Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 21, 2021

Brothers and Sisters, Dear Friends,

We have reached the end of our liturgical year. This Sunday, we celebrate the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time, concluding our cycle year B. It turns out that it is a feast day with a very specific title: it is the solemnity of "Christ, the King of the Universe." Today, we are invited to contemplate our King, the one who came to save us and give us eternal life. To celebrate Christ, the King of the Universe is a way to place ourselves before Him, before His greatness, before His majesty.

The creation of this feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to help Catholic Christians focus on the "Royalty of the Kingship of Jesus." At this time the world had been battered by wars and in particular, the war of 1418 which caused so much damage and deeply wounded Europe and even areas far beyond Europe.

Are you the King of the Jews? "This is Pilate's question. Jesus answers him with another question, "Are you saying this on your own or because others have told you about me?" It is also each of us that Jesus questions. The answer learned in catechism or in many books is not enough to answer this question. As the Catholic Community of Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish, this question of Jesus appeals to our faith. We need to continue to express that Jesus is our King, and besides him there is no one else that can take his place in our lives. Therefore, we must put Him at the center of our life by what we say and do.

"My kingship does not come from this world," Christ tells us again. The kingship of Jesus does not have anything to do with political power. Jesus is not going to oppose Emperor Caesar. He has no guards who will fight for him. The few disciples he had will flee. The true kingship of Christ is that of the servant who kneels to wash the feet of his disciples. He is the Good Shepherd who gives his life for his sheep. He came to seek and save those who were lost. He continues to seek after us to fill us with his tenderness and his love.

As in Pilate's time, there are many who refuse the Kingship of Christ. In our secularized world, his love and his care for humanity is relegated and sometimes ridiculed in all ways. But the prophet Daniel and the book of Revelation are here to call us to hope. Evil and violence will not have the last word. Once again, it is Love that will triumph. The Risen Christ is no longer visible to our eyes, but He is with us until the end of the world. He is counting on us to tirelessly testify to the love that He continues to shower on the world. It is with Him that we will be able to build a fairer and more fraternal world, a world in accordance with the spirit of the Beatitudes.

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we turn to you, Lord. Allow us to listen to Your voice and to live Your Truth and to express it to our brothers and sisters. I wish you all a blessed Feast of Christ the King. May He, our King continue to bless the world with his love and his protection. Ave Christus Rex! Viva Christo Rey! Hail Christ the King!

I wish you all a very happy and blessed Thanksgiving. May the time spent with family and friends bring you much joy and happiness and be the source of good memories for the future.

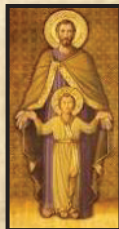

FIRST READING: Daniel 7: 13-14

His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed.

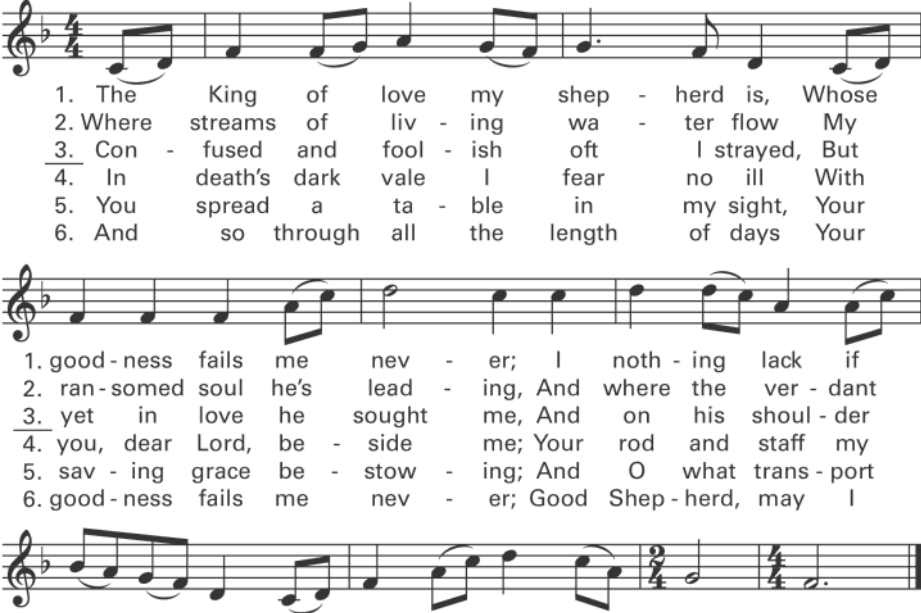
And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

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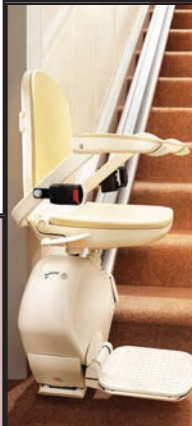
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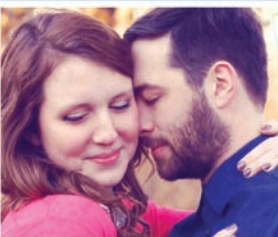
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
