Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Easter Sunday: April 17, 2022

On Good Friday, with the ignominious death of Jesus, unjustly condemned to the torture of the cross, we had the heartbreaking feeling of having lost everything. And yet, like Mary Magdalene, we came to the tomb early in the morning because something within us kept hoping against all hope. Jesus, who had been with us and educated us about the mercy and the love of God in doing good, he whom God had been consecrated by the Holy Spirit and filled with his strength: how could he be dead forever? So, like Mary Magdalene, while it was still dark in our hearts, we went to the tomb. The Evangelist Saint John does not tell us that Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb to lament. Nor does she go there to honor the body of Jesus with any funeral rite, because these rites have already been done at the burial. Without fully understanding, she goes to the tomb, driven by her hope, to keep alive in her heart all the blessings and life transformation that she has been experiencing with Jesus.

And what did she see in the tomb? The stone has been removed! Was the body of the Lord was stolen? She was upset, with fear of profanation, so she runs to bring the news to Peter and to the beloved disciples. “The linens are laid flat,” “the shroud which had surrounded the head of Jesus ... rolled up apart in its place.” And nothing more than that: fabrics used to wrap the body of a deceased are placed there, in an unusual way. And the dead body is missing. The evangelist tells us: “He saw, and he believed”. The evidence of this truth imposes itself on the heart of the beloved disciple: the dead body is absent from the tomb. Death has disappeared.

In his agony and in his death on the cross, he assumed all our sufferings, he took on all our pains, to deliver us, to save us, by drawing us into his risen life. Yes, he is risen, alive forever, and he never ceases to communicate his life to us, so that from today we may be, with him, in him, the Risen Christ.

Saint Paul told the Colossians and tells us on this Easter morning: “You are risen with Christ”. By the grace of baptism, the life of the risen Jesus, living communion with the Father in the Spirit has been given to us. This life is constantly nourished in us by the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist and reconciliation. But, like the disciples who went to the empty tomb, and on whose testimony we rely, this Good News calls our faith. We are resurrected with Christ. The good news is we continue to experience great signs of the Lord's resurrection in our own resurrection. The water that sprinkles us, the body and blood of Christ that nourishes us, gestures of friendship given and received, words of forgiveness exchanged among us are great signs of our resurrection experience.

Saint Paul had warned us: “You are risen with Christ, and your life remains hidden with him in God”. What you are, does not yet appear. What you are already in truth - risen with the risen Christ is not yet fully manifested. But we already are! Following the example of the beloved disciple, we must always grow in faith: faith in the resurrection of Jesus, faith in our own resurrection. It is this faith that we proclaim during the feast of the celebration of east by renewing the promises of our baptism.

Today we celebrate the biggest Christian holiday of the year, Easter. The risen Christ gives us the courage to return to our families, to our workplace, to live there the springtime of God. On this first day of the week, on this day of the Lord's resurrection

Happy Easter to all. “The Lord is risen, hallelujah, hallelujah”.

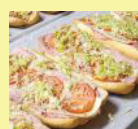


St. Teresa of Calcutta 29th Parish Golf Outing Friday, May 27 at 1PM Valleybrook Golf Club

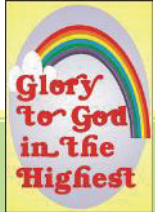

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: “You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.”

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *This is the day the Lord has made;
let us rejoice and be glad.*

SECOND READING: Colossians 3: 1-4

Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

SEQUENCE:
