Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Palm Sunday: April 10, 2022

In His immense love, Jesus opens his heart to us and embraces us with Love after having embraced humanity in the body of Mary. On his knees he washed the feet of his disciples. In his mystery, Jesus introduces us to the admirable Eucharistic exchange: "Jesus sat down at the table to eat the last supper with his friends." Yes, Judas is present, he who will give Jesus the kiss of betrayal. In the Gospel of this Palm Sunday, Jesus will say: "Judas, it is by a kiss that you deliver the Son of man!" Jesus, whose love is betrayed, will give him a kiss of mercy. "What you are doing, do it quickly," says Jesus, showing a powerful awareness of what is about to happen.

The red color of the liturgical vestments of the Palm Sunday celebration reminds us of the humiliation experienced by Christ Jesus by the soldiers. But it also reminds us that this humiliation is prophetic. At this moment of his Passion, He who will be crucified is dressed in the red mantle, a royal vestment which announces his throne and his Cross.

He is a King who reigns by becoming a servant, a King who renounces his privileges, as the first reading reminded us: "He did not see fit to claim his right to be treated as equal with God; but on the contrary, he stripped himself by taking the condition of servant..."

This King is not like other kings; he is a King who wants to allow others to exist, who wants to make them exist. He is a King whose omnipotence is a power of love that comes to break the power of Satan with hatred and violence in the world. Jesus as our King gives us hope as he comes to understand our trouble as a suffering Servant. For so many, Jesus' death was considered a defeat. For us who have an experience of his resurrection in our lives, we know it is a victory, the victory of love over sin.

Today we will go home with a blessed branch. This branch will remind us that we sang: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" It must also remind us that Jesus wants us to be near. Seized by the anguish of death, he wanted his family to remain with him under the olive trees of Gethsemane. It is the same call that he addresses to us today. So yes, let this branch carried into our homes be the sign of our commitment to the Lord. Let us show Jesus we are near to those who are suffering, neglected in every area of their lives, those who are unwanted, feel despair, and even fear.

Also, for a very long time, two Gospels have been read on this day. Pope Francis explains it thus: "This celebration has a bittersweet flavor; it is joyful and painful at the same time since we celebrate the entry of the Lord into Jerusalem, acclaimed as a king by his disciples and whom we proclaim, at the same time and solemnly, the story of his passion. Therefore, our heart feels this painful contrast and experiences to some extent what Jesus felt on that day when he rejoiced with his friends and wept over Jerusalem. Let us continue to be Christ-like in the world. Let us suffer with those who are suffering instead of increasing their pain.

So, the Palm Sunday scene repeats itself in some way in our own lives. Jesus approaches our soul on the back of the ordinary, in the sobriety of the sacraments or in the gentle insinuations of which Saint Josemaría speaks in his homily on this feast: "Do your duty conscientiously, smile at those who need it, even if your soul is wounded. Dedicate, without reservation. Come to the aid of those who seek you. Practice justice, surpassing it with the grace of charity.

At the end of his life on earth, the world continues to listen to his cry." Everything is accomplished" (Jn.19:30) is not a cry of anguish from a desperate man but a cry of joy, of duty accomplished, a prayerful cry of impregnable inner joy. The suffering of Jesus is proportionate to his joy at his thanksgiving: "Father, I give you thanks for this Hour". How difficult it is for us in our spiritual life to feel this tremor of joy, which emanates from this entry into Jerusalem which the crowd had nevertheless anticipated!

I wish you all a blessed Palm Sunday!

AT THE PROCESSION WITH PALMS: GOSPEL: Luke 19: 28-40

Jesus proceeded on his journey up to Jerusalem. As he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples. 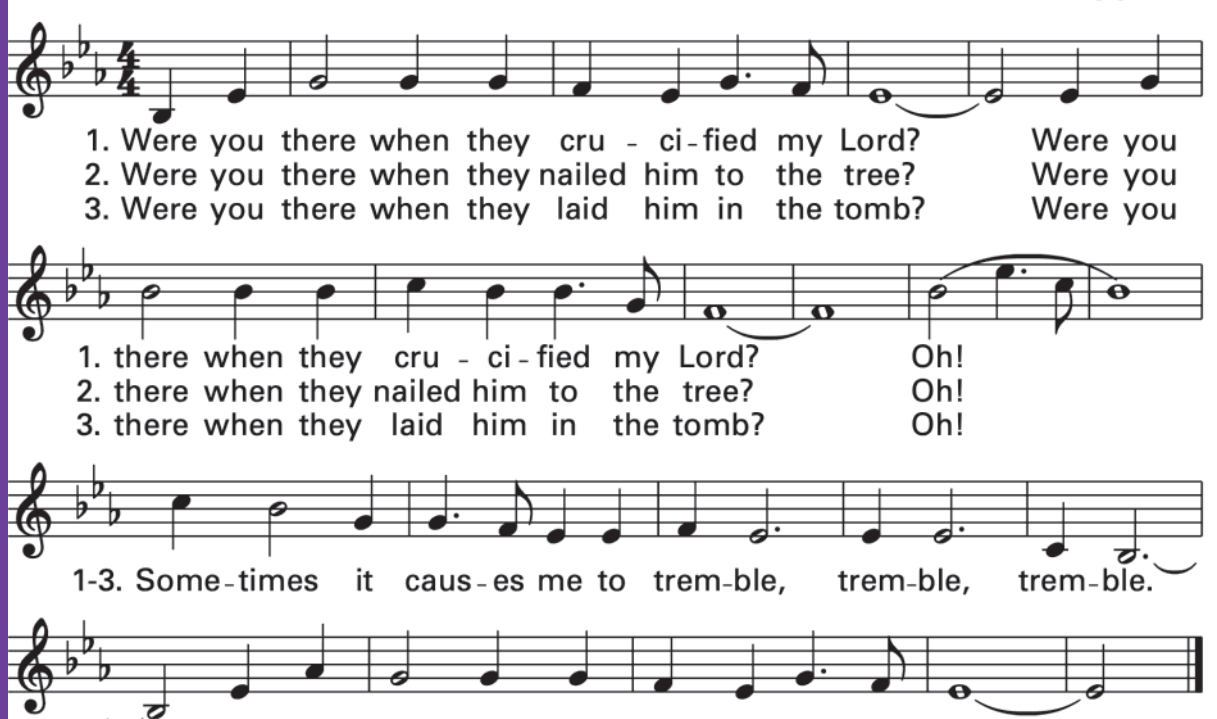

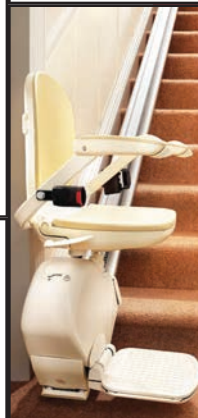

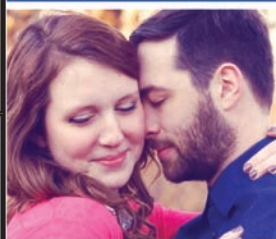
