Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time: February 27, 2022

Today's Gospel passage (Lk. 6:39-45) begins with a pressing series of questions: "Can a blind man guide another blind man? Won't they both fall into a hole? Why are you looking at the speck in your brother's eye, when you don't notice the beam in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me remove the speck that is in your eye", when you yourself do not see the beam that is in yours? (Lk.6:39,41-42).

To understand what Jesus means, we need to remember the context of his words. We are in chapter 6 of Luke's Gospel. This chapter begins with the Beatitudes and continues with the passage that we heard last Sunday, where Jesus revealed the measure of love to which those who want to follow him are called. It was a paradoxical measure, a measure without measure (Lk. 6,27-38). To truly love God is to make an effort to love and accept our brothers and sisters. Loving our brothers and sisters means to manifest the willingness to do so. Above all, this is something that we need to cultivate in our spiritual life. This gospel seems to teach us a compendium of rules for our spiritual life. It teaches us that we have no right to criticize unless we, ourselves, are free of faults. That reminds us of the gospel of the adulterous woman in John 8:7, "Let the one who has no sins cast the first stone".

The word of this gospel is a real lesson to be applied in our lives as we start the Lenten Season. This message is an inspiration that can lead us to have more wisdom in life. What is asked of us is respect, charity, and compassion. We all have a little blindness which sometimes prevents us from criticizing our brothers or sisters. Even though all of us carry a little dark spot that we call sin, the gospel does not prevent us from being fraternal or family. Instead, it guides us to criticize with a brotherly love which can lead us to a theological vision in our relationships. "The disciple is not above the master; but once well trained, each will be like his master". The training is the process of being healed from our blindness. We are like the Emmaus men who were blind and could not see Jesus, and only began to see clearly when "He opened their minds to the understanding of the Scriptures" (Lk. 24:45).

This is what Lent is about. It is a time to get into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ our Savior. This is a time to abstain from certain inappropriate behaviors such as judging others without knowing the whole truth or gossiping and criticizing others without knowing their situation and their troubles. This is a great transition from our short period of Ordinary Time to the beginning of Lent.

As we approach this season of Lent, let us ask the Lord to give us the grace and the blessing to follow his footsteps. Lent is a time for reconciliation with the Lord and with our brothers and sisters. Love your enemies, be merciful, do not judge, do not condemn... our Father is merciful" and we are called to be his image in the world. To bear witness to a God of love is to immerse ourselves in his Word.

Blessed Lenten Season to you all.

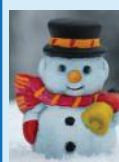

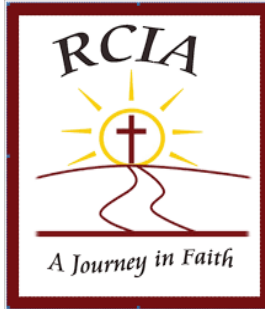

GOSPEL: Luke 6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye.

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."
