Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Each year, the main ecumenical highlight remains the "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity." Since 1908, January 18 to 25 has been a time for Christians of all faiths to pray for Unity among all Christians. This year the theme is: "We saw his star in the East and we come to do homage to him" (Matthew 2:2). Christians in the Middle East are happy to propose this theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, aware that the world shares much of their suffering and hardship and longs to find the light that will show them the way to the Savior.

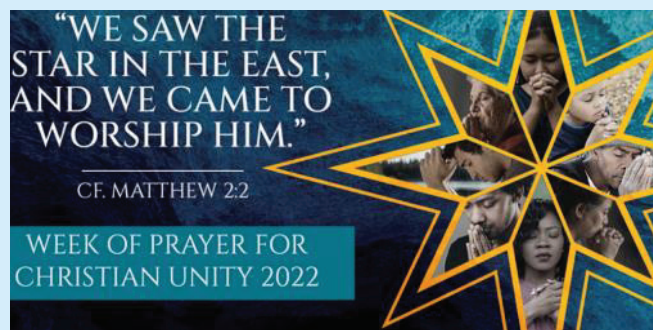
The global COVID-19 pandemic, the economic crisis it has generated, and the failure of political, economic, and social structures to protect the weakest and most vulnerable, has made it clear that we all need a light that shines in darkness. Jesus, the Star that was seen in the East two thousand years ago, still invites us to go to the manger where Christ was born. It leads us to the place where the Spirit of God lives and works, to the reality of our baptism and to the conversion of heart.

The second reading from the Letter of Saint Paul for the liturgy this week ignites in us the Spirit of Unity that brings us together as Christians. Genesis 1:26 tells us that we are all created in the image and likeness of God; therefore, we are the image of God in the world. We are brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ, filled with his love and grace. Even though we are different in the way that we worship the Lord, he bestows upon us different gifts that create unity in his body, the Church. "The gifts of grace are varied, but it is the same Spirit. The services are varied, but it is the same Lord. The activities are varied, but it is the same God who acts in all and through all" (Cor. 12:4-11).

This is the wonder of our diversity: it makes us capable, each in his own way, of manifesting the Love of God. One of the lessons of this text from Saint Paul is certainly to learn to rejoice in our differences. They are the many facets of what Love is and makes us capable of doing His ministry according to the originality of each one. Let us therefore rejoice in the variety of races, colors, languages, gifts, arts, and inventions. This is what makes the richness of the Church and of the world, on the condition that we live them.

It is like an orchestra: The same inspiration but with different and complementary expressions. Different instruments that create a symphony. A symphony on the condition that we all play in the same key. It's when we are not playing all in the same tone that there is a cacophony! The symphony in question here is the song of love that the Church is responsible for singing to the world; let's say "The Hymn to Love" as we say "The Hymn to Joy" of Beethoven. Our ministry in the Church is not a matter of roles, or functions, so that the Church lives with an organization chart well in place. It is much more serious and more beautiful than that. It is a question of the mission entrusted to the whole Church to reveal the Love of God. During our prayer time this week, let us all say a decade of rosary for unity among all Christians in the World.

The Discussion Meeting will take place as scheduled: 3rd Tuesday, January 18 at 7PM in the Faith Formation Center.

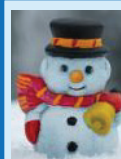

GLORIA:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 62: 1-5

For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch. Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the LORD. You no more shall people call you "Forsaken," or your land "Desolate," but you shall be called "My Delight," and your land "Espoused." For the LORD delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations.*

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Brothers and sisters: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia*

