to the Romans, chapter 7. *"For I know that nothing good lodges in me—in my spiritual nature I mean — for though the will to do good is there, the deed is not. The good which I want to do, I fail to do; but what I do is the wrong which is against my will; and if what I do is against my will, clearly it is no longer I who am the agent. But sin that has its lodging in me...Miserable creature that I am, who is there to rescue me out of this body doomed to death? God alone, through Jesus Christ our Lord! Thanks be to God!"*

Thanks be to you also, great St. Paul! For You help us cope with what goes on inside us most days. Let me never be disingenuous with Jesus, for while He knows me better than I know myself, He is always ready to forgive.

On this matter of casuistry and deception; The story has been told of a woman who had acquired wealth and social prominence and decided to have a book written about her genealogy. The well-known author she engaged for the assignment discovered that one of her grandfathers was a murderer who had been electrocuted in Sing Sing. When he said this would have to be included in the book, the woman pleaded that he find a way of saying it that would hide the truth.

When the book appeared, the incident read as follows: "One of her grandfathers occupied the chair of applied electricity in one of America's best-known institutions. He was very much attached to his position and literally died in the harness."

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. Faith Formation Registration

Registration is now underway. Families can register for the following models:

For Grades K through 7

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th. Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep)

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Children’s Liturgy of the Word Volunteers Needed

Volunteers for the Children’s Liturgy of the Word help children to understand the scripture readings at the 11AM mass on Sunday. During the Liturgy of the Word, children (grades PK4-5th) move to another location to hear the gospel proclaimed in a simpler form. They participate in a conversation about the meaning of the readings and then return to their families for the remainder of the Mass.

The Directory on Masses with Children notes:

“Even in daily life children do not always understand all their experiences with adults but rather may find them boring. It cannot therefore be expected of the liturgy that everything must always be intelligible to them. Nonetheless, we may fear spiritual harm if over the years children repeatedly experience in the Church things that are barely comprehensible... If the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the liturgy of the word, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant, room.”

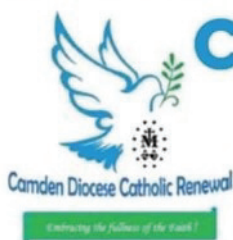
Season of Creation 2021 Week I Focus – FOOD Confronting Food Waste and Solving the Problem at Home

The average family of four wastes about \$1,600 worth of food each year. The challenge isn't to produce more food, but to waste less in the process. Here's how we can start:

1. Don't misinterpret expiration labels on food that's perfectly good to eat. The Grocery Manufacturers Association, the Food Marketing Institute, and Harvard University have combined efforts to streamline expiration labels about the quality and safety of food.
2. Learn how to compost to keep food scraps out of land-fills and greenhouse gases from rising.
3. Freeze food that can't be eaten immediately.
4. Donate food to food pantries or casseroles to people who need it.
5. Plan meals, make deliberate grocery store lists, save food and money.
6. Embrace imperfect produce. Fruits and veggies with flaws still taste the same and may be a fraction of the cost. (Adapted from *Natural Resources Defense Council*)

And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. —So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” He responded, “Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: *This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.* You disregard God’s commandment but cling to human tradition.” He summoned the crowd again and said to them, “Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.

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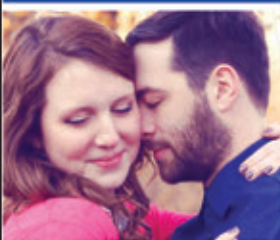
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
