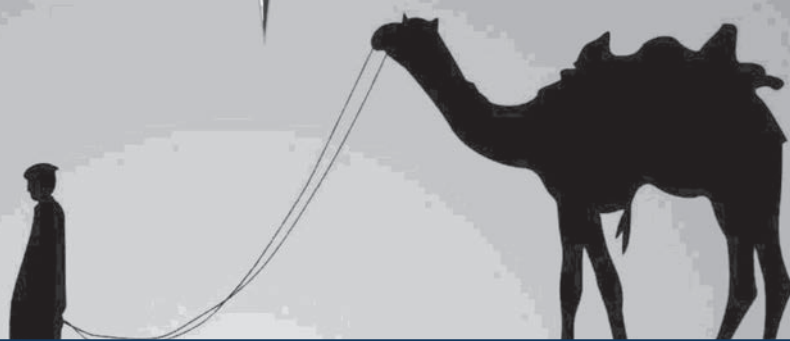

Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

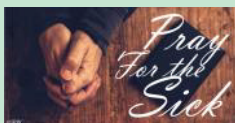

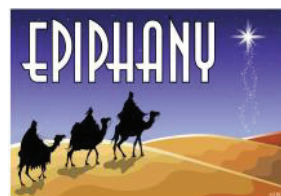

Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord: January 2, 2022

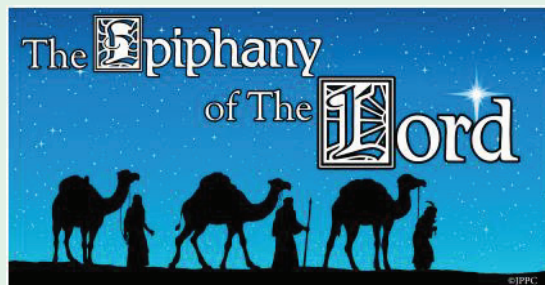
During Advent, we were treated to beautiful readings from the Hebrew scriptures describing a Messiah who would save his people Israel. But at Christmas, the feast of the Nativity of the Lord, we see that the Messiah came in a completely unexpected way—as a fragile baby in conditions of poverty and need. Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, and again, we see something completely unexpected. This Messiah comes not just for Israel, but for all people. The people the Messiah was promised to, embodied in Herod “and all Jerusalem with him,” are more troubled than excited about this great event. But the visitors, the Magi who have various religious affiliations, travel and take great risks to find him. Once found, they recognize and reverence him.

We all feel familiar with the iconic images of the Epiphany: the magi, the camels, the gifts, and of course, the star. They are exciting and comforting. They are part of our manger scenes. They put flesh on our faith journey, “for wise ones still seek him.” Our challenge is not to leave these colorful images at the doorstep of January. We need to take their meaning with us into the new year.

There are many ways of looking at the Epiphany. But I propose that we think about the significance of God acting so unexpectantly. If God can’t be pinned down or neatly defined, if God expands the horizons of our hopes and dreams as God did at the Epiphany, then maybe we can enter this new year with a confident attitude, ready to see possibilities instead of impediments, opportunities instead of obstacles. Maybe we can start believing a little bit more that God “is able to do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine” (Eph 3:20). Maybe we can bring our gifts to Jesus, as did the Magi, and let Jesus bless and multiply and use them in ways we could never have envisioned.

The new year is always a time for resolutions. We only need one. Let’s resolve to seek, follow, and trust God’s dreams for us. That is the surest way to the happiest of New Year’s.

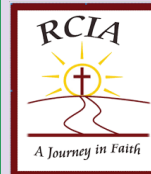

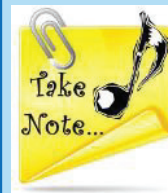


RCIA

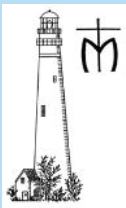

GLORIA: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. FIRST READING: Isaiah 60: 1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses.

Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the LORD.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 2: 2-3a, 5-6

Brothers and sisters: You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia*



GOSPEL: Matthew 2: 1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*"

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.
