Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Fourth Sunday of Lent: March 27, 2022

The gospel this week, commonly called the Parable of the Prodigal Son, practically expresses the love of God for us. Jesus shows us this aspect of the goodness of God as mentioned by the Pharisees in Luke 15:2. "This man welcomes sinners, and he eats with them!" For those who were looking for a certain perfection, it was a real scandal. Jesus teaches them that the joy of God our Father forgives and welcomes us all regardless of our past or present situation.

The Gospel for this weekend invites us to take a step further in discovering the true face of God. We know this parable of the prodigal son well because we have heard it often. It is the story of a young man who claims his share of his inheritance from his father and goes away from his family. Having spent everything on a life of debauchery, he ends up finding himself in misery. This Gospel speaks to us of God and of ourselves. He tells us that this is how God deals with us; He leaves us free. When creating us, He gave us the gift of freedom. It is up to us to make good use of it.

Even when we distance ourselves from Him, God always carries us in his heart, He awaits our safe return, even broken or shattered. God is the figure of this father in the gospel who is watching the road in the hope of seeing his child return. Despite the many mistakes of this son, his father is very happy to welcome him back, not only to his home, but in his life.

What a wonderful and courageous response from the father! This was a remarkable surprise for the Pharisees. Jesus invites them not to remain separated from sinners who convert, but to welcome, rejoice and feast with them. The attitude of the older son represents the Pharisees, and that helps us to understand their behavior toward sinners and the reason why they criticized Jesus.

First of all, the older son, in his dialogue with his father does not call the prodigal son "my brother" but "your son". He seems to deny the bond that connects them as family members. He wants nothing to do with the one who squandered the family property. What distinguishes him from the prodigal son is that he has been serving his father for so many years without ever having disobeyed. How can his father treat the younger brother who squandered his property better than the older one who worked for him faithfully? The goodness of the tenderness of God does not take anything away from anyone who has been righteous, because our communion is perfect. "All that is mine is yours," says the Lord. "I am your father and not your master, as I am your brother's father and not his judge."

We are all family because we are children of the same Father, the one who gives us true life in Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is important to open our hearts to welcome our brothers and sisters who were away from the Church with faith and love. Make sure that we are the reason for their return to the church.

Easter is the time when many people come to church. Sometimes we hear complaints from those older brothers and sisters because they do not get a seat at church because there are so many people. Brothers and Sisters, it is a time when we should be more welcoming and fraternal and even give up a seat to someone whom you have not seen in church for a long time. We must acknowledge a filial relationship with all those who do not have time to attend mass weekly or only come occasionally. We need to find ways to attract them to our Church family rather than be judgmental or think poorly of them.

In the Eucharistic banquet that brings us together, none of us deserves more than any others to participate. Yes, we are all brothers and sisters because we are all created in the image and likeness of God. The two brothers in the parable are not so different. The prodigal son is not better than the older son; he has not understood that a father's love for his children does not have any restrictions or limits. We all have a little of the prodigal son's behavior in our lives. We increase our prayer life when we are in dire need. Some of us give God more time when we are in a position where we need him to solve our problems or our situations. We all need to reconcile with God one way or another. Easter is the time to bring everyone back home.

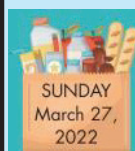

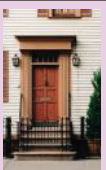

FIRST READING: Joshua 5:9a, 10-12 The LORD said to Joshua, “Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you.” While the Israelites were encamped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth of the month. On the day after the Passover, they ate of the produce of the land in the form of unleavened cakes and parched grain. On that same day after the Passover, on which they ate of the produce of the land, the manna ceased. No longer was there manna for the Israelites, who that year ate of the yield of the land of Canaan.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Taste and see the goodness of the Lord*

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 5: 17-21 Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory.*

GOSPEL: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32 Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, “This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.” So to them Jesus addressed this parable: “A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, ‘Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.’ So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, ‘How many of my father’s hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, “Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.”’”

So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.’ But his father ordered his servants, ‘Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.’ Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, ‘Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.’ He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, ‘Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.’ He said to him, ‘My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.’”

CREED:

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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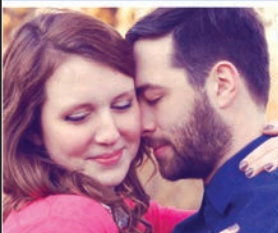
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
