33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: November 14, 2021

The Gospel this week is about the events that will happen at the end of our time and that nobody knows when this will happen except God the Father. The message of course is that we should always stay alert; we have no idea when this will occur.

The first reading from Daniel is also about a vision Daniel had of the last days. You may be wondering about the life of Daniel. You heard of the story of the lion's den, I am sure, but most people don't know Daniel's remarkable life. Why the story of Daniel is so important to me is because he is exactly the type of person I want to be. This week's reflection is not centered on the end of this age but on Daniel. He should be a model for all of us, especially in the world we live in today. One of the first things Daniel did was interpret a dream of a Babylonian king of his empire falling in the far future, and the moral is that no empire lasts forever except for the kingdom of Heaven. Daniel was about 15 years old when the kingdom of Israel was destroyed and he was taken prisoner by the Babylonians. He was smart and the Babylonians educated him on their culture but Daniel stayed close to his Jewish roots and the God who always protected him. Daniel was gifted in interpreting dreams, kind of like Joseph. He found himself in good standing with the Babylonian king and even his successors. The famous dream he interpreted was this; the Babylonian king saw a very large statute made with a gold head, silver chest, bronze belly, iron legs and feet made of clay and iron. A stone fell from the mountain next to it right into the statue and collapsed because of the clay in the feet. Daniel tells him he is a good king and the gold head represents him, but his successor will be inferior representing the silver, then the bronze down to the iron, finally settling on a divided empire of iron and clay. Any empire divided cannot and will not stand. The stone represented the Kingdom of Heaven which will come, will never be divided, and will never fail. Think of the timing of this, this was about 300 years before the birth of Jesus.

Daniel lived in Babylon from there on in peace and was devoted to God praying three times a day facing Jerusalem. During the rule of what appears to be the king's successor, the king has a party with his friends and they used the gold and silver they had taken from the Holy Temple in Jerusalem years before. During this party they saw a hand write a message on the wall and no one could interpret what it meant. So, they call on Daniel who is now much older and he explains the meaning. He tells the king that he has dishonored the God of Israel by what he has done and that he will die. The king died that very night.

A few months later there was another king, King Darius who appointed three men, including Daniel, to rule Babylon. The king soon realized Daniel was better than the other two combined so he decided to make Daniel the ruler alone. Needless to say, this did not sit well with the other two rulers, so they decided to trick the king into thinking Daniel did not respect him. The other two rulers knew that Daniel was very religious and prayed three times a day, so they tried to use this against him. Before Daniel was appointed to be the only ruler, these two men went to the king requesting a month where no one could worship anyone except king Darius. After a few days into this month they report to the king telling him that Daniel was still worshipping the God of Israel. The king is angry and sent Daniel to the lion's den. Daniel willingly went and we all know the story of what happens there; Daniel is protected by an angel of the Lord. The next day the king goes to see what happened and finds Daniel very much alive. Daniel tells the king he meant no offense. His God is his God and that was not a subject for debate. The king realizes that this was a trick and sentences these two men to the lion's den, and they did not do as well as Daniel. Daniel continues to live in Babylon and is loyal to his God. During this time Daniel has other visions like the one in the first reading.

This is what I like about Daniel; he was wise, strong and brave. This is the lesson I get from Daniel, and it is as important then as it is now. The God Daniel believed in is the same God I believe in. That God is the same Lord Jesus Christ. I think Daniel would have liked Jesus very much if he was alive when Jesus lived, but unfortunately Daniel lived about 300 hundred years before Jesus.

In today's first reading Daniel is much older in his life than he was in the story of the Lion's den but he has a vision of the final days of this age. What I find remarkable is that Daniel sees Michael the archangel and it should be noted Daniel also spoke to the angel Gabriel. Gabriel is seen three times in the Bible: the first with Daniel, then Zachariah and, of course, Mary. An angel protected Daniel in the pit and an angel also protected three of Daniel's friends in the story of the fiery furnace. The emphasis on angel, I thought, was fascinating. While I was reflecting on this, I was at Cooper Hospital. I prayed with a patient who was very sick and she wanted to share with me her favorite prayer. This was the prayer we all learned as children, the Guardian Angel Prayer. The role of Angels is often overlooked, but I think in the end we will find they are always with us and your guardian angel is very real!

Maybe, in my own opinion, the kingdom of Babylon lasted as long as it did because of Daniel. The prayers of Daniel might have had everything to do with Babylon surviving as long as it did. Maybe our prayers for this country and this world have everything to do with its survival. But remember what Daniel told the king. No kingdom lasts forever except the Kingdom of Heaven. Remember what Jesus did. He was the King of Kings and what did He do? He died for us so that we can be with Him in the Kingdom of Heaven.

So never forget, we are citizens of the United States, but before that we can also be citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven if we choose to be. I am a citizen of the Kingdom of Heaven only because I, in my freewill, choose to be with Jesus. I am not perfect, God knows that and always forgives me of my sins. For that I am very grateful.

He forgives you also!!! I am praying for you, that in your freewill you pray you choose Jesus. Let us please pray for each other. May we live together forever in that Kingdom with Jesus, with Daniel, with all the saints and with all the angels that lead us through our daily lives. God bless!!!

Laudato Si Action Platform

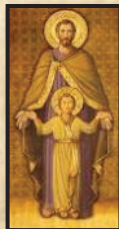

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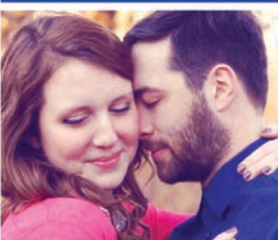


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
