Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Third Sunday of Lent: March 20, 2022

The gospel this weekend introduces us to the story of the Galileans who were murdered by Pilate. This was a great catastrophe from the past that continues to appear in our modern world. Whether it is terrorist attacks, air raids or war, road accidents or epidemics, it is still the anguish and mourning that come into our lives causing us to suffer. The reflection of Jesus in the gospel challenges us to know that we are alive for a purpose. This is not because we are better than those who are suffering or those who have died by tragedies. No one will ever think or imagine that those who died in an accident, or following an attack, or in a natural disaster are greater sinners than the rest of the world.

Jesus is telling us two things in this gospel: First, that accidents, trials, and disasters do not happen because we are sinners. These unfortunate events are not a punishment from God. God does not kill. He is not a vengeful God. Second, these tragedies that happen to us should make us reflect on our relationship and personal life with God, with others, and with ourselves. The trials that we endure in our daily lives should remind us of our fundamental fragility as human beings.

The Gospel ends with strict remarks that disconcert us. They reach us in our daily situations where we disappoint the Lord by not producing the expected fruits in our lives or in our ministry, or when we do not produce fruits at all. This image of the fig tree is about the reality of our mission on earth. The Lord has been looking for fruits in our lives every day. "I have been looking for fruit on this fig tree for three years, and I cannot find any. Cut it!" What's the use of letting him exhaust the soil? For some, the Lord has been looking for fruits for more than three years, but He is still patient with us. The Lenten Season is a time for us to draw closer to the Lord by challenging ourselves to do the best we can to be fruitful.

There is good news here. There is still time for us to decide. A time of grace is given to us so that we can work for Him and produce the fruit that He wants us to produce. Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians tells us, "Bloom where you are planted" (1 Corinthians 7:20). The Lord, who gave Moses the mission to liberate his people, still and always turns to us with a gaze of mercy and compassion. He doesn't just wait for us. He is proactive and commits himself in the person of His Son for the salvation of His people. His promise becomes the gift of a precious resource where we find the energy and the necessary inspiration for our transformation.

God is constantly in our midst. He wraps us in his tenderness by taking us where we are. If we give him our best, He can transform our lives and He can use our path. However, distraught we may be, He can make our lives instruments of his love. It is obvious that everything we do brings fruits to his vineyard, and that contributes to our good and to the happiness that He wants for us. As Jesus encountered people who were in distress, today we encounter the misery of peoples at war. Whenever one is alone or in exile and we feel that humanity is lacking mutual love, we believe that God is there, and we know He will show his power to deliver His people.

During this Lenten Season let us continue to increase our prayer time and dwell in the grace and the blessing of God. Jesus offers us consolation if we are on a path of conversion. He sees our struggles. He wants to help us. He stretches out his hand to us during this Lenten Season as we are reflecting on His passion, and He is always patient with those who seek to walk in His light. Jesus works the soil of our heart so that it bears fruits. He wants us to look at Him **and trust Him**.

HOUSE OF CHARITY 2022

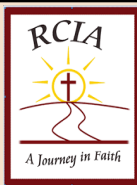

Choose The Chosen

"Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name, you are mine." Isaiah 43:1

As a child, Mary of Magdala kept this verse hidden in her doll, which she carried with her into adulthood, and it proved to be her salvation. She transformed from Mary the child to Lilith-one possessed by demons. *How did she become Mary again?*

In "The Chosen", Jesus calls all of His followers to Him, just as He calls each of us. *Will we be listening when He does?* Keep this question in mind as you watch **Episode 1 of "The Chosen"**. After viewing and reflecting on Episode 1, will you be able to claim, along with Mary of Magdala, **"I was one was and now I am completely different. And the thing that happened in between... was Him?"**

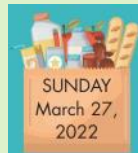

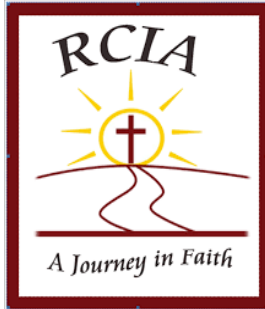

FIRST READING: Exodus 3: 1-8a, 13-15 Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush, "Moses! Moses!" He answered, "Here I am." God said, "Come no nearer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers," he continued, "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

But the LORD said, "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering. Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey." Moses said to God, "But when I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' if they ask me, 'What is his name?' what am I to tell them?" God replied, "I am who am." Then he added, "This is what you shall tell the Israelites: I AM sent me to you." God spoke further to Moses, "Thus shall you say to the Israelites: The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. "This is my name forever; thus am I to be remembered through all generations."

