Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time: February 13, 2022

We have all heard the Beatitudes most of our lives and we all know they are important, but what do they really mean? Just pondering what it means to be poor in spirit is a seminary thesis. Does it mean someone who is poor but has great faith? Does it mean a person who has worldly riches but does not have the Spirit? It seems so vague.

When I look at this Beatitude in the context of my faith, starting with the Bible and looking at the history of the saints, especially Saint Francis, here is what I see. Saint Francis gave everything away and chose a life of dependence on others. He trusted in God every moment of His life. Poor by choice, how many people do you know do this?

Worldly matters he did not care about: his bank account, his home, his health - none of that mattered. All that mattered was trust in God. He was fascinated on his entire journey; whatever he had he gave away and God always gave him more. I think of Groundhog Day. Each day the same thing; give everything away. I would be in a panic if I did this just once. I need the security of knowing I can take care of myself.

Not Francis. It worked the first day, so he did it a second, a third and a fourth. The same thing happened every day. God always provided for him. I cannot do this. I have a family to consider and so do you. Francis did one thing that is very important. He needed God in everything he did.

Francis was poor in spirit. What does it mean to be poor? He was never self-sufficient: he was poor and like the poor, he begged, and God helped him every day. His Spirit was poor in the fact that he was always dependent on God. He was like a child whose mother always provided. God did this for him. He was always begging to understand more about God and God always answered his prayer. Like a good book, God revealed Himself more and more in each chapter of his life.

If I look at the Bible I see something else that is very interesting. Consider the Old Testament and Moses. God's covenant was very simple. Obey my rules and good things will happen. Follow my commandments and you will be successful in all that you do. Follow the commandments and you will not be hungry, you will not be poor, you will not mourn. If you do not follow my commandments you will be cursed. Bad things will happen to you.

Now look at the Beatitudes. The blessings and the curses are somehow reversed. If you are poor, if you mourn, if you are hungry, you will be blessed. If you are poor, mourning, or hungry, in the end, when you get to heaven you will be happy or blessed. Note that the Gospel of Luke was written in Greek. The word used was 'makarios' which means just that "happy". If you consider the good things you get in the Old Testament, those blessings could very easily lead to trouble. Think about it. If you are rich, you will have more than enough food, and you will be happy. None of these Old Testament blessings are bad. There is nothing wrong with being rich, but think of what they can lead to: a sense of independence; you no longer need God; you have money. As they say, money is the root of all evil.

If we consider all the Beatitudes together, do we fall into certain categories, kind of like the zodiac? I am a Taurus. That is the reading I will look at. The other signs do not relate to me. Does each Beatitude relate to a different type of person? We are one body made up of many different parts. I do mathematics for a living; that is what I do. You may be a lawyer; that is what you do. She is a doctor; that is what she does.

I don't think that is how we should look at the Beatitudes because if we consider Jesus, He is the perfect example of all the Beatitudes together, especially the last one: "Blessed are you when you are persecuted for the sake of the Gospel". Jesus died for righteousness.

Our faith is centered around the cross of Jesus. When we look at the crucified Jesus, we see a man that appears to be cursed. He is poor; He is suffering; He has lost everything. When Jesus preached the Beatitudes in the beginning of His ministry, he was already preaching the way of the cross.

Reflect on the most important thing: Jesus!!! The most important thing I see is that if we consider all the Beatitudes together, they describe the entire life of Jesus. Jesus fits into each one of these categories perfectly. He was all the Beatitudes all the time!

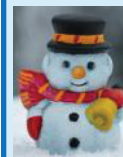

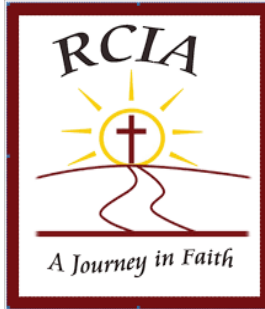

Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep.

CREED:

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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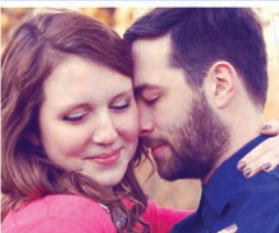
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