GOSPEL: John 2: 1-11 There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

CREED:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

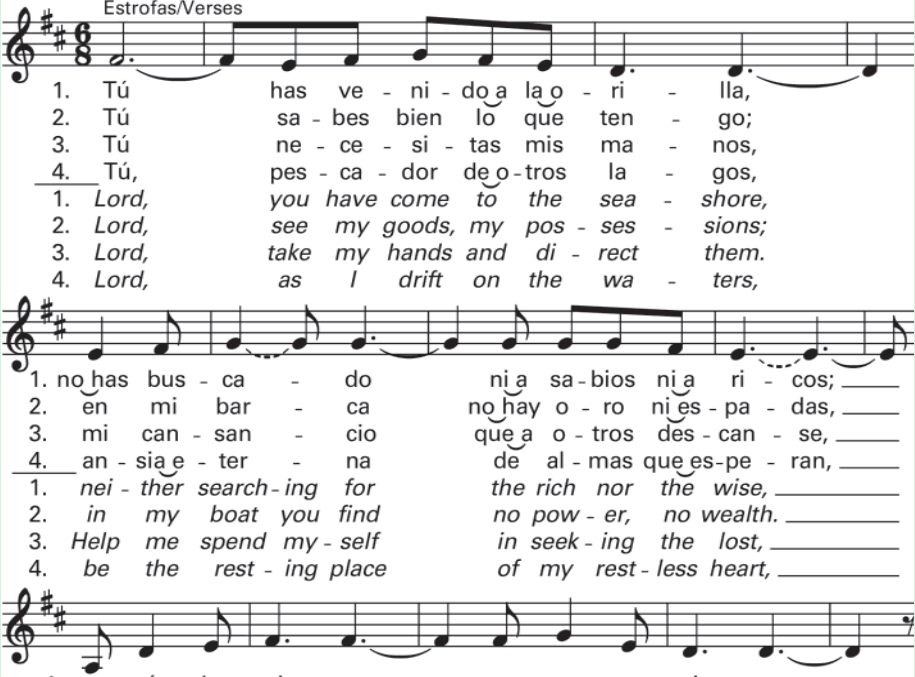
And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. 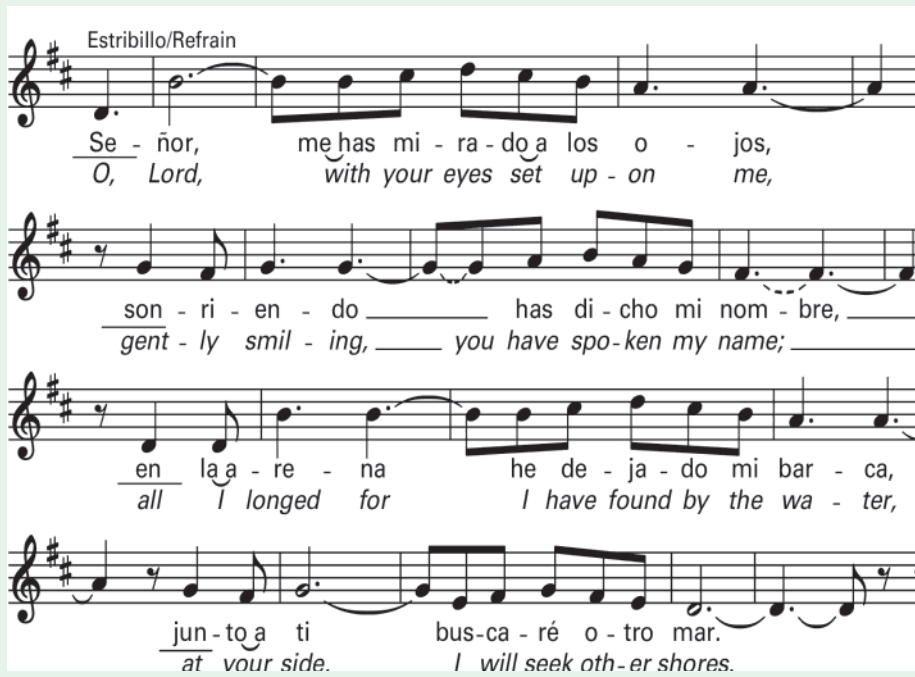

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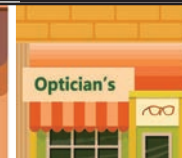
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