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 10: 1-6, 10-12 I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea, and all of them were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. All ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ. Yet God was not pleased with most of them, for they were struck down in the desert. These things happened as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil things, as they did. Do not grumble as some of them did, and suffered death by the destroyer. These things happened to them as an example, and they have been written down as a warning to us, upon whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore, whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory.*

GOSPEL: Luke 13: 1-9 Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them— do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it own.'"

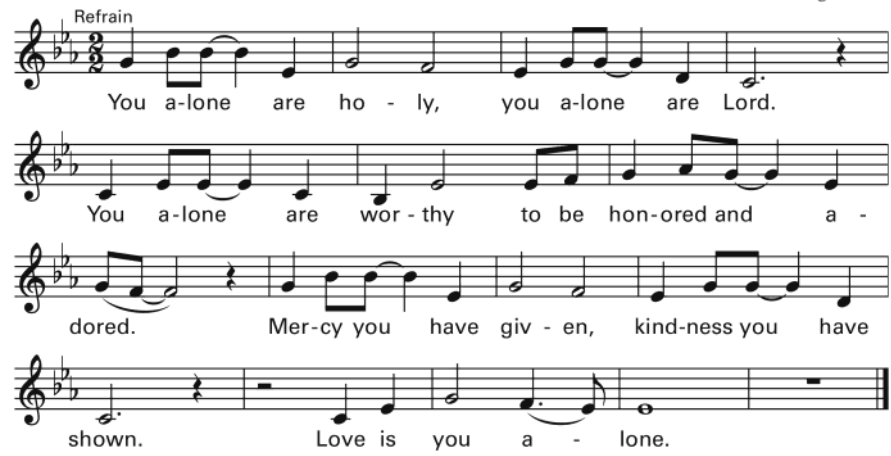

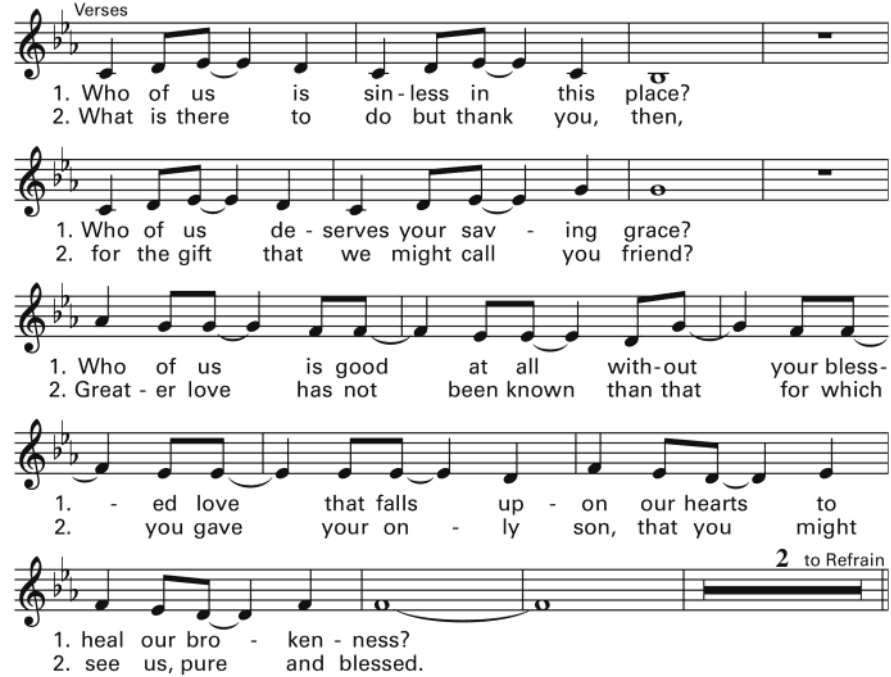

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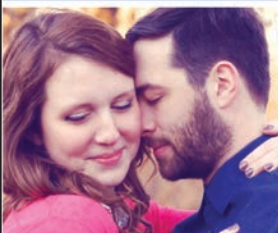
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
