Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Second Sunday of Easter: April 24, 2022

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. The last couple of weeks have been a roller coaster of events from the joy of Jesus entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, to the promise Jesus made to us at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, to the Passion of Jesus on Good Friday, to the risen Jesus on Easter Sunday. Today I feel we share the real joy of Easter, the risen Jesus appearing to the apostles, and their commissioning to the world; “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”

We are all familiar with this story, and how Thomas was missing when this happened and did not believe when the other apostles told him. We are also aware of the significance of this event, and why this Gospel is used for Divine Mercy Sunday. I believe that Jesus reappearing to the apostles when Thomas was present was a result of the Divine Mercy Jesus had for Thomas as well as for us.

The reason today, the Second Sunday of Easter, has been named Divine Mercy Sunday has to do with Pope John Paul the Second and the canonization of the Polish nun, Saint Faustina in the year 2000.

The connection with the Gospel today and Saint Faustina makes perfect sense. Thomas did not believe and Jesus appeared to him so that he would believe. With Saint Faustina, Jesus appeared to her many times so that we would come to believe. Through the mercy of Jesus we come to believe.

What I find so interesting about Saint Faustina is the timing of her message. Saint Faustina was born in 1905 in Poland and she died young at the age of 33 in 1938 right before the Nazi invasion of Poland in 1939. The invasion of Poland on September 1, 1939 marked the beginning of World War 2.

Her message was to pray for peace! In the world that we live today the message is the same; pray for peace. Remember what Jesus said today in the Gospel, “Blessed are those who have not seen but still believe.” The power of prayer is greater than I think any of us can imagine.

The message of the Gospel is perfectly clear. “As the Father has sent me so I send you.” This is not just for the apostles but for each one of us. Jesus sends each of us to do the will of the Father. Through the power of prayer we can do amazing things. Nothing is impossible for us through the help of Jesus.

The question is what does Jesus call us to do? It is different for each of us. I believe each day is a different story; each day is a gift for us to do the will of God. For me each day should start with a clear intent to do what is pleasing to God.

Do your job, do whatever you feel you are called to do each day but let God be the inspiration. Pray for God to help you through your day. He can and will be a constant help to accomplish what needs to be done. At the end of the day if we do this right, only with God’s help, perfection can be achieved. Every now and then this seems to happen, so it is possible.

We pray each morning so that all we do begins with God’s help and inspiration. We pray each night in thankfulness for the help God has been for us all day. If Jesus is helping you and is present with you each day, you cannot go wrong, just listen to Him.

FIRST READING: Acts 5: 12-16

Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. They were all together in Solomon's portico. None of the others dared to join them, but the people esteemed them. Yet more than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them. Thus they even carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on cots and mats so that when Peter came by, at least his shadow might fall on one or another of them. A large number of people from the towns in the vicinity of Jerusalem also gathered, bringing the sick and those disturbed by unclean spirits, and they were all cured.

**SECOND READING: Revelation 1: 9-11a, 12-13, 17-19**

I, John, your brother, who share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus, found myself on the island called Patmos because I proclaimed God's word and gave testimony to Jesus. I was caught up in spirit on the Lord's day and heard behind me a voice as loud as a trumpet, which said, "Write on a scroll what you see." Then I turned to see whose voice it was that spoke to me, and when I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, wearing an ankle-length robe, with a gold sash around his chest. When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever. I hold the keys to death and the netherworld. Write down, therefore, what you have seen, and what is happening, and what will happen afterwards."

GOSPEL: John 20: 19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
