Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: February 20, 2022

As last Sunday with the Beatitudes, the gospel for this Sunday is the Sermon on the Mount of Mt 5-7. If the preaching of Jesus in the gospel of Matthew is intended for a crowd, in Luke's gospel, Jesus addresses the disciples and is teaching them how to be spiritually and physically healthy. Knowing how to live the beatitudes and recognizing the misfortunes of life, Jesus invites the disciples to love their enemies and to express generosity towards their neighbor, so their mission can be effective.

"Be merciful as your heavenly Father is merciful." This is one of the rules of our Christian life: to be merciful as God is merciful. If we reread the whole Bible, it appears to be there are many stories of the conversion of those who gradually learn to accept the goodness of God and slowly learn to practice it in their spiritual life. Through this gospel message Jesus calls each one of us to be patient with ourselves and with one another.

Saint Peter says, "A single day is like a thousand years and a thousand years are like a single day" (2 Peter: 3.8). God educates us slowly to be patient as Deuteronomy 6:7 says, "Take to heart these words which I command you today. Keep repeating them to your children. Recite them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you get up."

The gospel this weekend continues to challenge us not only in our actions but in our reactions, not only in our spiritual lives but in our physical behavior.

"Even sinners do the same." What a great way to tell us that we need to act differently beyond our human emotions. Our actions should be different. As Christians we are called to always be on guard to accept our brothers and sisters even in the lowest aspect of their lives. Therefore, do not let others' behaviors cross your way to make you lose your blessings from God. Yes, it is a battle that we have to win every day. There is no way that we can win this battle without being on our knees every day to beg for God's grace and blessings.

Today's Gospel message is incredibly powerful for spiritual conversion. It is truly God with us, in action. Our Heavenly Father is overabundant with love. We must imitate him. The person that we are today has something to do with all the challenges that we have faced in the world either to forgive or to receive forgiveness. The person we are called to forgive is not the one whom we do not know but is the one whom we have acquaintance with and see every day. Through that person, we are brought to another level in our spiritual life. The situation that we are called to overcome should be part of our spiritual progression and growth.

"Turn the other cheek" means "show another face." In the face of evil, we need to show another aspect of ourselves. We need God's grace so much to have a love that is inclusive and not let ourselves be stopped by evil forces. Therefore, we need to have the love of Jesus Christ. To paraphrase Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor: 2:5) It is not human wisdom that we need but "it is the Spirit of God who dwells in us because we are his temple." In our daily lives this week, perhaps we could take measure of how attentive we are to loving the one who challenges our capacity to love, or who perhaps has hurt us or hurt our ego.

Let's try to have a different attitude. There was an episode about Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus who lived with a difficult sister in her community. Saint Thérèse showed nothing but kindness and affability to her even though she was so hard to live with. One day this sister asked her, "Why do you love me so much? Is this what being holy is?" The saint shows us the possible path to respond to hate and indifference. Let us ask for this type of attitude through the intercession of all the saints and for the grace to be able to live this call of the Gospel.

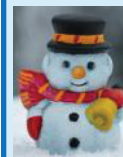

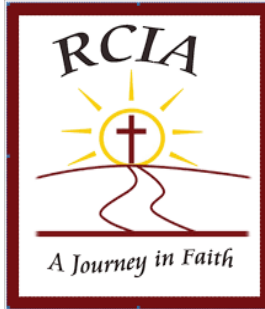

FIRST READING: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9,12-13,22-23

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. So David and Abishai went among Saul's soldiers by night and found Saul lying asleep within the barricade, with his spear thrust into the ground at his head and Abner and his men sleeping around him.

Abishai whispered to David: "God has delivered your enemy into your grasp this day. Let me nail him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I will not need a second thrust!" But David said to Abishai, "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the LORD's anointed and remain unpunished?" So David took the spear and the water jug from their place at Saul's head, and they got away without anyone's seeing or knowing or awakening. All remained asleep, because the LORD had put them into a deep slumber.

Going across to an opposite slope, David stood on a remote hilltop at a great distance from Abner, son of Ner, and the troops. He said: "Here is the king's spear. Let an attendant come over to get it. The LORD will reward each man for his justice and faithfulness. Today, though the LORD delivered you into my grasp, I would not harm the LORD's anointed."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *The Lord is kind and merciful.*

1 Corinthians 15: 45-49

Brothers and sisters: It is written, *The first man, Adam, became a living being*, the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia*

GOSPEL: Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: "To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount. But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.
